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## Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 November 2018

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 November 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

## **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

## Objectives and aims

The main objectives are to develop, operate and maintain a world class centre for the study, interpretation and promotion of St Kilda as the UK's only dual UNESCO World Heritage Site and deliver significant cultural and economic benefits across the Outer Hebrides.

## ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Charitable activities

During the year covered by this report the company developed its phased strategy. With support from Dualchas, architects, the company settled on its vision for A' Chiad Cheum / Stage One development comprising Visitor Centre, Office, Café, Car Parking & Road Access. A key component of the Phase 1 visitor centre will be a clifftop interpretative trail with a spectacular viewing platform, jutting out over the Mangurstadh cliff-edge. The total cost of Phase 1 is envisaged as £2.8m. During the year, the company engaged further with potential funders including Highlands and Islands Enterprise and National Heritage Lottery Fund. Towards the end of the period covered by this report, funding from HIE enabled the appointment of a Project Manager which led to increased activity with prospective funders and with supporters.

The board of Ionad Hiort/St Kilda Centre includes people with relevant professional skills and experience. We also have access to legal and accountancy advice which supports our governance. We have an Advisory Board which includes figures of national and international standing in various fields. We are fortunate to have augmented the Advisory Board during the year with the appointment of a former director of the National Trust for Scotland. We have a Memorandum of Understanding with Highlands and Islands Enterprise. The board of Ionad Hiort has been in receipt of occasional funding from HIE to support community engagement events, seminars, publications and the engagement of consultants. All of this has been handled to the entire satisfaction of HIE. As well as the MoU, we are in an account management relationship with HIE who are supporting our ambitions for community growth and have been critical to our early development work.

The Board continues to pursue funding to finance the various stages of the Phase One developments as well as funding to employ project management staff to progress the development. Funding discussions are ongoing with Scottish Natural Heritage, Heritage Lottery Fund, Highlands and Islands Enterprise, the Scottish Government, the UK Government and others.

Discussions in relation to wider support are ongoing with Natural Trust for Scotland, Comhairle nanEilean Siar, various governmental bodies and others. Progress has also been made in relation to

Slighe Hiort, the St Kilda Trail, to create a network of visitor centres and other points of interest that will run for the Butt of Lewis to Barra Head. A Memorandum of Understanding has been agreed with colleagues in North Uist and Harris to ensure that individual Slighe Hiort projects work together as complimentary united entity.

Looking ahead, the Board is confident that completion of Scheme Design and the grant of Planning Permission in Principle for the Phase 1 development will be secured shortly.

## FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### Principal funding sources

Funding is primarily provided by Highlands and Islands Enterprise.

#### Reserves policy

The trustees are committed to have the necessary funding in place before the project commences.

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The company is a charitable company, limited by guarantee, incorporated on 1 November 2010. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company, and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

## Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purpose of charity law.

The directors are appointed at the Annual General Meeting under the terms of the Memorandum and Articles of Association. At each annual general meeting one third of the directors, other than the nominated directors, being those who have been longest in office since they were last elected at an annual general meeting shall retire from office, but may, subject to the Memorandum and Articles of Association, offer themselves for re-election.

## Organisational structure

The structure of the company consists of the members who elect people to serve as trustees. The members of the company with effect from the adoption of the Articles of Association were nominated by the St Kilda Development Group. Any other persons interested in the company's objects may be admitted as members by the trustees from time to time in accordance with the Articles of Association.

The members elect people to serve as trustees. The maximum number of trustees shall be 12.

In addition there will be an Advisory Council which will provide advice to the trustees on such matters relating to the operations of the Company as shall be referred, by the trustees, to the Advisory Council from time to time. The Advisory Council shall consist of such persons (either individuals or nominees of organisations with an interest in St Kilda or the operations of the Company, the Centre or the Collection) as the trustees shall appoint to the Advisory Council.

## 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

## Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

## Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

## Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

## Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
