Principal activity and business review

During the financial year the company entered into a Business transfer agreement with SSE Generation Ltd to transfer the land lease agreement in relation to Langhope Rig Windfarm (Scotland) Limited to SSE Generation Limited.

The company's immediate parent undertaking is SSE Renewables Developments (UK) Limited. The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of SSE plc.

Results for the year and state of affairs as at 31 March 2013

The results for the year ended 31 March 2013 are set out on page 8. The balance sheet at 31 March 2013 is set out on page 9 and indicates net assets of £7,900,000 (2012: £2). The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend or transfer to reserves.

Directors and secretary

D. Gardner resigned on 12th October 2012 and C. Nicol was appointed on the 11th January 2013.

The directors and secretary who held office at the date of approval of the financial statements are those listed on page 1. In accordance with the Articles of Association of the company, the directors are not required to retire by rotation.
