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TRUSTEES' REPORT

For the year ended 31 March 2010

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2010.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", (SORP 2005).

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and as such has no share capital. The company, being a charity, is exempt from tax in accordance with section 505 of the Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988.

None of the Trustees have any beneficial interest in the company. All of the Trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up.

The Board of trustees met 4 times during the period. The trustees are Mike Davidson, Mel Young, Pat Cassidy, Henrik Naujoks and Kat Byles (resigned 1st September 2010).

The Directors have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

RELATED PARTIES

Four trustees, Mel Young, Mike Davidson, Henrik Naujoks and Kat Byles are also directors of the sister organisation, ProPoor Sports Limited. ProPoor Sports Limited organises and runs the Homeless World Cup annual event. ProPoor Sports Limited makes annual contributions to The Homeless World Cup Foundation each year.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

This was the fourth year of activities for The Homeless World Cup Foundation.

Its overall objective is to support projects which are using football as a method of lifting people out of homelessness.

In its current year of operation, it received a donation of £65,000 (2009 £24,507) from its sister organisation ProPoor Sports Limited, a social enterprise which organises the annual Homeless World Cup.

It also received smaller donations from organisations and individuals.

Homeless World Cup Foundation grants are given to projects which operate all the year round and improve the quality of life for the people involved through education, improved health and training.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The trustees are again pleased with progress although the charity is still in an early stage of its development in terms of plans for increased activity.

The charity gave out grants totalling £65,770 during the period to the following countries: Russia, Nigeria, Ghana, Malawi, Namibia and India.

The grants were mainly given to projects in poorer countries to help develop grass roots activities in helping homeless people out of their situation by using football as the mechanism. The charity employed one person on a part-time basis whose job it is to carry out the work which resulted from a grant from the Moffat Trust. Administrative costs were kept to a minimum.

The charity monitors closely the activities of each project and measures impact. The ongoing strategy is to make these projects self-sustaining in the longer run.

The plan is for the activities of the charity to grow as more income comes in during coming years.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

As a result of global recession a charity which had contracted to give The Homeless World Cup Foundation a donation of £151,000, went into liquidation.

Reserves in total amounted to £72,989 at 31 March 2010. The Trustees consider it prudent to retain a level of reserves which would ensure the continuing activities of the charity and plan to build the reserves in the future.
