1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures, fittings and equipment

- 15% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Report for the Annual General Meeting on 16th June 2017 held at Bun-sgoil Stafainn

The current committee and office-bearers were duly elected according to procedure at the AGM held on 31st May 2016. Scheduled Trust meetings take place on the alternating last Monday or Friday of each month at Bun-sgoil Stafainn, and at other times as required.

Objects

The Trust's objects are:

- (a) Community development and the advancement of citizenship. To give people a sense of pride in their community and to increase their welfare.
- (b) The advancement of the local culture, heritage and arts, including our Gaelic heritage.
- (c) The advancement of environmental protection and improvement

Urras Baile Fhlòdaigearraidh Community Company Ltd with charitable status (Flodigarry Community Company Ltd with charitable status) has a vision to develop an innovative quality community heritage facility, language and visitor orientation centre, 'Ionad Thròndairnis' - 'The Trotternish Centre' in the township of Flodigarry, serving the communities of the Trotternish peninsula in the north of Skye.

Ionad Thròndairnis would provide a focal point for the interpretation of the Gaelic language and culture, environment and heritage of the area; and provide an opportunity for future growth in tourist related and educational activities. (Initial feasibility & design study by sbworks)

Ionad Thròndairnis - The Trotternish Centre

The Trust continues to function without the support of a development officer and continues to actively seek funding opportunities to enable the appointment of a person to fulfill this role.

Land Purchase

The land earmarked for the proposed development has been measured and valued by the District Valuer (DV). The directors of the Trust have accepted the DV's value of £8,000 for the 1ha site. The purchase process has proved an onerous one due to the numerous break-off titles for the estate, and the time taken by the sellers to deliver the deeds to our legal representatives for examination. Our lawyer has just very recently received the remaining title deeds. Our legal representatives are now engaging with the sellers and their legal team to conclude the deal.

As part of the examination of titles it was noted that a shooting lease contract existed between the Scottish Government (sellers) and a local group. The leaseholder was identified and approached with a view to renunciation of the area of our identified 1 ha site. He was in agreement to this and to help expedite this process we agreed to pay his legal fees for this.

Bank Account

The account operates with two signatures required from three signatories for all financial transactions, which must be by cheque.

Business Plan

During this business year Faye MacLeod, business advisor updated the financial projections and rolled the document forward to run until March 2021. This review takes account of changes required since its initial production.

Fundraising

Urras Baile Fhlòdaigearraidh continues to take advantage of fund raising opportunities to augment its funds. This business year we have increased our events by holding a big Breakfast in January. This event was very well supported within the community. We catered for a Phd philosophy student group from St Andrews University.

Accounts

The Trust's accounts are prepared and examined annually by Donald Rankin Business Services. These are presented to Directors at the AGM.

Gàidhlig Courses

Urras Baile Fhlòdaigearraidh has continued in collaboration with Sabhal Mòr

Ostaig to deliver community based Gàidhlig language development courses. In 2016/17 the Trust ran two of its developing language in the community in addition to a pilot course for prospective students at Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, the Gàidhlig college and an adult group with additional support needs from North Lanarkshire. August 2016 saw us welcoming Gàidhlig students from various Scottish universities as we do on alternate years.

The courses offered received very positive, and even glowing, feedback with some participants returning more than once. The Trust is very grateful to the Scott-Moncrieff family for facilitating the course through use of the hostel as a venue. This past summer Columba 1400 was used for some classes. Other local businesses benefit from the courses as well.

A successful application for grant funding to Bord na Gàidhlig's Taic Freumhan Coimhearsnachd in 2017 will enable us to further diversify the range of innovative language experiences offered to groups. Through feedback from attendees we shall be readily able to evaluate these new elements.

Martin MacLure, short courses organiser at Sabhal Mòr Ostaig met with representatives of the Trust in autumn 2016 when a useful planning meeting was held at SMO. These discussions have led to the embedding of additional elements introduced in to courses last year.

The Trust offered catering provision to the Sradagan Gàidhlig camp in 2016 and will do so again in July 2017.

The Trust applied again to Bòrd na Gàidhlig for funding to support diversification of course content and to provide Gàidhlig classes for parents in the two local Trotternish primary schools. Our successful award from Bòrd na Gàidhlig has enabled us to run classes for parents during the winter months for both Staffin and Kilmuir schools' parents.

In the autumn it is planned to hold two family days for parents and children of children in Gàidhlig medium education. This follows on from the successful weekend offered and attended in 2016.

Community Land Scotland

The chairperson was elected to the board of Community Land Scotland (CLS). CLS remains a very useful source of advice and support to the Trust as we progress toward completion of the land purchase.

The chairperson stood down as a director of CLS at its AGM in May 2017.

Planning

The formal planning application process will begin on completion of the land

purchase.

Support

John MacDonald who replaced Pamela Noble, community assets department at HIE is our direct contact. We have also met with Sandra Holmes who is actively involved in policy development with HIE.

HIE has given grant support for the land survey and valuation fees and has awarded grant support for legal fees for the land purchase; this funding has been lodged in our bank account.

Gordon Higgins has been helping us identify possible funding sources with a view to support with the application processes.

Conversations have been held between the Trust and Big lottery and Heritage Lottery.

Membership

Ordinary membership continues in excess of one hundred within the wider Trotternish area.

Directors

Three directors have stood down to facilitate the rotational process as per the Trust's Articles of Association.

Four directors attended a map-training course at Sabhal Mòr Ostaig with a view to using this training to augment course content for our student groups. This course was funded by Bòrd na Gàidhlig.

As chairperson, may I thank you all for your continued hard work and support as we continue to work towards our goal of building lonad Thròndairnis thus enhancing employment opportunities in the wider Trotternish community.

As we look toward the coming year we shall continue to strive to meet challenges head on and work towards our admirable and achievable goals!
