The company is a registered Scottish charity. Objectives and Activities

Objectives

The company's principal activity is the promotion of community development, health and environmental improvement initiatives in Auchinleck.

Aims

The Directors see their role as encouraging the regeneration of Auchinleck, through a range of activities including community gardening and youth engagement projects.

Significant Activities

The past year has been very challenging but not for reasons others might think, we have had an inspiring period where ACDI has moved forward at speed, this is what is exciting and at the same time inspiring given the work and development which is taking place. I must at this point pay tribute to our development officer, Stephen McCarron whose knowledge, drive and experience has been the major element in the group continuing to move forward.

Finances, are as ever, a problem and we make every effort to provide sustainability to all we do. There is absolutely no doubt that groups such as ours, NEED the support of an experienced Development Officer for a longer period than two years to fully cement the improvements delivered.

The Healthy Food Initiative at Quarryknowe has contractors shaping the ground for its future development in a facility that will have the potential to serve a large number of people in our community, providing jobs, training, skills development and health benefits in mental health among others. The Geodesic Domes continue to improve and is making a closer connection to the community and the area and of course it grows in more than one sense, with the added space that will now be available (Quarryknowe) then it should perhaps double its capacity.

We are delivering a pilot study in employability which again could give people in the area a route back into a better lifestyle by the support it may provide.

A long term aim of ACDI has been and is to create youth facilities that the town can be proud of and fully utilize in guiding our young people in helping themselves to make best use of the future. ACDI has expressed an interest in the transfer of Merlin Park Auchinleck for use as a youth project, this is in its early stages but we are hopeful that this will be another example of the successes we have had to this point

A huge thank you goes to all our Directors, members and volunteers and we hope that this can be sustained and improved.

I am excited at what the group has already established and what they will develop in the near future, further land improvements? The possibility of wind turbine community partnership, healthy food practice forming from the Quarryknowe Initiative. Added to the aforementioned is the continuance of our successful Music Festival, Fun Day, open events we provide and assist with and the future plan to provide Cinema on a regular basis. We are at the stage of discussion on License for such.

A phenomenal record by anyone's standard with no end in sight.

My eternal thanks to each and every volunteer who continues to give without return.

DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 SEPTEMBER 2014

Review of Financial Year

The excess of income over expenditure for the year was £47,208 (2013: excess expenditure over income £12,947). Total funds carried forward at 28 September 2014 were £79,770 (2013: £32,562) including £41,669 net book value of fixed assets, which has been allocated to a separate designated fund. The notes to the financial statements contain a detailed statement of financial activities that further analyse the restricted and unrestricted funds and sources of related income.

Risk Assessment

The present Board is aware of the need to develop its risk assessment procedures and this is currently being addressed. The Board feels that adequate insurances are in place in respect of the charities activities. The uncertainty of funding beyond the short-term is a general concern within the voluntary sector. However, the Board is optimistic with current funding negotiations relating to the future growth and sustainability of the charity.

Statement of Directors'/Trustees' Responsibilities

The trustees (who are also directors of Auchinleck Community Development Initiative for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for the year. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 SEPTEMBER 2014

1 Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year to 28 September 2014.

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective 2008), the Companies Act 2006, the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005, Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

(b) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the Trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or grantor.

(c) Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a special performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.

Investment income is included when receivable.

Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 SEPTEMBER 2014

1 Accounting policies (continued)

(d) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and grants.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs includes those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the Independent Examiner's fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity which are voluntary other than Trustees' travelling expenses reimbursed.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SoFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis such as staff time pro-rata.

(e) Fixed assets

Fixed assets (excluding investments) are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Minor additions costing below £250 are not capitalised. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life, which is estimated at 4 years in respect of Motor Vehicles. Geodome assets had not previously been depreciated but the Board subsequently agreed an estimated usual life of 25 years with a retrospective charge being applied from 2007/08.
