#### **Trustees' Annual Report**

For the year ended 31 March 2017

#### Structure, Governance & Management

Disabled Persons Housing Service (Fife) is a company limited by guarantee incorporated in December 2001 and governed by its memorandum and articles of association.

Trustees are appointed at the AGM or from time to time by the Board to fill gaps in skills and knowledge. New trustees receive an induction pack and training is available as required, for example through CVS Fife.

The affairs of the charity are managed by a Board of Trustees who meet monthly. A series of sub groups of Trustees tackle the following specific areas of work; Finance and planning; personnel; customer care and policy and standards.

While the trustees have overall responsibility and control of the charity's activities, the charity is run on a day to day basis by the coordinator, Jackie Morrison.

Disabled Persons Housing Service (Fife) is a member of the Scottish Accessible Housing Network, along with other Disabled Persons Housing Services in Scotland.

The trustees actively review the major risks which the charity faces and believe that maintaining reserves at current levels, combined with regular reviews of controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the advent of adverse conditions. The trustees also regularly examine other operational risks faced by the charity and have established systems to mitigate significant risks.

#### **Objectives & Activities**

The charity's object and activity is to provide independent housing information, advice and support for disabled people from across Fife so they can access the information, advice and assistance they require to enable them to live more independently and direct the course of their own lives.

#### **Achievements & Performance**

The Board continue to analyse the customer requirements and our best possible delivery within constraints of available funding.

The additional funded Self-Directed Support funded by Scottish Government Support in the Right Direction continued during this year with a potential end date of March 2018. Talks continue on potential extension of that date.

#### **Trustees' Annual Report**

Best use of core staff group skills has remained a priority and the SDS fund continues to enable a share of administrative duties making best use of Core/JIT/PSP monies together with SDS monies.

DPHS is engaging with Scottish Government during this year regarding re-accreditation of its housing information and advice service which is being administered by Scottish Legal Aid Board with a date for audit to be made during 2018. Costs related to fees and related time and skills to support this are set aside in the reserves.

Auto enrolment of pensions happened during this financial year with payments ready to be taken at the year end and thereafter by NOW Pensions.

A bid for additional SDS Option 1 work was submitted to the local authority at the end of this financial year with results pending and this may result in further contracted work which also contributes to a share of costs.

#### **Financial Review**

Income this year was £132,113 (2016-£141,304) with the principle sources of funding being grants from Fife Council and the Scottish Government. Expenditure was £130,174 (2016 - £125,987) resulting in a surplus for the year of £1,939 (2016: £15,317). The surplus was added to the reserves brought forward from 2016. At the 31 March 2017, total funds held were £88,632 (2016: £86,693). Of the total funds held, £37,515 (2016: £43,011) were in the restricted fund and £51,117 (2016: £43,682) in the unrestricted fund.

#### Reserves policy

The free reserves available to the trustees are the unrestricted funds less the value of tangible assets that cannot be readily spent. At the 31 March 2017 £50,222 (2016: £42,450) was held as free reserves. Within the free reserves a designated fund of £4,900 is held for Home Point training and accreditation and training and development. The remaining £45,322 (2016: £37,550), equivalent to 4 months running costs, is held as a contingency reserve to cover ongoing running costs (see note 10). It is the policy of the trustees to maintain a contingency reserve of £36,000 and as such the trustees have met their policy aim.

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#### **Independent Examiner's Report**

For the year ended 31 March 2017

I report on the financial statements of Disabled Persons Housing Service (Fife) for the financial period 1 April 2016 to 31 March 2017 which are set out on pages 7 to 14.

#### 1 Basis of Preparation

#### 1.1 Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of historic cost in accordance with: -

- (a) The Charities & Trustee Investment Act (Scotland) Act 2005, and
- (b) The Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 as amended
- (c) The Company's Act 2006
- (d) Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS102) (Effective January 2015),
- (e) Charities SORP (FRS 102) (Effective January 2015)

#### 1.2 Changes to Basis of Preparation

- (a) The Charities SORP (FRS 102), previously The Charities SORP (FRSSE)
- (b) The FRS 102, previously The FRSSE 2015

#### 1.3 Changes to previous years' accounts

- (a) The presentation of the financial statements has been amended to meet the requirements of the Charities SORP (FRS 102). No material changes to the accounts have been made.
- **1.4** The charity meets the definition of a public benefit entity as defined by FRS102.
- **1.5** The charity is dependent on the continuing support of donors. However, the trustees have no reason to consider that this will not continue or that there are any material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

#### 2 Accounting Polices

#### 2.1 Form of Financial Statements

The charity maintains two types of funds for accounting purposes: -

- (a) A general unrestricted fund that can be expended at the discretion of the trustees on furthering the objects of the charity, and
- (b) Restricted funds that may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes.

#### 2.2 Income

- (a) Income is recognised and included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the charity becomes entitled to the resources; their receipt is probable; and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.
- (b) Where income has related expenditure the income and related expenditure are reported gross in the SOFA.

(c) Funds received in advance and which specifically relate to a future accounting period are treated as deferred income.

#### 2.3 Expenditure & Liabilities

- (a) Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis.
- (b) Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation to pay out resources; it is probable they will be paid and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

#### 2.4 Assets

- (a) Tangible fixed assets are capitalised if they have a value greater than £200 and can be used for more than one year. They are valued at cost or, if gifted, at their value on receipt.
- (b) Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of tangible assets over their useful economic life as follows:

Fixtures and fittings

- 15% on reducing balance

Computer equipment

- 33% on a straight line

#### 2.5 Debtors

- (a) Debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due
- (b) Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid

#### 2.6 Cash

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and bank deposits repayable on demand ·

#### 2.7 Creditors

- (a) Creditors are recognised where the charity has an obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors are normally recognised at their settlement amount, usually the invoice amount.
- (b) Accrued charges are normally valued at their settlement amount.

#### 2.8 Taxation

The charity is not liable to income or capital gains tax on its charitable activities. Irrecoverable VAT is included in the asset cost or expense to which it relates.

#### 3 Trustee Remuneration & Expenses

Travel expenses totaling £1,285 were paid to five trustees (2016 - £1,294 to four trustees)
