STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Members liability

The members' liability is limited by guarantee and in the event of winding up does not exceed £1.00 per member.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 April 2014

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

To advance for public benefit environmental protection and improvement by conserving and enhancing all species of freshwater fish and their environments primarily but not limted to the inland and coastal waters of the River Ythan Catchment Area.

To advance the education of the public and any association, company, local authority, administrative or governmental agency or public body or representative body in:-

- (1) The understanding of aquatic ecosystems, including their fauna, flora and economic or social activity, and river catchment management.
- (2) The need for, and benefits of, protection, conservation, rehabilitation and improvement of aquatic environments.

The Trust shall produce comprehensive, evolving and phased Fishery Management Plans for the River Ythan catchment. These shall be the guiding documents for the work to be carried out by the Trust.

- Phase 1 Collate all current relevant data on the River Ythan catchment, including its fish stocks and fishery management infrastructure, and produce a fishery management plan.
- Phase 2 Extensive surveys of the river and tributaries to establish and map the quality of habitat, identify obstructions to fish migration, presence of point and diffuse pollution, to establish fish species present, their relative abundance, and also the presence of alien or invasive creatures and plants etc. Develop and activate a strategy for the provision of education and information to the public especially children, in the promoting awareness and interest in environmental issues in the river catchment.
- Phase 3 This is the stage when it is expected that the pursuit of remedial action will be taken, such as the removal or easement of obstructions, improvement of aquatic and riparian habitat and the elimination of alien or invasive species etc. Continue the involvement in information and educational activities.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 April 2014

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Significant activities

During the year the River Ythan Trust has received no funding or resources despite several attempts being made to the likes of SITA, SEPA, RAFTS, Cruden Community Council & Buchan community council. Although the Trust was successful in receiving donations from other sources. This has lead to difficulty in the Trusts attempt to deal with the control of Japanese Knotweed or Giant Hogweed. However following a discussion with the Ythan Project Volunteers and the Formartine Partnership in late 2013 there was a joint project established under the heading of the Ythan Project Volunteers which enabled the spraying of the Giant Hogweed on all the river and tributaries above Fyvie. This was carried out in May 2014.

The Trusts work on identifying and removing/easing of all manmade and debris obstacles in the catchment continues due to the hard work of volunteers. With debris obstacles being removed/eased on the Bronie Burn and tributaries from Ardlethen up to Bronie Bridge with the costs being coverred by donations. As was mentioned last year the trust discussed this with the Rivers and Fisheries Trusts of Scotland and questioned if founding would be available. This was unsuccessful as the Trust was told that the only funding available has been given to the Scottish Environmental Protection Agency (Water Environment Fund) to deal with manmade obstacles where a new national priority has been established. Unfortunately none of the obstacles on the Ythan and tributaries meet the criteria. Again due to the lack of funding received the Trust has still not been able to carry out the remaining survey work, mainly on the Water of Cruden, Slains Burn and coastal streams (50km). There Trust remains committed to completing this work which will continue to be postponed for the time being due to the lack of funds.

Also during the year the Trust was able to conduct "Sniffer" tests to establish fish passability for migratory fish despite a lack of funding. These tests were carried out in September 2013 on the sites of the old weir on the Bronie Burn at Esslemont and the Bridge of Lewes weir on the Fordoun Burn in Fyvie.

The Trust continues to update it's website with information and has several items ready to go onto the website once the problems with the domain name have been rectified. The Trust has also approached the local press on a number of occasions to try and generate some publicity. However lots of the points being made about environmental protection got lost in the issues of Salmon/Sea Trout netting and seals in the estuary.

Due to the poor fishing season in 2013 there were very few Salmon/Grilse scale samples donated to the Trust for analysis. Therefore it was decided that these will now be read along side the 2014 scales.

The continuation of the educational project in the catchment has again proved difficult due to the lack of funding. However the Trust has been able to raise some funding for a "Salmon in the Classroom Project" which the Trust hopes to implement in the autumn/spring 2014/15.

With the funding problems the Trusts aims to diffuse pollution from faming activities have stalled. All the Ythan survey data regarding this issue has been passed to the Scottish Environmental Protection Agency on which they have not acted and are unlikely to act upon until 2016/17 at the earliest.

The next proposed steps for the Trust are to role out the Salmon in the classroom project. As well as fully surveying the Bronie, the Esslemont Weir and the poor bridge apron at Chapelhall in 2014 in order to find a solution to the fish migration problems. The Trust will also continue to try and raise funding so their work can continue and engage with local anglers in an effort to assist with the removal of obstacles in the main stem of truburaries.

As per the Articles of Association three trustees were required to resign but could choose to seek re-election. Therefore resignations were received from Colin Mitchell, Charles Wolrige Gordon and Mark Young. Both Charles Wolrige Gordon and Mark Young both sought re-election and both were re-elected. However Colin Mitchell wished to stand down and Anouk Kahanov-Kloppert was elected in his place.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

At the year end there was a reasonable financial surplus however this balance will be severely depleted once the payment to the River Don Trust is made in summer/autumn 2012 for the habitat work carried out.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention
