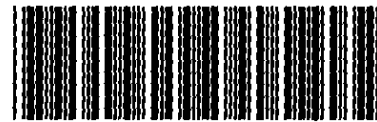



In the year ending 28 February 2017 the company completed a feasibility study informed by artist and audience research into launching a Craft Biennale Scotland in 2018. The new international arts event will showcase ambitious new work by leading and emerging international craft artists and engage local, Scottish and international audiences with exciting craft in new ways. It will be supported by education and community activities which will include groups new to craft creating first in a lifetime opportunities.

The company has started developing initiatives for engaging groups usually excluded from craft and arts participation during the Craft Biennale Scotland.

Alongside this work the company continued to provide a range of PR and marketing support for individual craft artists enabling them to develop their businesses through reaching new audiences. This support has involved organising photography shoots, creating websites and media relations.
