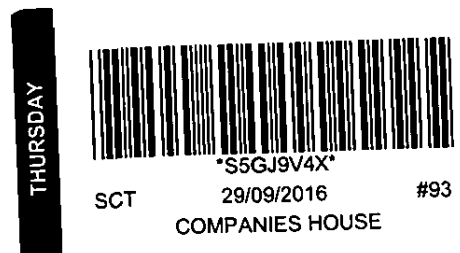
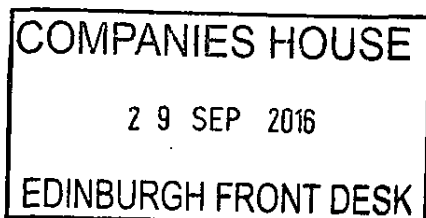



Notes

(forming part of the financial statements)

1 Accounting policies

Miller (Ardent House) Limited (the "Company") is a company limited by shares and incorporated and domiciled in the UK.

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 *The Financial Reporting Standard* applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland ("*FRS 102*") as issued in August 2014. The presentation currency of these financial statements is sterling.

In the transition to FRS 102 from old UK GAAP, the Company has made measurement and recognition adjustments. An explanation of how the transition to FRS102 has affected financial position and financial performance of the Company is provided in note 14.

In these financial statements, the Company is considered to be a qualifying entity (for the purposes of this FRS) and has applied the exemptions available under FRS 102 in respect of the following disclosures:

- Reconciliation of the number of shares outstanding from the beginning to end of the period;
- Cash Flow Statement and related notes; and
- Key Management Personnel compensation.

The accounting policies set out below have, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

Judgements made by the directors, in the application of these accounting policies that have significant effect on the financial statements and estimates with a significant risk of material adjustment in the next year are discussed in note 13.

1.1 Measurement convention

The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis.

1.2 Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, which the directors believe to be appropriate for the following reasons. The Company is a subsidiary within the Miller Developments Holdings Limited group. The financial arrangements applicable to the Company form part of wider Group arrangement involving all the operations of its parent company, Miler Development Holdings Limited, and its subsidiaries. The directors of the Group have prepared forecasts including cash flow forecasts for a period of 12 months from the date of signing these financial statement which demonstrate that the Group has sufficient resources to meet its liabilities as they fall dues. As per note 16 the Company has an investment in a number of property joint ventures. These property joint ventures are forecast to provide returns which are more than sufficient to meet the Company's liabilities over the next 12 month. Accordingly, the directors believe that it remains appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis.

1.3 Basic financial instruments

Trade and other debtors / creditors

Trade and other debtors are recognised initially at transaction price less attributable transaction costs. Trade and other creditors are recognised initially at transaction price plus attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition they are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses in the case of trade debtors.

1.4 Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are stated at cost less provision for permanent impairment in value.

1.5 Taxation

Tax on the profit or loss for the year comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the profit and loss account except to the extent that it relates to items recognised directly in equity or other comprehensive income, in which case it is recognised directly in equity or other comprehensive income.

Current tax is the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Deferred tax is provided on timing differences which arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements. The following timing differences are not provided for: differences between accumulated depreciation and tax allowances for the cost of a fixed asset if and when all conditions for retaining the tax allowances have been met. Deferred tax is not recognised on permanent differences arising because certain types of income or expense are non-taxable or are disallowable for tax or because certain tax charges or allowances are greater or smaller than the corresponding income or expense.

Deferred tax is measured at the tax rate that is expected to apply to the reversal of the related difference, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

2 Expenses and auditor's remuneration

Auditors' remuneration is paid by a fellow subsidiary company, Miller Developments Limited and is disclosed in the accounts of that company.

Factors affecting the future current and total tax charges

Reductions in the UK corporation tax rate from 23% to 21% (effective from 1 April 2014) and 20% (effective from 1 April 2015) were substantively enacted on 2 July 2013. Further reductions to 19% (effective from 1 April 2017) and to 18% (effective from 1 April 2020) were substantively enacted on 26 October 2015. This will reduce the Company's future current tax charge accordingly.

10 Related parties

As at the 31 December 2015, the Company was ultimately a wholly owned subsidiary of The Miller Group (UK) Limited and so it is exempt from the requirements of FRS102.33 to disclose transactions with other subsidiaries headed by The Miller Group (UK) Limited.

11 Ultimate parent company and parent company of larger group

The Company is a subsidiary undertaking of Miller Developments Holdings Limited, a company incorporated and domiciled in the United Kingdom.

At 31 December 2015, the Company's ultimate parent company was The Miller Group (UK) Limited, a company incorporated and domiciled in the United Kingdom.

The largest group in which the results for the year ended 31 December 2015 of the Company is consolidated is that headed by The Miller Group (UK) Limited. The consolidated financial statements of this group are available to the public and may be obtained from the Registrar of Companies, Companies House, 4th Floor, Edinburgh Quay 2, 139 Fountainbridge, Edinburgh, EH3 9FF.

Following the year end and as a result of the group restructure, the Company's ultimate parent became MDL Holdings Limited, a company incorporated and domiciled in the United Kingdom. The Company is ultimately controlled by GSO Capital Partners LP, a division of the Blackstone Group LP.

12 Subsequent events

There were no subsequent events post the balance sheet date and prior to the date of signing these accounts that would have a material impact on the results reported or the financial position of the Company.

13 Accounting estimates and judgements

Key sources of estimation uncertainty

The Company believes that there are no areas of material uncertainty which affect the financial statements.

Critical accounting judgements in applying the Company's accounting policies

The Company believes that the most significant judgement applied is the valuation of property related assets included in the Balance Sheet. Investments in property related joint venture undertakings are stated at cost less any impairment for permanent diminution in value.

The Company reviews the carrying value of its investments in joint ventures on a quarterly basis taking into consideration development progress and future anticipated market conditions to assess net realisable value. There is a degree of uncertainty in making such assessments.

14 Explanation of transition to FRS 102 from old UK GAAP

As stated in note 1, these are the Company's first financial statements prepared in accordance with FRS 102.

The accounting policies set out in note 1 have been applied in preparing the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2015 and the comparative information presented in these financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2014.

In preparing its FRS 102 balance sheet, the Company has made one transitional adjustment. The impact has been to reallocate amounts due to group companies from creditors due in more than one year to creditors due in less than one year. The value of this adjustment to 31st December 2014 is £2,827,060. This adjustment has no impact on profit or net assets and is due to the classification of basic financial instruments under FRS102.
