Dementia Friendly Communities CIC have been carrying out activities with the intention of improving the lives of people affected by dementia by providing services and information which involve and benefit the community as a whole, including:

- Providing and supervising activities and entertainment at the Helmsdale Wellbeing Hub on Monday, Wednesday and Friday every week.
- Trialling a short term carer support programme, designed to assist people with dementia and their carers at times of stress and periods of transition by offering a tailored package of support until equilibrium is restored.
- Promoting a programme of education and training to raise awareness and develop skills around dementia issues, including working with local schools.
- Holding dementia friendly events to bring the community together and raise awareness
 of dementia and other health inequalities, including planning a festive event for around
 80 local residents to be treated to Christmas dinner and live entertainment.
- Working in partnership with NHS Highland and Alzheimer Scotland to improve access to and quality of services in the area.
- Trialling GPS tracking technology to give people with dementia freedom to travel around the area safely.
- A project focussing on making rural housing more dementia friendly this included holding a housing and dementia conference and working with the Glasgow School of Art to improve the design of the built environment.
- Publicising the work we do via our website, social media and representation at local, national and international events.
- As a key partner in the Scottish Government's East Sutherland 8 Pillar Test site, working towards developing a model of community support for people affected by dementia.

- We run regular engagement activities which are designed to bring together a wide crosssection of the community – at these events and activity sessions we record feedback from participants.
- The Wellbeing Hub's activity programme is the result of an ongoing consultation process the activities provided are based on the interests and individual needs of the members.
- We hold regular meetings with delivery partners as part of our normal collaborative activity.
