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DIRECTOR'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

The Director presents his report and accounts for the year ended 31 December 2010.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's aims and objectives, applicable law and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in 2005.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

The following Director served during the year:

Joseph Mackie

David Cunningham is the manager of the charity and is responsible for the day to day running of the charitable company.

The Director has assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and is satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Directors of the company are recruited by way of nomination by the existing Director of the company. Each new Director is presented with a Directors Handbook which sets out the main roles, duties and responsibilities of a director, as well as including background information on The Archie Foundation.

The Board of Trustees approve large grants of over £500 and take advice from the Children's Hospital, Community based Paediatric teams and the Clinical Advisory Committee. Smaller grants are approved by the Director of Fundraising and allow quick access to funds. Decisions are made with guidance from the Board and these projects are reviewed quarterly by the Clinical Advisory Committee.

Objectives and activities

The ARCHIE Foundation is the official charity of the Royal Aberdeen Children's Hospital and Community Child Health throughout Grampian and the Northern Isles. The Foundation exists to provide the extras over and above core NHS facilities to "Make the Difference" for local children when they are receiving medical care.

Whether this is for an individual child, a group of children or all children in the north east of Scotland and Northern Isles - The ARCHIE Foundation provides equipment, funding and facilities to ensure the experience of receiving medical care is as un-daunting as possible for children and their families.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

Achievements and performance

2010 has been a successful year for the ARCHIE Foundation. Growth continued to be in-line with ambitious targets and costs were kept firmly under control. In addition, our expenditure on charitable activity has more than doubled in 2010.

Despite the challenging economic climate of the last two years, our income generation has continued to grow inline with, and indeed exceed, expectation.

On the back of an exceptionally strong 2009, we are very proud to see the benefits of this fundraising now passing on to the many children and families who access healthcare in the Royal Aberdeen Children's Hospital and in the communities of the North East of Scotland and the Northern Isles.

Our projects in these communities, not least of which our redevelopment of the GMed centres, has firmly established the charity as the primary local children's charity in the North East of Scotland.

In 2010, the ARCHIE Foundation directly impacted on the healthcare of over 100,000 children. Making a huge difference by investing in environments, training, people, equipment, research and family support.

The first ever ARCHIE Nurse has now started work and is already improving the lives of children suffering from chronic pain.

The ARCHIE Family Support worker and Parent Accommodation Suite continue to make a huge difference for the families of sick children and the ARCHIE Play Leader will allow the expansion of the Play Team to ensure all children using the hospital have the appropriate play, distraction and support that can be delivered by a professional play leader.

The charity's on-going commitment to environmental development has seen a large investment in facilities such as the Young People's Department in Royal Cornhill Hospital that also included the development of a therapeutic garden.

Finally, our on-going commitment to entertainment for children in hospital has resulted in a record number of face painters, magicians and musical performances taking place in the Children Hospital.

As we continue to grow, we do so in a controlled and careful way. With our charitable expenditure increasing, and our costs an ever-reducing proportion of total income, we are confident of continuing to make an increasing difference in the lives of sick children in the North of Scotland.

The achievements in 2010 would not have materialised without the support and commitment of a dedicated team of fundraisers, both employed and voluntary, lead by our Director of Fundraising, David Cunningham.

Equally so I am enthused by the Board of Trustees who have given freely of their time, at a time when business and personal commitments have probably been at their peak.

The Board of Trustees have also been forward looking in agreeing plans for the development of ARCHIE in the Highlands with the formation of an appeal team to be lead by local businessman David Sutherland.

A very successful year in what continues to be challenging economic times for us all.

My thanks to all involved.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

Financial review

Income was as expected in 2010 and growth against the three-year budget set for the years 2009, 2010 and 2011 remaining slightly ahead of target.

The charity continues to operate a policy of only committing to a project where there are sufficient funds to allocate for the entire costs of the project - thus ensuring the charity can guarantee full funding of any project undertaken. Where this is not the case the charity commits to raise the funds first, through an appropriate appeal, before undertaking any activity.

The Director's policy is to maintain sufficient cash reserves to meet the foundation's obligations on restricted and designated funds and maintain a modest surplus to meet its ongoing costs.

Plans for the future

In 2011, the charity will continue to grow and will open an office in Inverness to fundraise for an appeal to redevelop the Children's Ward in Raigmore Hospital, Inverness.

This growth into the Highlands is in-line with plans to provide support to any child accessing care from the NHS who could ultimately end up in the Royal Aberdeen Children's Hospital.

Disclosure of information to auditors

The director confirms that:

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 2006, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities 2008 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" 2005. The charity has availed itself of s396 of the Companies Act 2006, as permitted in paragraph 4 (1) of schedule 1 of SI 2008 No 409, and adapted the Companies Act formats to reflect the special nature of the charity's activities.

1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the period in which the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure is included on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category and include irrecoverable VAT.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

1.5 Accumulated funds

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the accounts.

Designated funds comprise funds which have been set aside at the discretion of the Directors for specific purposes. The purposes and uses of the designated funds are set out in the notes to the accounts.

1.6 Unrestricted funds

Unrestricted funds are incoming resources generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

1.7 Grant expenditure

Grant expenditure relates to expenditure incurred by the charity to provide the extras over and above core NHS facilities to "Make the Difference" for local children when receiving clinical care.
