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LOVE MUSIC PRODUCTIONS LTD TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2020

The Trustees (who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act) present their annual report together with the financial statements of Love Music Productions Ltd (the charity) for the year ended 31 May 2020. The financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended), the Companies Act 2006, the Memorandum and Articles of Association, and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102).

PURPOSES & ACTIVITIES

Objectives

The charity is established to provide public benefit in Scotland and elsewhere to promote, maintain, improve and advance education, appreciation, understanding of and access to the Arts, in particular to provide high quality access for children, young people and the wider community to create, participate in and perform music, not limited to any particular genre or style.

Activities

The charity undertakes both concert and theatrical presentations of new and original music works in collaboration with international artists, and develops and delivers music workshops for amateur musicians and young people, culminating in opportunities for them to perform in public events alongside professional musicians.

ACHIEVEMENTS & PERFORMANCE

Love Music Community Choir

The charity continues to deliver the much-commended, 330-strong Community Choir at the Usher Hall, now into its eighth year. This choir is built on a long-term successful partnership with the City of Edinburgh Council. The choir offers termly subscriptions to members alongside a flexible number of free places for those unable to pay. It provides a safe and welcoming space for people of all ages, backgrounds and abilities to enjoy creating music together.

Highly successful concerts were delivered (in conjunction with the Junior Choir) in June and November 2019 at the Usher Hall and featured collaborations with a number of different professional and community musicians and artists in programmes far reaching and covering many diverse musical genres.

Just ahead of the end-of-term concert in March 2020, we moved quickly to cancel rehearsals and the concert itself as the full impact of the Coronavirus pandemic became clear.

We made the decision to continue with choir rehearsals for the summer term, starting at the beginning of May 2020, but to move these online. We delivered these rehearsals, developed online resources for choir members to utilise, improved communications with choir members and surveyed to establish what was working well and what else we could do. This enabled us to sustain our choir community and keep them connected to us and to each other whilst continuing to provide a valuable service for them. The feedback from choir members was overwhelmingly positive and their well-being, resilience and technical skills and confidence were improved as a result of taking part in the online sessions. During the term the choir created and produced its first online-distanced recording and film and, as a result, we have been invited to contribute to a national virtual concert series by UK wide agency Making Music.

Some comments we received from choir members about our online term:

This term has felt a new and special alternative to our usual choir experience and in no way second best. The lengths you have all gone to to provide this material is really impressive.

The resources, interaction and facilitation have all been so good. Really outstanding quality. Very moving to see how a friendly and welcoming experience has been created. It's become a very important part of my week.

It was a great first session with really impressive resources prepared. So good to see the rest of the choir again. I really liked that it didn't try to replicate the Usher Hall Experience but instead evolved into a completely new creation responsive to the strange limitations we are all experiencing.

I've tried three sessions of [another online choir] with 750+ singers from all over the world and this was very slick and professional by comparison. So well supported by all the materials etc... very, very professional.

I work on wellbeing at work and seriously this is the best medicine.

I always feel better and happier after the rehearsal.

Love Music Junior Choir

Our Junior Choir is now in its third successful year, welcoming 8-12 year-olds from across Edinburgh and further afield. Since the start of this project over 359 children have participated. The Junior Choir rehearses and performs in the Usher Hall as part of our partnership with the City of Edinburgh Council, and is part-funded by Creative Scotland's Youth Music Initiative.

62% of the children attending in this year obtained free places due to financial hardship and we provide financial support for travel where required. Increasing access, participation and opportunity are key goals of this project and we work with schools and community and social work partnerships to provide access for children from harder-to-reach areas, from disengaged or isolated communities, and for children with additional needs.

Choir members have reported that the choir has helped with their confidence, personal coping strategies and resilience, and health and well-being.

I sleep better on choir nights.

It helps me cope with hard things.

We maintain a mentored choral leader trainee post and this trainee gains invaluable experience in all aspects of choral delivery, production and leading large-scale workshops and performances.

The Junior Choir performed in our Usher Hall concerts in June and November 2019 and produced a video performing the Proclaimers song "I'm On My Way" on the streets of Edinburgh.

We decided not to hold rehearsals in the summer term starting in May 2020 due to the Coronavirus pandemic. However, we have not stood still and Junior Choir is included in our Plans for the Future section below.

On This, A Winter's Night

In December 2019 we delivered the second of our "On This, A Winter's Night" concerts, in collaboration with The Queen's Hall in Edinburgh, celebrating song, verse, music and light to mark the transformation from autumn into the magic of winter. The concert was the culmination of a singing project with over 200 children from seven schools across Edinburgh which included working with children with profound complex additional needs alongside children from mainstream schools.

The project offered inter-school visits and combined workshops as well as a fully integrated performance. Teachers and staff were extremely enthusiastic about being able to integrate children from both school settings, and noted this as a highly positive secondary outcome. The children learned and complemented their singing performances with 'sign-a-long', a sign language system commonly taught and used in integrated school settings.

Guest artists involved in this project included writer Elspeth Murray, who worked with the schools to create sonic poems for the concert, and Glasgow indie-folk band Admiral Fallow who performed with the children on the night. The artists visited the schools in the months prior to the concert and we held workshops in each school to both support the song learning and the teachers' musical delivery skills in the classroom.

A third project had been agreed and planned to start in Autumn 2020 reaching a further 200 children from across the City of Edinburgh. This has been postponed until further notice.

This Family's Got Soul

We delivered a series of four workshops entitled "This Family's Got Soul" over two days of the bOing! Festival in Canterbury during August 2019. These workshops encourage extended families to sing together, celebrating and promoting inter-generational exchange. This is a new project model and programme which has the potential for delivery at festivals and venues. It can also be developed specifically for schools.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves

The charity's unrestricted reserves at the year-end were £79,318 (2019: £63,737).

Investment Policy & Performance

The trustees, having regard to the liquidity requirements of operating the charity, have kept available funds in an interest-bearing deposit account and seek to achieve a rate on deposit which matches or exceeds inflation as measured by the retail prices index. Due to wider economic circumstances deposit rates have been depressed and so this aim was not achieved in the year.

Reserves Policy & Going Concern

A reserves policy was being developed, based on maintaining a free reserve at a level equivalent to 3 to 6 months of running costs. This policy, subject to board approval, has not been implemented as the financial challenges created by the Coronavirus pandemic requires reserves to be directed towards ensuring that adequate resources are available to assist in funding the activities of the charity through the crisis.

The trustees are aware of the financial impact the Coronavirus pandemic has had and will have on Love Music Productions. However, they believe that the prudent policy of maintaining a sustainable level of unrestricted reserves, combined with sound financial management has placed the charity in a strong position to continue to operate as a going concern for the foreseeable future, during these uncertain times.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2020

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The coronavirus pandemic and the restrictions necessary to control the spread of the virus stopped all of our normal activities in their tracks. As mentioned above, we stopped all in-person choir rehearsals, cancelled all planned concerts, public events and other group activities and postponed projects.

We instigated monthly interim Board meetings on top of our normal quarterly meetings and produced an action plan for the future which includes the following main points:

- We won't furlough staff and will instead utilise them to deliver the actions below.
- We will continue online with the Community Choir, developing and delivering resources and collaborating with professional musicians. Meanwhile, we will continue liaising with the Usher Hall on plans to resume rehearsals in the hall as soon as it is safe to do so.
- We will test the uptake of online resources with the Junior Choir and gather feedback from their guardians, following which we will create a plan to keep our members engaged over the coming months.
- As the country emerges from lockdown restrictions, we will work with our partner schools to find ways of delivering after-school singing activities at their schools with the aim of strengthening our partnerships and continuing to offer a valued service to past choir members and new groups of children residing in areas of higher multiple deprivation.
- We will consider projects to develop resources for wider use and to support the wider community choir sector if we can secure the funding.
- We will continue to closely monitor all expenditure and income, reducing costs where
 possible to reflect reduced income. Regular cash flow statements will be produced to advise
 trustees of the projected financial position and inform any actions required.

We are, of course, investigating all fundraising avenues to ensure the survival of the organisation through this extremely challenging period.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE & MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

The charity, which is a recognised charity in Scotland, is registered as a charitable company limited by guarantee and was set up by Articles of Association on 30 April 2010. The Articles of Association were modified in December 2016 and again in July 2019.

The charity changed its name in October 2012 and was previously known as 'Music at the Brewhouse'.

Membership

Full membership of the charity is open to:

- i) individuals of 18 years of age and over who are interested in furthering the work of the charity; and
- ii) national, international and local voluntary or other non-profit distributing organisations, whether corporate or unincorporated, which are interested in furthering the work of the charity.

Honorary members may be appointed by the trustees at their discretion, but these members are not entitled to vote at general meetings.

Board of Trustees

The policy and management of the charity is directed by a Board of Trustees which meets at least 3 times per year. Trustees must be full members of the charity. The minimum number of trustees is five. New Trustees are appointed by unanimous approval of existing Trustees.

During this financial year:

- Two new Trustees were appointed to supplement the skillset of the existing board.
- One of the Trustees was appointed as the Equalities, Diversity and Inclusion Champion for the board to ensure this agenda is high priority and driven by an Action Plan:

Risk Management

The Trustees continually assess the major risks to which the charity is exposed. These risks are collated on a Risk Matrix which records who has delegated responsibility and what controls and mitigations are in place, and review the systems to mitigate them.

LOVE MUSIC PRODUCTIONS LTD NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31 MAY 2020

Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently in the current and preceding year in dealing with items which are considered material to the accounts, are set out below.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102), and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102).

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

Going Concern

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis. The Trustees have assessed the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern and have reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. The Trustees have considered the potential impact of the Covid-19 pandemic and their conclusions are detailed in the Trustees' Report. There are funds currently available to meet all liabilities when they become due and if there are any changes in position the Trustees will make the necessary adjustments. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing these accounts.

Company status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Trustees named on page 4. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity.

Grants Receivable

Grants are recognised when the charity has met all the conditions attached to the grant. Grants received of a general nature are treated as voluntary income. Grants for the performance of specific services are treated as incoming resources from charitable activities.

Interest Receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the bank.

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available to spend on activities that further any of the purposes of charity. Designated funds are unrestricted funds of the charity which the trustees have decided at their discretion to set aside to use for a specific purpose. Restricted funds are donations which the donor has specified are to be solely used for particular areas of the charity's work or for specific projects being undertaken by the charity. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements. Investment income, gains and losses are allocated to the appropriate fund.

Income

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably

Donated facilities and services are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified and a third party is bearing the cost. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers. Love Music Junior Choir relies on a team of 41 (2019: 41) volunteers to chaperone the children during rehearsals and events. Each week, an average of 24 volunteers out of the team are required, usually for 2 hours per week, for up to 24 days per year. Our warmest thanks to all those who have supported Love Music this year.

Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deed of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. It has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Purposes of Restricted Funds

Junior Choir

Love Music Junior Choir provides participant-centred, no-barrier, creative learning experiences for up to 200 8-12 year olds in Edinburgh. Participants are introduced to different kinds of singing, to a variety of languages and to diverse music from across the world, broadening cultural horizons in a fun and educational way. The choir is entirely open access with no requirements to audition, read music or have any previous musical experience. It provides opportunities to work with professional musicians and improves participants' musicianship, confidence, and social skills. Specific fundraising will continue to take place to support the choir, including securing donations from individuals and grants from trusts and foundations

Beautiful Bones

Beautiful Bones is a street theatre and music spectacle directed by Alan Richardson from Surge, Scotland's circus and street theatre development agency, designed by inspirational artist, maker and performer Alex Rigg, with original music created by award winning composer Stephen Deazley, a specialist composer and educator who creates accessible professional works for emerging, young and amateur performers. This exciting new piece is written for an orchestra of community trombonists of all abilities aged 14 and above, and is performed with professional trombonists and street theatre actors in outdoor festival settings. The restricted grant funding received to develop this project in the financial year 2017-18 was mostly spent in the financial year 2018-19.

Community Choir

The restricted element of the Community Choir activity reflects the in-kind support provided in the form of a donated venue.

Transfers

Transfers between funds can only be made with the approval of the board of trustees and must be in accordance with the terms of reference agreed with the donor organisation.
