1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Report for the Annual General Meeting on 10 October 2019 held at Bun-sgoil Stafainn

Objects

The Trust's objects are:

- (a) Community development and the advancement of citizenship. To give people a sense of pride in their community and to increase their welfare.
- (b) The advancement of the local culture, heritage and arts, including our Gaelic heritage.
- (c) The advancement of environmental protection and improvement

Urras Baile Fhlòdaigearraidh Community Company Ltd with charitable status (Flodigarry Community Company Ltd with charitable status) has a vision to develop an innovative quality community heritage facility, language and visitor orientation centre, 'Ionad Thròndairnis' - 'The Trotternish Centre' in the township of Flodigarry, serving the communities of the Trotternish peninsula in the north of Skye.

Ionad Thròndairnis would provide a focal point for the interpretation of the Gaelic language and culture, environment and heritage of the area; and provide an opportunity for future growth in tourist related and educational activities. (Initial feasibility & design study by sbworks)

Ionad Thròndairnis - The Trotternish Centre

The Trust represents the Trotternish peninsula and as such the name of the development will reflect that.

Land Purchase and Planning

The land purchase process was completed on 18 April 2019 with the Trust having met the requirements set by the Scottish Land Court to enable completion of sale/ purchase of the 1 hectare site from the Dunans (Flodigarry) common grazings. The local Authority Highland Council, for the planned development, granted planning in Principle on 4 February. Rural Design submitted the application on our behalf with Kilmuir Community Council agreeing to have the application submitted through them in the absence of current Community Council in Staffin.

On 4 May 2019 a turf-cutting ceremony was held to mark the significant next step and purchase of the proposed development site. Kate Forbes, MSP for the area was here to turn the first turf with all in attendance adjourning thereafter to Dun Flodigarry hostel, which kindly provided the venue for the subsequent lunch and refreshments.

Musical entertainment was provided by two of the board members Anne Martin and Arthur Cormack, and a poetry reading by Maoilios Caimbeul another of our board members. Local young folk from Trotternish joined us to provide musical entertainment, both at the centenary cairn and at the hostel.

Support

The Trust continues to liaise with Highland and Islands Enterprise (HIE).

Accounts

The Trust's accounts are prepared and examined annually by Donald Rankin Business Services. These are presented to Directors at the AGM.

Bank Account

The account operates with two signatures required from three signatories for financial transactions, which must be by cheque. The account also supports a debit card.

Business Plan

The business plan prepared by Faye MacLeod, business advisor is current with financial projections running until March 2022. Faye, of Campbell, Stewart & MacLennan revised costings for the Trust to reflect changes since the original document was prepared.

Gàidhlig Courses

Urras Baile Fhlòdaigearraidh continues, in collaboration with Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, to deliver community based Gàidhlig language development courses, "Learning through Living Culture/ Ionnsachadh tro Chultar Beò". In 2019 the Trust offered two of its courses, with both being well received with very positive feedback from participants. The Trust once again wishes to acknowledge the support of the community in enabling these courses to be such a success. In August the second of the courses for high school pupils from Central Scotland was held. The school has re-booked for 2020.

The Trust remains indebted to the Scott-Moncrieff family who continued to support the courses through use of the hostel as a venue. Columba 1400 was used for some classes. Other local businesses benefit from the courses as well.

In 2018 the Trust received granted funding from Bord na Gàidhlig, to undertake a scoping exercise to identify resources and information about the locality, which can be, digitally, made available to people interested in or studying the culture and history of the area. This scoping exercise has been completed. Thanks are due to Christine Jamieson from Identitas Consulting, Chris Dalglish from Inherit (Yorvik group) and also to Maoilios Caimbeul, a director who undertook the major task of translating the final report into Gàidhlig.

In September 2019, the Trust met with staff at Sabhal Mòr Ostaig, Scotland's Gàidhlig College, within UHI, to discuss future plans. This enabled new staff to be appraised of this collaborative work.

Community Land Scotland

Two directors attended the annual conference, held in Skye, in June 2019. Community Land Scotland (CLS). CLS remains a very useful source of advice and support to the Trust as we progress toward completion of the land purchase.

Advertising and Social Media

Professionally produced leaflets and booklets are used to advertise the project as the Trust now moves to that stage.

Twitter, Facebook and Instagram accounts are set up with one of the directors taking responsibility for their oversight and operation.

Community Links

The Trust continues to strengthen community links as and when opportunities arise.

Membership

Ordinary membership continues in excess of one hundred within the wider Trotternish area.

Directors

Two directors will stand down to facilitate the rotational process as per the Trust's Articles of Association. One new director joined the board and another will now join.

As chairperson, may I thank you all for your continued hard work and support in enabling the Trust to achieve landowner status this year. The Trust shall continue to work towards its goal of building Ionad Thròndairnis thus enhancing employment opportunities, in addition to promotion and strengthening of the Gàidhlig language and culture in the wider Trotternish community.
