# Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 November 2021

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 November 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

# Objectives and aims

The objects and principal activity of the company were to provide a safe supportive alcohol and drug free place for the youth, of Oban and the surrounding area.

The original aims of the project were to provide an alcohol and drug-free environment for local young people to meet together and to assist them in realising their potential to contribute to society in a positive manner remains at the heart of our work.

"The company's objects shall be to promote the benefit of young persons of Oban and its environs without distinction of sex, sexuality, political, religious or other opinions by associating the local statutory authorities, voluntary organisations and inhabitants in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities, or assist in the provision of facilities, in the interest of social welfare for recreation and other leisure time occupation so that the conditions of life of said young people may be improved and to provide or assist in the provision of an alcohol and drug free café for activities promoted by the company" Oban Youth Café's Memorandum and Articles; p2; 2002

Trustees Report for the year ending 30th November 2021

This report covers 12 months of activity from 1st December 2020 to 30th November 2021

During this period, we worked with 178 different young people, by providing 88 One-to-One Sessions and 161 Group Sessions.

These group sessions were made up of: -

- 74, Nurture Group Sessions (Support & Wellbeing)
- 12, Sessions for young people with additional support needs
- 5, Model Boat Building Sessions (with tutor on zoom)
- 26, School Holiday Activity Sessions
- 9, Rock Climbing & Coasteering Sessions
- 1, Oban Pride Event Youth Zone
- 5 days, Music Project with The Sound System Project and Oban High School
- 11, S1 After-school clubs
- 10, S2+ After-school clubs
- 8, Miscellaneous sessions (including Basketball & Saturday Drop-ins).

Young people's mental health was supported through most of the groups we ran. However, it was particularly supported when 37 different young people participated in 6 different nurture groups, every week in term-time during 2021. These groups are very relaxed and give young people space to take part in relaxing activities, build relationships with each other and youth workers. It also gives them space to talk about anything that is on their mind.

Young people's confidence was supported and developed across all the groups we ran. However, it was particularly supported when: -

- 2 young people took part in five boat building sessions, with an online tutor and youth workers in the room.
- 12 young people took part in a weeklong music course delivered by Sound Systems, where they learnt to build a working speaker and to write raps and create beats.
- 7 young people with additional support needs attended a weekly group during term-time from August 2021 onwards 32 different young people took part in 14 rock-climbing & coasteering sessions

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

The Management committee consist of three current Directors and two other members along with the Project Co-ordinator

#### Organisational structure

The Board of Directors/Management committee meet bi-monthly and where appropriate, more frequently as required. The Board of Directors delegate day-to day responsibility for running of the project to the Project Co-ordinator Kirsty McLuckie. Kirsty is responsible for ensuring that the charity delivers the services specified and the key performance indicators are met. The Project Co-ordinator is also responsible for the individual supervision of the staff and ensuring that the team continue to develop their skills and working practices in line with good practice.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### Purpose of Restricted funds

Grants of £33,884 were received during the year from youthlink, £21,000 from Lottery funding, £16,000 from Robertson Trust which were funds for the cost of youth worker posts and associated costs. Costs covered include salary, employers' national insurance, travel management and salary for cover during study leave.

The project also received restricted funds £2000 from Speedomick, Contract grant income of £11,250 from NHS Wellbeing, £4722 from Mid Argyll Youth Development and £6100 from ADP.

The project has also set up a designated fund of £18,500 for the potential provision of any future statutory costs. Funds have been transferred from general to designated funds to cover this.
