STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity prepares a detailed annual report of which these financial statements form an integral part. Information on the activities, objectives, organisation and administration and control of the charity is included in that report.

GOVERNING DOCUMENT

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 15 June 2001, and is a registered charity. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

The trustees meet each calendar month with the exception of the traditional summer and winter holiday periods. At each meeting they receive reports from the Chairman, the Secretary, who provides details of correspondence received since the last meeting, and the treasurer, who presents accounts for discussion and approval by the trustees.

Expenses claimed by the trustees are approved at these regular meetings.

FINANCIAL CONTROLS

The treasurer is responsible for the control of the Charity's finances and prepares accounts on a monthly basis which are presented to the trustees at their regular meetings for discussion and approval.

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

APPOINTMENT OF TRUSTEE

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law. Under the requirements of the Memorandum and Articles of Association the maximum number of directors shall be 7 and all directors are required to retire at each annual general meeting. The directors so retiring are immediately eligible for re-election. It is the policy of the company for all directors to retire at each annual general meeting and to offer themselves for re-election.

The directors are assisted in meeting the charities objectives by volunteers who offer their time and experience in the various disabilities and social groups that the charity was set up to assist. Most of the volunteers have been involved with the charity either directly or indirectly for a number of years and are therefore already familiar with the practical works carried out.

TRUSTEE INDUCTION & TRAINING

New trustees are required to act as committee members for a period of at least six months to gain an understanding of the activities of the charity and the duties and responsibilities of trustees before they can be appointed as a trustee. They are also encouraged to attend relevant training courses on matters relevant to the charity's clients.

RELATED PARTIES

The charity has no direct related parties but has informal links with other charitable organisations with similar objectives both locally and nationally. Some of the trustees are also trustees of other local charitable organisations. The charity subscribes to the Association of Local Voluntary Organisations and has regular contact with other organisations with similar aims in surrounding areas.

The charity works closely with South Lanarkshire Council Social Work Department.

RISK MANAGEMENT

At their regular meetings, the trustees review the major risks to which the company is exposed and review systems to ensure that these risks are mitigated.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the charity are to:

Relieve the needs of people living in the general area of Clydesdale and South Lanarkshire who suffer from any form of mental or physical disability.

Advance education, particularly in relation to the needs of people who suffer from any form of mental or physical disability, illness or impairment.

Promote and establish centres providing facilities for information and educational training activities for disabled persons resident within the operating area.

The strategies employed to meet these objectives include the following

providing transport by volunteer drivers to enable clients to attend medical and other appointments and to meet with friends and other social gatherings

provision of wheelchairs on short and long term loan to residents of the Clydesdale area, there is no charge for this service

provision of advice on benefits and other forms of assistance and services available to clients and assistance with the completion of application forms

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

This is the fifteenth year since the Centre was first set up and has again been very busy with the range of services and assistance offered.

This year the Centre has helped over 720 clients obtain benefits and support to help improve their quality of life. The success and value our assistance brings to our clients' is confirmed by the number that return when their benefit claims are due for review or if their circumstances have changed. The Centre continues to be monitored by the Department of Work and Pensions.

The loan service of wheelchairs and other mobility aids continues to be a valued service and this year chairs were loaned on 67 occasions to local residents and also to those from further afield through adverts in local hospitals and health centres. We continue to receive donations of wheelchairs and we now have a total of 48 wheelchairs and 2 light weight chairs as well as walkers, zimmers and other aids and appliances available for loan.

The driver service continues to be in high demand.

As far as we can ascertain, the Centre continues to be the only group offering a free wheelchair loan service and due to demand we have 2 child wheelchairs and 2 larger chairs to suit heavier clients.

The Centre is grateful to all who have given donations of chairs and money during the year as this enables us to provide a very much needed service to the local community.

The Centre also wishes to express its gratitude to all volunteers and to councillors and MSP's for their continued support.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The Centre continues to operate successfully despite the very difficult economic circumstances. This year our total income was 10% lower than 2010 but we continued to provide our full range of services. There was only a small deficit for the year on our unrestricted reserves due to careful management of available funds.

Income from the use of the driving service decreased by 4% compared to 2010.

South Lanarkshire Council continues to provide the principal core funding.

The storage and maintenance unit continues to provide significant benefits and at times the additional space does not seem to be enough.

We are still working on developing the website and producing leaflets with the new company logo.

The results for the year are set out in the Statement of Financial Activities on page 9.

No major changes in the scope of activities of the centre are planned for the next financial year.

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

Investment Policy

The charity does not have surplus funds for long term investment and as all funds are likely to be required in the short term, the management committee has decided that any surplus funds should be deposited in an interest bearing bank account.

Reserves Policy

The management committee has examined the charity's requirements for reserves in light of the main risks to the organisation. The management committee believes that the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets held by the charity should be the minimum of about 3 to 4 months expenditure. At 31 March 2011 the value of unrestricted reserves held as net current assets was £4712. These reserves are needed to meet the working capital requirements of the charity and the trustees believe that, at this level, they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in funding for a period of time to try to find alternative funding sources.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

The demand for wheelchairs held by the centre remains constant and donations of equipment are most welcome.

As mentioned above we continue to work on a new leaflet which will be available for distribution in local shops, clubs, centres and tourist attractions. We hope to have this completed soon. The development of the website continues and will enable us to promote and advertise our services over a much wider area and we see a particular opportunity with the Commonwealth Games coming to Scotland. We hope to be able to offer our services to visitors to Scotland for the Games and also to visitors to local tourist attractions. This will create more demand for our available equipment and we will be actively seeking donations of equipment. We believe that our services help the local economy and hope that we can assist the local area to maximise economic benefit from these forthcoming events. Our website will provide easy access to our contact details and information about our services and performance.

We continue to work closely with the local Job Plus Centres which allows us access to re-stock our supplies of forms locally and quickly.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees (who are also the directors of Disability Resource Centre, Clydesdale for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- · select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2011 set out on pages 9 to 17.

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES AND INDEPENDENT EXAMINER

The charity's trustees (who are also the directors of Disability Resource Centre, Clydesdale for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 2006.

Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Income from donations and grants, including capital grants, is included in incoming resources when these are receivable except as follows:

When donors specify that donations and grants given to the charity must be used in future accounting periods, the income is deferred until those periods.

When donors impose conditions which have to be fulfilled before the charity becomes entitled to use such income, the income is deferred and not included in incoming resources until the pre-conditions for use have been met.

When donors specify that donations and grants, including capital grants, are for particular restricted purposes, which do not amount to pre-conditions regarding entitlement, this income is included in incoming resources of restricted funds when receivable.

Incoming resources from charitable trading activity are accounted for when earned.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.

Donations of new wheelchairs are included at the estimated cost price, donations of second hand wheelchairs are included where the estimated useful life is considered to be two years or more.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds held by the charity are general funds. These are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds held by the charity are for situations where the donor requires that the funds are used for a specific purpose.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the audit fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

Apportionment of costs

Costs incurred solely in respect of activities are allocated to that activity. Other costs incurred are apportioned by the trustees to activities on the basis of their estimate of the usage by each activity of that cost

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Mobility equipment - 20% straight line
Office furn and equip - 15% straight line
Tenants improvements - 10% straight line

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Purpose of Restricted Funds

The charity has four restricted funds, The Lloyds TSB fund, the Storage facility fund, the Big Lottery fund and the Voluntary Action Community Chest Fund.

The Lloyds TSB fund was received for the purchase of computer equipment which is currently in use in the Centre.

The Big Lottery fund was received to meet the cost of constructing the storage unit for wheelchairs. This unit has now been completed.

The Storage Facility fund consists of donations and other funds raised to meet any build and ancillary costs relating to the storage facility in excess of the grant funding obtained. Now that the storage facility has been completed the balance of this fund not committed to fixed assets has been transferred to unrestricted funds.

The Voluntary Action Community Chest fund was received for the purchase of development of a website and advertising brochures.
