The trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2021.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the charity's governing document, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (effective 1 January 2019).

Objectives and activities

The charity's objects are to promote the welfare of people with disabilities in need of housing.

Other Activity Areas

On March 23rd 2020 a world pandemic of Covid-19 resulted in all staff working from home, in line with instructions by the First Minister. Staff were resourced with mobile phones, laptops and IT support to ensure that they would be able to access all files, databases etc.

Greater contact was made with clients via social media – particularly Facebook in the absence of the previous in person get togethers.

The Council advised that funding would continue as per the previous year and that there would be discussion with Voluntary Organisations about continuation of existing and development of new services required during this unprecedented occurrence.

Housing and SDS services were moved from "in person" to telephone contact and due to client/customer vulnerabilities all clients/customers known to the service were to be contacted on a regular basis to ascertain if they were safe and/or required support with shopping or prescription collection etc.

In addition, Fife Council approached us to partner with them to deliver Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to vulnerable people in Fife. We contacted all our clients/customers to check their vulnerability and ascertain their PPE needs, if any. This exercise has resulted in deliveries of PPE to between 50-60 people every month and which are still continuing.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (INCLUDING DIRECTORS' REPORT) (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2021

Financial review

Total income in the year to 31st March 2021 was £247,959 (2020 - £244,612) of which £63,644 (2020 - £58,190) was restricted grant income the Scottish Government. Expenditure for the year was £206,868 (2020 - £268,118).

The charity had an overall surplus of £41,091 (2020 - deficit £23,506) leading to a total fund balance carried forward of £147,232 (2020 - £106,141).

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees considers that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

Risk

The Scottish Government has committed to funding in 21/22 and 22/23. Ongoing funding from the Council is back to having to be applied for annually and therefore returns as a risk of them not continuing to fund. The move to telephone service for customers/clients makes the services easier to deliver if we must work on reduced staffing numbers due to any staff contracting the virus.

With reserves retained at current levels, the trustees believe there are sufficient resources to withstand short term adverse circumstances.

Plans for future periods

Despite being a year further on, we're still monitoring the ongoing impact of the pandemic and how we respond to it.

The pandemic and working from home means there remains a need to ascertain which processes can be moved to digital in order to make efficiencies and therefore a better service for customers and clients.

Structure, governance and management

Disabled Persons Housing Service (Fife) is a charity and company limited by guarantee incorporated in December 2001 and governed by its memorandum and articles of association.

Trustees are appointed at the AGM or from time to time by the board to fill gaps in skills and knowledge. New trustees receive training from Fife Voluntary Action on their roles and responsibilities.

The trustees have overall responsibility for the charity's activities, the charity is run on a day-to-day basis by the charity manager. Subgroups of the board are convened, as necessary.

Disabled Persons Housing Service (Fife) is a member of the Scotlish Accessible Housing Network along with other Disabled Persons Housing Services in Scotland.

At the current time, the board are reviewing the constitutional form, governance and staffing structures and are being assisted in this by a specialist charity interim manager.

1 Accounting policies

Charity information

Disabled Persons Housing Service (Fife) Limited is a private company limited by guarantee incorporated in Scotland. The registered office is Caledonia House Pentland Park, Saltire Centre, Glenrothes, Fife, Scotland, KY6 2AO.

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the charity's governing document, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended), FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102") and the Charities SORP "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (effective 1 January 2019). The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest \pounds .

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds are subject to specific conditions by donors that the capital must be maintained by the charity.

1.4 Income

Income is recognised when the charity is legally entitled to it after any performance conditions have been met, the amounts can be measured reliably, and it is probable that income will be received.

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. Other donations are recognised once the charity has been notified of the donation, unless performance conditions require deferral of the amount. Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

Legacies are recognised on receipt or otherwise if the charity has been notified of an impending distribution, the amount is known, and receipt is expected. If the amount is not known, the legacy is treated as a contingent asset.

Accounting policies

(Continued)

1.5 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement, and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure is classified by activity. The costs of each activity are made up of the total of direct costs and shared costs, including support costs involved in undertaking each activity. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs which contribute to more than one activity and support costs which are not attributable to a single activity are apportioned between those activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Central staff costs are allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges are allocated on the portion of the asset's use.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are initially measured at cost and subsequently measured at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and any impairment losses.

Depreciation is recognised so as to write off the cost or valuation of assets less their residual values over their useful lives on the following bases:

Leasehold improvements 15% Straight Line Fixtures and fittings 15% Straight Line Computers 33% Straight Line

The gain or loss arising on the disposal of an asset is determined as the difference between the sale proceeds and the carrying value of the asset, and is recognised in the statement of financial activities.

Impairment of fixed assets

At each reporting end date, the charity reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated in order to determine the extent of the impairment loss (if any).

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

Basic financial assets

Basic financial assets, which include debtors and cash and bank balances, are initially measured at transaction price including transaction costs and are subsequently carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the transaction is measured at the present value of the future receipts discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial assets classified as receivable within one year are not amortised.

1 Accounting policies

Basic financial liabilities

Basic financial liabilities, including creditors and bank loans are initially recognised at transaction price unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where the debt instrument is measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest. Financial liabilities classified as payable within one year are not amortised.

Debt instruments are subsequently carried at amortised cost, using the effective interest rate method.

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of operations from suppliers. Amounts payable are classified as current liabilities if payment is due within one year or less. If not, they are presented as non-current liabilities. Trade creditors are recognised initially at transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the charity's contractual obligations expire or are discharged or cancelled.

1.9 Employee benefits

The cost of any unused holiday entitlement is recognised in the period in which the employee's services are received.

Termination benefits are recognised immediately as an expense when the charity is demonstrably committed to terminate the employment of an employee or to provide termination benefits.

1.10 Retirement benefits

Payments to defined contribution retirement benefit schemes are charged as an expense as they fall due.
