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### Oban War and Peace Museum Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 November 2019

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

#### Organisational structure

Chairman's Report for Year ended 30th November, 2019

2019 has seen the museum enjoy another very successful season with visitor numbers exceeding 33,000 for the first time in a good number of years. Also very encouraging was the fact that the donations also increased significantly. We also saw a major milestone in the autumn by welcoming our 700,000th visitor to the museum.

Our financial situation continues to be healthy but we have to remember that, not only is the building, of which the museum is a part, 140 years old but it is also "listed" with attendant potential expensive repair costs.

The museum is also in the process of obtaining re-accreditation with Museums Galleries Scotland. This happens every five years and ensures the museum is run in accordance with the best methods and policies. It will also assure future project funding and training. We are actively looking at ways in which we can appeal to the younger generation and use social media to engage with visitors bearing in mind the constraints of size and layout of our premises. Any ideas would be welcome.

During the year we have seen old friends retire from museum activities and,sadly.we have to report the deaths of Alistair Watt,Jay MacDonald and Donnie MacDougall.

The museum begins its 26th year of telling the story of Oban and plans are in hand to celebrate the last 25 years. We are also planning to participate in the celebrations of the 75th Anniversary of VE Day in May.

With thanks to all the volunteers and friends without whom the museum could not operate. With your support and involvement, we will continue to be a successful part of Oban's life.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property - 2% on cost

Fixtures and fittings - 15% on reducing balance Computer equipment - 25% on reducing balance

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
