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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2021

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objectives of the Ministry are to advance the Christian Faith in such ways and in such parts of the United Kingdom, Europe, Africa and other parts of the world as the Executive Board from time to time may think fit, and more specifically:

- a) To evangelise all over the world and to accept into church membership those who are recognised believers, either born again or transferring from other churches;
- b) To promote true fellowship among and with other Christian organisations who may share the Ministry's beliefs and vision:
- c) To organise and plan the formation and building of churches wherever the need arises;
- d) To spread education according to the Christian faith and the principles of the Ministry among all its members worldwide;
- e) To appoint and train suitable men and women of all nations and races to act as Bishops, Evangelists, Pastors and Teachers of the Word of God;
- f) To establish, encourage and support charities of every description in accordance with the principles of the Ministry, whether under the direct of the management and control of the Ministry or in conjunction with other bodies having like or similar objectives;
- g) To provide, acquire, build and maintain a place or places of public worship;
- h) To hold and otherwise promote religious meetings, conferences and conventions including the arrangement of accommodation for persons attending the same;
- i) To establish and/or support any other charitable body, and to make donations for any charitable purpose falling within the objectives and to collect donations and subscriptions (whether periodical or otherwise).

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Church growth

The church's operations remain trimmed in the UK. The International/National Gatherings and small church fellowship activities continued to be conducted virtually. Zoom services have proven beneficial at the difficult time of COVID-19 pandemic and its associated lockdown restrictions.

Training for leaders and members of Agape, meetings, prayer services including counselling, children's choir, administration, and bible studies are done virtually. Successful mission trips to Satellites in Malawi and Zambia in 2020/2021.

Leadership, training and management

Both, the Boards of Directors and the Executive Board have throughout the year continued to meet independently and regularly on monthly basis. Each Board member has been allocated an area of responsibility within the church and remits are being drawn up for each Board Member. Health and safety training course was conducted virtually for all leadership of the Ministry. Also, there general leadership training seminar conducted biannually benefiting all cadres of leadership.

The main objects of the 11 January 2020 EGM have been consolidated, namely:

- The Charity has not been wound-up and continues to qualitatively grow.
- The main land property was not sold off and the membership are thrilled to see it provide services it was originally purchased for.
- The directors have continued to engage the services of Cowan & Partners Accountants to help them to professionally record and provide sound advice on the charity's financial affairs, in particular David Rutherford in his capacity as Independent Examiner of Accounts.
- The directors value this relationship greatly to achieve sound financial management of the charity.
- The members and supporters of the charity have their confidence boosted in the direction of travel of the charity into the future.

Property maintenance and development

The Agape Development Enterprise Group has continued to oversee the major roof repairs to the AMRC building in Nottinghamshire. ADE are tasked with preparing a business plan to consider income generation opportunities for the AMRC site. ADE also considered alternative interim solutions for holding conferences and for potential income generation, such as a temporary structure at the AMRC.

General administration & finance

A Membership Register was established and is updated throughout the year.

The directors have worked hard in providing administrative and financial functions of the Ministry. The Ministry has stabilised both its member and activity levels.

Having inherited a cash balance of just over £54,000 from the previous trustees, the directors' key focus was to prioritise the payments of the mortgage and other essential bills.

Previously, the wage bill was the largest cost item for the Charity. Currently, the charity is manned by a team of member volunteers who are providing quality responsibilities and functions to the Ministry. This strategy has allowed us to manage and navigate the stormy side of our finances. The ship has been steadied member donations are improving.

Another remarkable achievement is the substantial reduction of office running costs previously associated with the Stirling Head Office as the Ministry operations were transferred to Nottinghamshire. The reduced levels of operations nationwide have led to reduction in Insurance premiums and council tax rates.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Furthermore, since the Ministry purchased its property in 2013 in Nottinghamshire, the local council had been charging rates erroneously based on a wrong tariff. When the directors observed this anomaly, they highlighted it to the local council who conducted their own investigations, admitted fault, and have since agreed to refund some monies, backdating to 2017 only. We are trusting for a complete refund for the other period 2013-2016.

When the Widows and Orphans appeal was launched in December 2020, the Ministry has managed to send donations to cover such items as uniforms and school fees for orphans in Malawi, Zambia, and Zimbabwe

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Results for the year

Principal sources of funding are the charity's members and supporters' giving in both offerings and gift aid income.

The Statement of Financial Activities shows that the financial result of the charity in the year 2020/2021 had a net surplus for the year of £304 (2020: net deficit £203,206) resulting in a slight increase in reserves to £236,049 (2020: £235,745).

Funding

Efforts continue to encourage the members and supporters who pay UK tax to participate in the Gift Aid Scheme. Gift Aid claims when lodged is another substantial way of boosting Ministry income.

Fundraising efforts for building fund, Missions, and other noble activities continue to be encouraged in spite the dip in part due to lockdown effects of COVID-19.

Reserves policy

It is the charity's policy to maintain unrestricted funds at a level that equates to two to three month's unrestricted expenditure, approximately £20,000. This allows sufficient funds to enable the ongoing work of the church to be maintained. Total reserves, including the net book value of Fixed Assets and balances on restricted funds amounted to £236,049 (2020: £235,745).

Grant Making Policy

The charity does not make grants to individuals or other organisations for specific purposes. As stated in the Objects however the Ministry will give donations from time to time to other charitable bodies with similar aims, objectives, and values.

Statement of Risk

The Trustees have assessed the main financial risks the charity faces and have established systems to manage these risks.

No one person can make a transaction from the charity's account (two signatures required). No person shall have any claim of the property of the ministry as specified by the Constitution. Trustee Liability Insurance is in place and an asset register is maintained.

A formal risk register is updated regularly and used to manage risks.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The transfer of assets and liabilities from the unincorporated charity AFANMI to the Charitable Company Limited was completed and confirmation to this effect given by OSCR.

Accounting systems and business processes continue to be closely monitored at local and national level to allow effective management accounts to be produced on a timely basis.

The annual programme of events and conferences were scaled down drastically due to COVID-19 lockdown measures globally. Strong links continue with overseas church groups will be maintained in Nigeria, Malawi, Botswana, Uganda, Kenya, Zambia, Zimbabwe, South Africa, USA, Cyprus, and Poland.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Agape For All Nations Ministries International Limited (SC048812) was set up to replace Agape For All Nations International (SC039070). Agape For All Nations Ministries International (SC039070) has now wound up and passed its assets and liabilities to Agape For All Nations Ministries International Limited (SC048812) which is a charitable company registered with Companies House. The charity began trading as Agape For All Nations Ministries International Limited (SC048812) on 1 April 2019.

Trustees and Office Bearers

Trustees/Directors

The charity Trustees/Directors are responsible for the corporate and financial governance of the Ministry, and for holding the land and any other property of the Ministry. The Trustees are usually appointed either from out with the Ministry or from members of the Ministry. The minimum number of Trustees is two and the maximum is seven. The current Directors were elected during the previous Extra-Ordinary General Meeting held on 11th January 2020.

A new Trustee is provided with a Trustees pack including copies of recent minutes and background information on the Ministry's history, development, values and current strategy.

Trustees are kept up to date with current issues affecting charities and Trustee responsibilities by access to professional publications such as "Governance" as well as information circulated by the Office of the Scottish Charities Regulator (OSCR).

Executive Board

The general management of the Ministry is vested in an Executive Board comprising members of the Ministry. The current High Commissioner of the Ministry also serves as the Executive Board Chairman. The Executive Board consists of at least five members and there is no maximum number of members.

Finance Board

The Executive Board appoints a Finance Board. Once appointed, the Finance Board operates independently of the Executive Board. The Executive Board Chairman is not a member of the Finance Board.

Satellites

Local assemblies are known as Satellites. At a Satellite level the management of the Ministry is vested in a Management Committee, whose chairperson is the local Spiritual Leader. Each Management Committee consists of not less than three members of the Ministry who are nominated by, or may be members of, the Spiritual Leadership of the Church. There is no set maximum number of members.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Agape For All Nations Ministries International Limited

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2021 set out on pages seven to seventeen.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2021

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Agape For All Nations Ministries International Limited (SC048812) and Agape For All Nations Ministries International (SC039070) merged on 1 April 2019. At that date all assets and liabilities were transferred from Agape For All Nations Ministries International (SC039070) to Agape For All Nations Ministries International Limited (SC048812).

All opening balances and comparative figures in the accounts relate to Agape For All Nations Ministries International (SC039070) as there was no activity, assets or liabilities in Agape For All Nations Ministries International Limited (SC048812) prior to the merger. The merger occurred on 1 April 2019 and therefore all current year information relates to the newly merged charity Agape For All Nations Ministries International Limited (SC048812). All accounting policies for Agape For All Nations Ministries International Limited (SC048812) remain consistent with Agape For All Nations Ministries International (SC039070) and no adjustments have been made to align policies.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Donations, legacies and similar incoming resources are included in the period in which they are receivable, which is when the charity becomes entitled to the resource.

Charitable income includes income from conferences, which is recognised when the charity has delivered the conference and is therefore entitled to the income.

Other trading income includes the sale of goods at the conferences, which is recognised when the charity has sold the goods and is therefore entitled to the income. Gifts donated for resale are included as income when they are sold. Donated facilities are included at the value to the charity, where this can be quantified, and a third party is bearing the cost in accordance with Charity SORP (FRS 102), services provided by volunteers are not recognised.

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Expenditure on raising funds includes costs associated with generating income for the charity, either through fundraising initiatives or sales of items to beneficiaries. Expenditure on charitable activities includes costs incurred in supporting the charity and its objectives as set out in he Report of the Trustees.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities, those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them and an allocation of governance costs.

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Notes to the Financial Statements - continued for the Year Ended 31 March 2021

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Expenditure

Support costs are allocated between governance costs and other support costs. Governance costs comprise of those costs involving the public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulations and good practice. They therefore include the costs os statutory audit or Independent Examination, together with the costs of trustees' meeting and some staff costs. other support costs relate to the administrative costs of running the charity and are allocated to charitable activities accordingly.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life

Property Development - 2% on cost
Media equipment - 25% on cost
Office equipment - 25% on cost
Motor vehicles - 25% on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

Debtors

Other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

Creditors

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in a transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.
