The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 30 September 2014.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Act 2006, the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

Structure, governance and management

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 28 January 2010 and registered as a charity in Scotland. The charity is controlled by its governing document, articles of association and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

The directors of the company are also the charity trustees for the purposes of charity law. The Memorandum and Articles of Association contain clear and specific guidelines that outline the processes and procedures for the appointment of Directors. The maximum number of directors is five.

In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1

A detailed induction programme is in place and is delivered to all new trustees on appointment. The directors are issued with a Directors handbook which contains detailed information on (but not limited to) the company's aims and objectives, personnel, expectations of Directors, previous Board papers, Memorandum and Articles of Association and OSCR guidance for charity trustees.

The board of trustees administers the charity. They meet regularly during the period between annual general meetings to oversee the day to day operations of the charity and are responsible for setting the strategic direction and determining policy of the charity. Neil Butler manages the charity's activities on a day to day basis and reports back to the full board at regular intervals.

Wrap the World Limited is a company where Neil Butler is the sole shareholder. UZ Arts contracts the services of Neil Butler through this company for assistance with the delivery of its charitable objectives. Details of the contract are shown at note 7 within the notes to the financial statements.

The trustees have exercised their duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and have ensured that appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

Objectives and activities

The principal activities of the charity is the advancement of education and the promotion of the arts, culture and science together with the provision of recreation facilities throughout Scotland and worldwide.

Building on a history of producing programmes, festivals and events in a wide range of territories, UZ Arts supports innovators across art forms, across borders and outside conventional venues. UZ Arts is the UK representative of IN SITU, who produce and distribute "art in public spaces" on a European scale. We are committed to supporting capacity building initiatives in the outdoor arts in the UK and particularly Scotland.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2014

The activities of UZ Arts seek to offer the wider public access to artistic endeavour by:

- Offering training and mentoring to develop a network of creative producers across Scotland.
- Providing an organisation to deliver and develop art in public spaces outside conventional venues.
 Specifically it will also support the emerging but under resourced street art/physical/circus sector. UZ Arts intends to operate across all art forms and media, projects can be real, virtual and permanent.
- Establishing platforms to bring the work of talented professional artists and performers to audiences.
- Working with public and private organisations throughout Scotland to generate outdoor events that deliver significant economic and social benefits.
- Representing and facilitating partnerships and collaborations between UK and Scottish artists through links with international counterparts.
- UZ Arts will deliver projects that offer opportunities for artists to work directly with communities in the creation of a public performance sector in Scotland.

Achievements and performance

During the period the company recorded the following achievements:

UZ Arts work focused around the establishment of artistic activities in Scotland, the Sura Medura artist residency is Sri Lanka to the benefit of Scottish artists, and participation in the European network, IN SITU to the benefit of Scottish based artists and audiences.

Scotland and England

Following on from the successful Helix Day in Falkirk, UZ Arts developed their activity in Falkirk with the presentation of the International Launch of the Kelpies and the Helix in April 2014. This major event directed by Neil Butler included the commissioning of several Scottish artists and the French company Groupe F that attracted an audience of over 10,000 over two nights. It was also the launch event of the John Muir Festival produced by UZ that involved creating artistic activity along the John Muir Way that was opened by First Minister Alex Salmond.

Europe

UZ Arts developed a series of projects with European artists for distribution across Europe. IN SITU founded by UZ director Neil Butler is Europe's primary network of advocacy of art in public space. UZ created a conference in February 2014 for international producers and artists that took place at Stirling. The conference concluded with an exhibition of work created at Sura Medura (see below) and performances by Scottish artists.

The conference provided an opportunity for producers from across Europe to introduce to each other projects being developed by exciting, innovative artists who are working in public space. The conference encouraged cross border collaboration between the attending artists and producers. Much of the work presented in the conference and those artists seen in the exhibition and performances will be developed, supported and toured by the IN SITU producers.

International

UZ Arts continued to manage the artist residency scheme at Sura Medura 2014/15 and continued to support the Columbian art Biennale. Artists who were in residence presented their work in the 2014 edition of CAB and in exhibition in Glasgow to IN SITU members. (see above)

Financial review

Results for the year ended 30 September 2014 are given in the Statement of Financial Activities on page 7. The assets and liabilities are given in the Balance Sheet on page 8. The financial statements should be read in conjunction with the related notes which appear on pages 9 to 16.

In summary incoming resources amounted to £635,544 (2013 - £357,794), resources expended totalled £635,009 (2013 - £360,293) resulting in net income for the year of £535 (2013 - net expenditure - £2,499). This subtracted from the funds brought forward gives a surplus to carry forward of £26,896.

The trustees intend building reserves until the company has sufficient reserves to support the organisation for a period of six months should the company cease to generate income.

Plans for the future

Scotland

UZ are to develop a new Festival "Galoshans" and an IN SITU international symposium to take place in Greenock in October 2015.

Europe

UZ Arts will continue to commission and produce European artists and support Scottish based artists in touring continental Europe and continental European artists in being introduced to Scottish audiences. They are developing a new strand of funding for IN SITU called "Platform" and expect to win funding support from the EU commission.

International

UZ Arts will manage the artist residency scheme at Sura Medura 2014/15 and plan to present the work of the artists in Sri Lanka in a programme called Moving Out Sri Lanka.

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (FRSSE) (effective April 2008) and the Companies Act 2006.

The charity has availed itself of s396 of the Companies Act 2006, as permitted in paragraph 4(1) of Schedule 1 of SI 2008 No 409, and adapted the Companies Act formats to reflect the special nature of the charity's activities.

1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are recognised once the charity has entitlement to the resources, it is certain that the resources will be received and the monetary value of incoming resources can be measured with sufficient reliability. Such income is only deferred when the donor specifies that the grant or donation must only be used in future accounting periods, or when the donor has imposed conditions which must be met before the charity has unconditional entitlement.

1.3 Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as resources expended as soon as there is legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category and include irrecoverable VAT. These are allocated as between charitable expenditure and governance costs.

Charitable expenditure

Charitable expenditure is incurred in direct pursuance of the charity's principal objects and as set out in the trustees' report. Direct charitable costs comprise costs incurred in inducing organisations to contribute financially to the charity's work and income received in pursuance of these areas is shown within incoming resources.

Governance costs

Governance costs comprise all costs involving public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice. These costs include the expenses of the trustees meeting, legal and professional fees.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

1.5 Pensions

The charity operates a defined contributions pension scheme. Contributions are charged in the accounts as they become payable in accordance with the rules of the scheme.

1.6 Accumulated funds

Unrestricted funds are funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the accounts.

UZ Arts also made sales of £3,946 (2013: £600) from Articulation Arts Limited, a company which N Butler is also a director. At the year end £nil (2013: £600) was owed from Articulation Arts Limited.
