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REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31 MAY 2007

The directors submit their annual report and the audited financial statements for the period ended 31 May 2007. The directors have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in 2005 in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

The charity is a registered Scottish charitable company limited by guarantee, number SC 294025, incorporated on 2 December 2005, and governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Recruitment and appointment of members

The membership is restricted to anyone aged 16 years or over whose main residence lies within Ayrshire, Ayr College, Ayr United Community Initiative, Ayr United Football and Athletic Club Limited, South Ayrshire Community Health Partnership and South Ayrshire Council, or any other corporate body or any individual who has been nominated for membership by any other unincorporated body

The directors are responsible for considering each application for membership and have the right to refuse to admit any person or body to membership

Organisational Structure

The Board of Directors meet regularly to administer the company's activities. The day to day administration is delegated to relevant directors, who in turn manage a team of volunteer staff

The charity is grateful for the unstinting efforts of its volunteers who are involved in service provision and fund raising. Without their support and assistance, the charity would not have been able to make such a valuable contribution to the community.

Risk Management

The directors have reviewed the major strategic, business and operational risks, which the charity faces and confirmed that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced so that the necessary steps can be taken to lessen these risks

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The charity's objectives are

- (1) To provide, in the interests of social welfare, facilities for recreation and other leisure time activities available to the public at large with a view to improving their conditions of life,
- (2) To promote community participation in healthy recreation, in particular by the provision of facilities for the playing of football and other sports,
- (3) To promote and protect the wellbeing and physical health of people living in the vicinity of the facilities operated by the company, and to assist in the relief of ill health and the provision of health education for such people,
- (4) To promote public safety in the interests of the general public, and in particular by promoting initiatives and programmes which are directed towards reducing the incidence of vandalism and other anti social behaviour by encouraging participation in sports,
- (5) To help young people to develop their physical, mental and spiritual capacities, such that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and as members of society,
- (6) To promote training, particularly in such skills as will assist the participants in obtaining paid employment, and
- (7) To promote, establish, operate and/or support other projects and initiatives of a charitable nature

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS (CONT'D) FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31 MAY 2007

MAIN OBJECTIVES FOR THE PERIOD

The charity's main objectives for its first full period were to establish the infrastructure which would allow it to deliver its objectives, and to begin to operate its youth football teams and community football activity

ACHIEVEMENTS, PERFORMANCE AND PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The Academy has made significant progress in its initial period of activity. A Community Coaching School, providing Saturday morning children's football coaching courses has been held throughout the period of this report.

Recently the Academy has entered into partnership with South Ayrshire Council, Scottish Football Association and Ayr United Football Club to take responsibility for the delivery of the South Ayrshire Football Development Programme This will involve large numbers of children, between the ages of 3 to 15, in curricular and extra curricular football programmes, commencing 1 August 2007 Other projects, including the promotion and delivery of a PAN disability participation centre will be delivered throughout the course of the first year of the partnership agreement

Finally, two Ayr United Youth teams participated in the SFA's Youth Initiative Leagues, managed by Academy volunteer coaching staff and four teams will participate in season 2007/08

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Policy on reserves

The Directors hold funds and use the income to pay out all costs, charges and expenses properly incurred in the delivery of the charity's objectives. As this was the company's first period of activity it is recognised that the surplus for the period carried to reserves at 31 May 2007 will be substantially utilised throughout subsequent periods to meet the company's aims and objectives.

Principal Funding Sources

The principal funding sources during the accounting period were Ayr United Football Club, who passed on funds paid by the Scottish Football Association, for the successful achievement of standards in respect of the Youth Football teams, and income donated by corporate and public sector sponsors

The surplus of £65882 for the period is to be carried forward and utilised towards ongoing costs

Basis of Preparation

Donations and Grants

Reserves

The charity's reserves are held in an Unrestricted General Reserve

Value Added Tax

The charity is not VAT registered and as a result all VAT on expenditure is irrecoverable, therefore it is included in the relevant expense or asset cost

Allocation of Expenditure

Expenditure has been analysed, where relevant, between the various types of incoming resources in the statement of financial activities. Costs incurred are treated as pertaining to charitable activities if they directly enable the charity to meet its aims and objectives.
