Company activities and impact

Hill City CIC continued to operate on a part-time basis. We maintained our client base for web hosting, which provided affordable unlimited web hosting for our clients. We used our eighth year of operations to continue to assess the suitability and viability of our services and continued to run our community project (Hosting Hope) – hosting free monthly community lunches in the neighbourhood of Templehall in Kirkcaldy, on the final Sunday of the month. These lunches culminated in a Christmas Day lunch on 25 December 2019 hosted at Linton Lane Centre, which was well attended by local people and volunteers. In addition, we continued to host free monthly community dinners in our second pilot site of St Andrews, at St Andrews Social / Football Club on the first Monday of the month. Our community meals provided some relief from food poverty and social isolation, while providing a platform for our stakeholders from various churches to be involved in volunteering for a worthwhile community-building initiative. Due to the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic, our community meals were discontinued until further notice. It is anticipated that our community meals for Hosting Hope will recommence once government restrictions are lifted, and it is safe to do so.

Consultation with stakeholders

Hill City's stakeholders are the people who form the congregations of local churches in the United Kingdom. This year, in ongoing personal consultation with our stakeholders, Hill City CIC applied the following actions as a continuation of our intentions from the previous financial year: 1. Continued to offer affordable unlimited web hosting as the company's core business, and to make this available also to people and organizations who were not originally our stakeholders. Where requested, training in web development was provided on a bespoke basis. 2. Any profit from the provision of web hosting would be used to fund Hosting Hope, our community project which would benefit the local community. In partnership with Linton Lane Centre in Kirkcaldy and St Andrews Social / Football Club in St Andrews, Hosting Hope community lunches ran this financial year in Kirkcaldy, and Hosting Hope community dinners ran this financial year in St Andrews. A small team of volunteers from various churches have been assisting in the delivery of these meals, alongside local partners in the community. 3. To maximise the viability of Hosting Hope, the decision was made to accept donations (financial and in kind) which would supplement any profit made from the provision of web hosting, and which would add benefit to the actual running of the community lunches and dinners.
