- 1. Accounting Policies. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards. In addition:
 - a. Depreciation is calculated to write down the original cost of fixed assets by 25% per annum;
 - b. Investments are shown at cost;
 - c. Stock is shown at the lower of cost and net realizable value;
 - d. Subscription income is recognized when received by the Guild.
- 2. FRS 3 Reporting Financial Performance. The transactions for the year arise wholly from continuing operations of the Guild, and all recognised gains and losses for the period are included in the relevant Income and Expenditure accounts.

GUILD CHARITY FUNDS

The movements in the major Guild Charity Funds are listed at the bottom of page 3 of this Report. Details for the Guild Charity Accounts are in separate documents. Anyone wishing a copy should apply to the Clerk in writing.

The Benevolent Fund increased in value to £236,058. This year the Guild disbursed £15,120 to good causes directly associated with the City or the Guild, in the main to small organisations working to relieve distress in the City.

The Francis Sully Fund provides prizes for the City Schools, and support for the City of London Freemen's School to send pupils on Sail Training Association schooner experience. Prize grants were £1,974 and the fund increased in value to £32,300.

The Christ's Hospital Presentation Fund allows the Guild to assist students at Christ's Hospital to participate in extramural educational visits. The Fund now stands at £43,208 and eight grants of £300 are made annually.

The Francon Trust Fund was set up in 1991 by Guild Member Frank Wells and his late wife to assist those with ability and potential, but no financial resources, to follow City professions. Grants amounting to £14,600 were made in the year. The Fund now stands at £130,564.

The Ronald Ward Bequest Fund provides occasional travel grants for extra mural activities, and stands at £5,094.

The Dunfee Hogg Bequest Fund provides £144 annually for the Freemen's School prizes, and stands at £2,833.

REPORT OF THE HONORARY AUDITOR

to the Members of the Guild of Freemen of the City of London

We have audited the financial statements on pages 4 & 5, and the Charitable Funds (to form the full accounts when combined) which have all been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of investments held by the Charitable Funds, and the accounting policies set out on page 5.

Statement of Directors' Responsibilities. Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs for the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Statement of Auditors' Responsibilities. As described above, the company's directors are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those statements and to report our opinion to you.

Basis of Opinion. We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed. We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

Opinion. In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Guild and its Charitable Funds at 31st July 2001 and of its deficit and surpluses for the year their ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.
