The Trustees who are also directors of New Luce Community Trust ("the Trust") for the purposes of the Companies Act, submit their annual report and financial statements for the year ending 31 March 2019.

OBJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the Trust as set out in the Memorandum and Articles of Association are to benefit the community of New Luce and District as defined by the Community Council boundary. The Trust was set up to receive and manage Community Benefit payments offered to New Luce community by wind farm development companies. Payments are currently being received in respect of SPR's Kilgallioch Wind farm and RES's Glenchamber Wind Farm. Priority for grant support will be given to projects located within or directly benefiting the New Luce Community Council Area, although proposals from outside the area can be considered if they include clear benefit to the New Luce community.

The overarching purpose of the Trust is to promote, establish, operate and/or support schemes and projects which are in furtherance of charitable purposes for the benefit of the Community. The activities must provide some measure of economic, environmental, educational, social or cultural benefit for people living in the area.

ACHIEVEMENTS & PERFORMANCE

The Trust received its first full annual payment Community Benefit from SPR's Kilgallioch Wind Farm. A payment of £184,980 was made which included £30,830 that could be invested in an Endowment Fund for the future. The Trust added this sum to a previous allocation and invested £42,705 in a 2 year fixed Term Deposit with United Trust Bank.

The Trust also received another payment of £30,357 for the Community Benefit Fund in relation to RES's Glenchamber Wind Farm together with a share of its unclaimed Local Electricity Discount Scheme monies.

Under the relative Terms of Agreement, the Trust must use Community Benefit sums only for Community Benefits within the Community Area. This means for the purposes of community facilities, skills and employment, community or local events, sport and recreation, environmental improvements, youth and education, and/or heritage, or such other purpose as has first been approved in writing.

The Trust had appointed Sharon Cameron as Development Officer with the remit of carrying out research and consultation, leading to the development of projects that will deliver on the key areas identified in the New Luce Community Action Plan: Winter Fuel Allowance; Underused Buildings; Community Transport; Communications, Greenspaces. Sharon has now been taken on full-time as the volume of her work has increased as the Trust enters the delivery phase of its projects.

- The Winter Fuel Allowance Scheme continued for a second year with all households in the New Luce Community Council area eligible to benefit from a Winter Fuel Payment of £150.
- The Trust commissioned extensive consultation on the underused buildings in the village, which identified a potential community buyout of the Kenmuir Arms as the most favourable option. The Trust was successful in its application to the Scottish Land Fund for a grant to fund 95% of the hotel's valuation price and the purchase was concluded in February 2019. The hard work of developing the building as a community asset will now follow.
- A Taxicard Community Transport scheme was established to address problems with limited public transport links between New Luce and Stranraer. Taxi cards have been issued to households who

applied for this scheme, with £150 of credit being issued on pre-paid cards. Use of the card is limited to use on journeys to or from their New Luce address and should not be used at times when buses are available.

- The community's mobile phone issue was addressed when the Scottish Government selected New Luce as one of 16 areas to be upgraded to a 4G mobile signal as part of its 4G infill programme. WHP Telecoms was appointed as the contractor to erect a mobile phone mast at Mains of Larg and they expect it to go live by the end of the year.
- Greenspaces Projects will include work on the woodland area as you enter the village from Glenluce and this will include thinning and removal of trees and a cleanup of the area. The Trust will be looking into the possibility of reinstating the curling pond.

The Trust approved three grants during the year: £18,457 to New Luce Community Council to provide the balance required for the cost of establishing a new Play Park in New Luce; £17,905 to New Luce Memorial Hall Management Committee to enable them to carry out refurbishment works required in the building together with support to user groups using the hall; and £1,993 was given to New Luce Gardening Group for equipment to help with its work and in its entry in the Scotland in Bloom competition.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with current statutory requirements and the company's memorandum and articles of association.

Income of the organisation for the year to 31 March 2019 was £392,507; Expenditure was £96,594 resulting in a surplus of £295,913.

The company was funded by Community Benefit from Wind farms managed by SPR and RES and it received a Capital grant from the Scottish Land Fund to assist in the purchase of the Kenmuir Arms Hotel.

Principal risks

The Trustees have conducted their own review of major risks to the Company and have implemented systems to mitigate these. The major external risk to funding is recognised as the company's dependence on Community Benefit grants from Wind farm developers, the solution to which is closely monitoring grant commitments and ensuring that no awards are made until funds have been received. Internal risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions.

Reserves Policy

In line with good practice the trustees have defined the company's policy for holding reserves. The intention in establishing this reserves policy is to ensure the continuation of the charity's activities. The policy will enable the company to meet its legal objectives, provide confidence to supporters and donors seeking to give financial support to a prudently controlled company and to ensure that the reserves are at a level to discharge the company's obligations in the event that it should cease operations, The reserves which the company is required to maintain are those needed to fund ongoing monthly costs. The company also has the option to invest part of the community benefit received from SPR KIlgallioch each year into an Endowment Fund to be retained for benefit of the community after the lifetime of the Wind farm.

FUTURE PLANS

The Trust will aim to deliver the priorities of the New Luce Community Action Plan by establishing,

operating and supporting relative projects. Sharon Cameron, Development Officer will continue to research, design and deliver said projects.

The Kenmuir Arms Hotel was acquired in February 2019 and is need of extensive renovation. The Trust will appoint a Design Team to produce development plans for the facility and bring it back into use as a community asset.

The Trust will look to distribute Community Benefit monies through a grant scheme with an emphasis to organisations and projects based and sited in New Luce.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

New Luce Community Trust is a company limited by guarantee and was incorporated on 9 February 2015. It is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. In the event of the Trust being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the Trust.
