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Report of the directors

The directors submit their report and the audited financial statements for the year ending on 31 March 2019.

Business review and principal activities

The Company has been established as a non-trading holding company for the investment in REH Phase 1 Subhub Limited. REH Phase 1 Subhub Limited (DBFMCo) has entered a Design, Build, Finance and Maintain ("DBFM") concession contract with NHS Lothian (the Authority). The DBFM contract involves the design, build and financing of the new Royal Edinburgh Hospital together with the provision of certain facilities management services within the building. The Project Agreement between REH Phase 1 Subhub Limited and NHS Lothian was signed on 18 December 2014.

As part of this contract, REH Phase 1 Subhub Ltd has entered into a fixed-price sub-contract with Galliford Try Building Limited t/a Morrison Construction to design and build the facility. The construction of the hospital was completed in December 2016.

DBFMCo has also entered a sub-contract with Galliford Try Building Limited t/a Galliford Try Facilities Management for the provision of facilities management services within the building.

The DBFM project is being financed by a combination of senior and subordinated debt. Senior debt facilities of £43.9m, provided by Nord/LB and £4.2m of subordinated debt provided by equity shareholders will fund the construction of the campus.

The hospital has been handed over to NHS Lothian in December 2016 and the operating term of the DBFM contract is 25 years until the project expiry date of 5 December 2041. Monthly service payments from NHS Lothian commenced from the date of Practical Completion when the building became available. The construction and other related costs are being treated as an asset which will be repaid over the life of the contract.

Future developments

The directors do not anticipate any changes in the Company's activities.

Key performance indicators "KPIs"

Given the straightforward nature of the business, the Company's directors are of the opinion that analysis using KPIs is not necessary for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business.

1 Principal accounting policies

(a) General information

The financial statements are presented in Pounds Sterling (GBP) and are rounded to the nearest whole pound. The financial statements cover the results for the year ended 31 March 2019. The continuing activities of the Company are as a holding company for the subordinated debt.

The Company is a private limited company which is limited by shares. The Company was incorporated in Scotland. The registered office is: PO Box 17452

The Company's registered number is SC483054.

(b) Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 – 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland' (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), and with the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

The preparation of the financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in applying the Group's accounting policies (see note 2).

A summary of the more important accounting policies is set out below.

(c) Going concern

The company is being used to hold the subordinated debt in respect of the Royal Edinburgh Hospital project and this debt will not be repaid in the 12 months from the signing of the financial statements and thus the directors confirm that they view the company as a going concern.

(d) Consolidation

Consolidated accounts have not been prepared as the Company has taken the exemption available to small groups.

(e) Statement of Cash Flows

A Statement of Cash Flows has not been prepared as the Company has had no cash movements during the period or in the prior period.

(f) Interest payable

Finance costs are charged to the Statement of Comprehensive Income over the term of the debt using the effective interest method so that the amount charged is at a constant rate on the carrying amount. Issue costs are initially recognised as a reduction in the proceeds of the associated capital instrument.

Principal accounting policies (continued)

(g) Interest Receivable

Interest income is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income using the effective interest method.

(h) Investments

1

The investment in the subsidiary undertaking is stated at cost. The carrying value of the investment is reviewed annually by the directors to determine whether there has been any impairment.

(i) Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

(j) Creditors

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

(k) Financial liabilities

A financial liability exists where there is a contractual obligation to deliver cash or another financial asset to another entity, or to exchange financial assets or financial liabilities under potentially unfavourable conditions. The carrying amount of the liability is increased by the finance cost and reduced by payments made in respect of that liability. Finance costs are calculated so as to produce a constant rate of charge on the outstanding liability.

(l) Financial instruments

The Company only enters into basic financial instruments transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other accounts receivable and payable, loans from banks and related parties.

Debt instruments (other than those wholly repayable or receivable within one year), including loans and other accounts receivable and payable, are initially measured at the present value of the future cash flows and subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Debt instruments that are payable or receivable within one year, typically trade payables or receivables, are measured, initially and subsequently, at the undiscounted amount of the cash or other consideration, expected to be paid or received. However, if the arrangements of a short-term instrument constitute a financing transaction, like the payment of a trade debt deferred beyond normal business terms or financed at a rate of interest that is not a market rate or in the case of an out-right short-term loan not at market rate, the financial asset or liability is measured initially, at the present value of the future cash flow discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument and subsequently at amortised cost.

2 Judgements in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The directors are satisfied that accounting policies are appropriate and consistently applied. There are no accounting estimates.

3 Operating profit

None of the directors received any remuneration as directors from the Company during the period. The Company has no directly employed personnel. All administrative expenses are paid by the Company's subsidiary, REH Phase 1 Subhub Limited. The audit fee of £1,300 (2018: £1,275) and non-audit fee in respect of tax services and iXBRL tagging of £630 (2018: £615) is borne by the subsidiary undertaking.
