Organisational structure

Trustees Report - 1st November 2010 to 30th November 2011 Chairman's report - 2010 - 2011

Without doubt 2011 will go down in the annals of the museum as our Royal Year. News that HM The Queen had awarded us the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service was a great honour and it was greeted with enthusiasm by all involved with the museum. The Award is the MBE for volunteer groups and the museum was one of only 15 organisations to receive the Award in Scotland in 2011.

Adding to this Royal recognition, we were honoured to receive a visit by HRH The Princess Royal in July and we were delighted that she agreed to present The Queen's Award during her visit. Her Royal Highness met 17 volunteers during her tour of the display area and was then surprised to find even more volunteers packed into the audio visual area to witness the presentation of the Queen's Award to two of the museum's founder members, Nancy Black and Donnie MacFarlane. The event was marked by a warm, friendly atmosphere and The Princess Royal later wrote to say how much she had enjoyed the visit. For all those present the day will remain a treasured memory.

As a result of receiving the Queen's Award four museum volunteers attended the Royal Garden Party at the Palace of Holyrood House in July and they were joined by three Board Directors who were kindly invited to attend by our Patron, Kenneth MacKinnon CVO, the former Lord Lieutenant for Argyll & Bute.

Visitor numbers for the 2011 season were marginally down by 250 on the previous year with a total of 28,122 people passing through the doors. These figures are very satisfactory given the poor start to the season and an unseasonably quiet period in July. The museum was also closed to visitors for the day on the occasion of the Royal visit.

Encouragingly, income from donations by visitors and the sale of small items generated £16,344, an increase of £667 on 2010. Income from Friends of the Museum and ad hoc donations was maintained and during the financial year we have made two repayments of £5,000 from surplus income to further reduce our outstanding loan which now stands at £25,000. The generosity of our benefactor in providing the interest free loan is greatly appreciated and, providing that income levels can be maintained or improved, we should be able to repay the loan in full by 2014 - an excellent way to celebrate the 20th year of the museum's operation.

These accounts cover a thirteen month period following a Board decision to change the financial year end to enable income from a full operating season to be shown in the figures. Future financial years will run from 1st December to 30th November.

Achieving Full Accreditation in 2010 has enabled the museum to qualify for two grants from Museums Galleries Scotland (MGS). Early in the year two modern dehumidifiers were purchased through a full grant at a cost of £600 and in November we received a further grant of £3,165 from MGS to provide 50% of the cost of new secondary glazing with 98% ultra violet block glass for the main display area. This will greatly improve protection from the detrimental effect of heat and light on the objects displayed in the area, helping to preserve them in the best possible condition for future generations. This project will be fully funded thanks to the generosity of the Lottery 'Awards for All' who have provided the balance of the cost. Work to install the glazing panels should be completed during the winter closure in readiness for the start of the 2012 season.

All this is excellent news for the museum but, without the dedication, commitment and hard work of so many volunteers over so many years, there simply would not be a museum in Oban. Thank you all.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Period 1 November 2010 to 30 November 2011

1. CHANGE OF ACCOUNTING DATE

These financial statements are for a thirteen month period from 1st November 2010 to 30th November 2011. The new financial year end will now be the 30th of November.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
