Chairman's Report for the Financial Year - 1st December 2014 to 30th November 2015

Twenty-one years of operation and our museum is still going strong with visitors from around the world enjoying their visits to see our interesting displays. Although visitor numbers dropped by almost 2,000 on the previous year to 29,614 our income from donations and sales of small items was maintained sufficiently to cover our overheads.

We were delighted to receive a grant from the Northern Lighthouse Heritage Trust of £700 towards the cost of a new display case for the model of NLB's ship 'Hesperus' and Museums Galleries Scotland awarded us £500 towards the cost of replacing the computer for the documentation office that stores the electronic records of all items in our Collection.

Income from our 'Friends of the Museum' scheme was down again and it is important that we attract new members as this income plus the Gift Aid it attracts is an essential income source as it in enables us to claim a further £1,250 in Gift Aid on the small donations made by visitors.

We celebrated our 20th birthday in June with a get together and cake cutting ceremony at Corran Halls, thanks to the generosity of the Council's Culture & Libraries department. In October our volunteers enjoyed a visit to Inveraray Castle to view the WWI exhibition as well as the castle followed by a welcome cup of tea. Our thanks to His Grace the Duke of Argyll for allowing us free access to the castle and to our former Director, Ian Cleaver, for providing one of his fleet of luxury coaches to transport us to Inveraray.

Sadly, three of our long serving Watchkeepers passed on during 2015 - Lake Falconer, Hector Campbell and Jackie Penrose and young Liam Donn, our High School pupil who covered an evening Watch, tragically died.

In spite of the museum's success we still need to attract more volunteers both as Watchkeepers and to help behind the scenes with administrative tasks. With more and more volunteer organisations starting up in the area it becomes ever more difficult to find new recruits but, if we are to be able to survive, we must find a way to do so.

Next year, we should welcome the 600,000th visitor to the museum, another landmark, probably in September, Then the following year we look forward to 2017 - Scotland's Year of History, Heritage and Archaeology. All things to look forward to and be proud to be part of.

Lastly, but definitely not least, my thanks to all our loyal and committed volunteers - without your contribution Oban simply would not have such a fascinating exhibition of Oban's history in War and Peace. Thank you all.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Land and buildings

- 25% on reducing balance, 15% on reducing balance and 2% on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
