Structure, governance and management

UK Electronics Skills Foundation Limited is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and recognised as a charity by the Office of Scottish Charities Regulator and HM Revenue and Customs. The company is governed by its Directors who sets overall objectives and policies as well as overseeing and controlling activities.

Objectives and activities

The UKESF encourages young people to study Electronics and pursue careers in the sector. We also connect the most capable Electronics students at top UK universities with leading employers.

Achievements and performance

This has been another year dominated by the COVID-19 pandemic. Our activities during the first quarter were very much curtailed and, as a result, we implemented a number of cost saving measures. Happily, support from both universities and industry particularly for our undergraduate Scholarship Scheme has been maintained. We now partner with 26 universities across the UK, and applications from students were in line with expectations. As a consequence, we were able to award slightly more scholarships (61) than we forecast. This has helped us generate a small surplus for the year. Despite the disruption to education this year, we still were able to provide another 250 schools with our "Electronics Everywhere" classroom resources. In the fourth quarter, we launched a new initiative "Insight into Electronics" and have to date provided over 700 secondary school pupils with a microcontroller based hands-on activity. Overall, the UKESF continues to build on its solid foundations and to have a positive impact.

Financial Review

The results for the year to 30th June 2021 are in line with budget with a surplus for the year of £8,038.

Going Concern

The company has liquid financial resources. Accordingly, the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

Responsibilities of the Directors

The Trustees are responsible for preparing the Directors' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

DIRECTORS REPORT (continued)

YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2021

Company law requires the Directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the Directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period.

In preparing these financial statements the trustees are required to:

- · select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- · observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- · make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- · state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- · prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The Directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable it to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. The Directors are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2021

1. General information

The charity is a private company limited by guarantee, registered in Scotland and a registered charity in Scotland for public benefit. The address of the registered office is 1 George Square, Galsgow, G2 1AL.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charity Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure. The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case it may be regarded as restricted.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2021

Resources expended

All expenditure is included on an accruals basis and is recognised when there is a legal or constructive obligation to pay for expenditure. All costs have been directly attributed to one of the functional categories of resources expended in the Statement of Financial Activities. The charity is registered for VAT. All items of expenditure are accordingly shown exclusive of VAT.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:
