The Trustees, who are also directors of The Women's Rape & Sexual Abuse Centre, Dundee Ltd ("the company" or "the charity" or "the charitable company") for the purposes of company law, have pleasure in presenting their report and the audited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2011.

REFERENCE AND ADMINISTRATIVE DETAILS

Reference and administrative details are shown in the schedule of Trustees and professional advisers on page 1 of the financial statements.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The management committee of the charity are its Trustees for the purpose of charity law and throughout this report are collectively referred to as the Trustees. As set out in the constitution, the management committee will consist of six collective members including a minimum of chairperson, secretary and treasurer, plus two external members shall be appointed from outwith the collective who will have an advisory role only. At the year end, the management committee was made up of two board members which is below the minimum of three board members. Post year end, the charity has been actively seeking new Trustees though an advertising campaign. Appointments from the membership of the treasurer, secretary and chairperson can be made at the annual general meeting and these appointments should be for one year and may only be renewed for two subsequent years.

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee, and is therefore governed by a memorandum and articles of association.

The objective of the charity is to provide a long term service to women and girls who have been raped, or in any way sexually assaulted. In furtherance of this objective, the charity shall have the following aims:-

- i. To support women and girls who have been raped and/or sexually abused at any time in their lives and to provide them with information on legal and medical matters.
- ii. To obtain help and support, where needed, from such agencies that are sympathetic to the stated aims.
- iii. To encourage research into the causes of rape and sexual abuse, and into any ways of preventing or relieving the suffering caused by the sexual assault, provided such research is compatible with the other aims of the organisation.
- iv. To keep statistics and basic reports that will facilitate that research.
- v. To ensure that information which could identify individuals is accessible only to members of the collective.
- vi. To raise awareness of the general public and professional bodies about the nature and the extent of rape and sexual abuse and to encourage their support and understanding.
- vii. To establish links with any charitable group whose purposes are in keeping with the aims of the charity.
- viii. To do all other things as will properly attain the above aims and objectives of the charity.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The charity is committed to maintaining the high standards of the services it provides to vulnerable women that it has achieved during the year and is committed to continuing to provide support to raped and sexually abused women. It will continue to liaise with other organisations in order that it can maintain its ability to maximise the services it provides.

RESULTS & FINANCIAL REVIEW

The results for the year and the charity's financial position at the end of the year are shown in the attached financial statements. The Statement of Financial Activities, incorporating the Income and Expenditure Account, shows a net deficit for the year of £3,793 (2010 – a net surplus of £36,286) with total reserves standing at £113,428 (2010 - £117,221).

During the year, the charity has moved to larger rented premises. In a previous year, the Trustees had designated an amount of £10,000 of unrestricted funds as a building fund, to meet the costs of repairs and maintenance for the move to new premises. However, due to the fact that the new premises do not require this level of cost, it has been decided by the Trustees that this designated fund should be transferred to the general fund.

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

RESERVES POLICY

The charity's policy is to hold sufficient funds in reserve to cover the cost of closing down the charity's operations. Specifically, these costs would involve the redundancy costs of its staff, and remaining obligations under the terms of the lease, and three months running cost such as the provision of telephone support cover for a short period of time. The Trustees have assessed the minimum level of reserves required for such closure costs as £70,000, and are happy to report that the charity has sufficient reserves in relation to the policy.

INVESTMENT POWERS

The Trustees have the power to retain, accept, purchase, sell, lease, hold and invest any property, heritable and moveable, real and personal of whatever kind and wherever situated.

VOLUNTEER HOURS

In the year under review, 1,833 volunteer hours were donated to the charity.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the charity, and are satisfied that systems are in place to manage exposure to the major risks.

RECRUITMENT & APPOINTMENT OF NEW TRUSTEES

Trustees review the skills and composition of the board of Trustees from time to time. Where new or replacement Trustees are required, a list of potential candidates is drawn up and initial approaches are made. Interested candidates are required to submit a curriculum vitae for consideration by the Board of Trustees, which will then select the most suitable candidates for appointment as Trustees.

INDUCTION AND TRAINING OF TRUSTEES

New Trustees receive a comprehensive induction pack which includes details of the activities of the charity together with information about their legal responsibilities as charity Trustees, and information relating to the financial and procedural matters of the charity.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005), the Companies Act 2006 and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Going concern

The Trustees confirm that, after making appropriate enquiries, they have reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, the Trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing these Financial Statements.

Donations and grants

Income from donations and grants, including capital grants, is included in incoming resources when these are receivable, except as follows:

- when donors specify that donations and grants given to the charity must be used in future accounting periods, the income is deferred until those periods.
- when donors impose conditions which have to be fulfilled before the charity becomes entitled to use such income, the income is deferred and not included in incoming resources until the pre-conditions for use have been met.
- when donors specify that donations and grants, including capital grants, are for particular restricted purposes, which do not amount to pre-conditions regarding entitlement, this income is included in incoming resources in restricted funds when receivable.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Tenants improvements - 25% per annum straight line basis Equipment - 25% per annum straight line basis

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against income on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
