Structure, Governance and Management

The constitutional document for Fife Shed Theatre Company Limited was formulated in July 2006 and was completed and officially ratified when it received Charitable and Company status on 7th September 2007

The Trust was incorporated on 7th September 2007 under the Companies Act as a company limited by guarantee. The company is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The company is also a recognised Scottish Charity with the charity number SC038961.

The charity is run by the Board of Trustees who meet to conduct the affairs of the company within the terms of the company's Memorandum and Articles of Association

Objectives and Activities

The principal activity of the company during the period was the organisation of recreational activities with the object of improving the condition of life for certain groups of people. The activities are primarily intended for persons who have need of them by reason of their age, ill health, disability, financial hardship, other disadvantage or to the members of the public at large. The company also seeks to promote equality and diversity

The overall aim and objectives of 'Fife Shed' is to develop a theatre company that promotes the strengths of a diverse society through a performing arts community, supporting everyone to connect, create and perform, where the overall vision is individuality not difference

This will be achieved by creating models of Children's', Youth and Adult Theatre groups that provide performing arts opportunity for all, bringing people together irrespective of past experience in theatre or 'mainstream' or 'special' education

Since September 2007 Fife Shed has continued to raise its profile through the children, youth and adult theatre companies. It has worked with school groups and held two performances

In March 2008 the company began to look for new premises and to develop a strategic plan to ensure future funding could be secured. Fife Shed will take up residence in mid April along with another children's charity. The overall aim is to build a strong link that will create a partnership of awareness around social inclusion and explore new ways in which to communicate and develop good working practices to benefit the clients/users within both charities.

Achievements and Performance

The Theatre Company has 45 members registered and who attend classes regularly They come from various parts of Fife and one of our regular members travels from Dundee Members have come from various sources, the website advertised through Adam Smith College, newspaper reports, word of mouth from existing members and referrals from the social work department. There have been two performances since September 2007. Our latest performance was well attended. A piece of the work is being included in a performance organised by Chicken Shed, our parent Body in London in July 2008. They offer ongoing support and also training for new staff members.

Financial Review

The company is in its infancy and has performed satisfactorily with sufficient funds to enable it to continue its operations

Plans for Future Periods

The company plans to continue its current operations and the Trustees will meet regularly to decide on the future activities

From 1st April 2008 Fife Shed will be working independently Adam Smith College has offered workshop space support until the end of the summer term. This will be reviewed next term. The Company will develop a strategic approach to include ongoing training through the voluntary sector and look at new ways in which to raise the profile and awareness around Fife Shed's activities and core values.

Overall, the next 6 months priority is to consolidate and secure funding for the core work that Fife Shed undertakes Fife Shed offers a unique service, actively encouraging people of all ages and abilities the opportunity to work in a supported environment to bring together, co create, develop and assist one another in a creative way to bring out their true potential

There are a number of additional activities such as Theatre Inclusive Education Workshops (TIE), early year's workshops, summer projects and commercial activity that have been devised with a view towards generating further income, as well as, expanding provision. This work is seen as a secondary stage to the overall development of Fife Shed and therefore is planned to be implemented next year and beyond Expenditure will be kept to a minimum and prime funding must be secured to cover Artistic Workshop Leader costs. Therefore additional funding will have to be sought to take forward the next stage of Fife Shed development.

The Trustees/Directors will continue to monitor the financial situation and begin the process of fund raising and developing a skills base of training needs for everyone within the Company The links with Chicken Shed and the voluntary sector will continue as we begin to build the organisation's capacity and partnership development An AGM will take place in March 2009

Responsibilities of the Trustees

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year Under that law the trustees have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law) The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period

1. Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 1985

Cash Flow Statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the charity is small

Incoming Resources

Grants receivable are recognised when the Trust has met the requirements to receive the grant

Income in respect of furtherance of the charity's objectives is credited to the Income and Expenditure Account on an accruals basis

Donations are recognised when the income is received

Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred

Charitable expenditure comprises of those costs incurred in the delivery of the charity's activities and services. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the accountancy fees

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the Statement of Financial Activities on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, other are apportioned on an appropriate basis.
