

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

The Directors have pleasure in submitting their 77th Annual Report to the Members together with the audited accounts for the year ended 31 May 1987.

George Graham's first term as our Manager was indeed as successful as we had hoped, and it was particularly gratifying that the season should finish with Arsenal winning, in its Centenary year, the Littlewoods Cup. The excitement, suspense and drama of the semi-finals versus Tottenham and of course the final at Wembley versus Liverpool will imprint for many years to come some quite remarkable memories.

Finishing fourth in the 1st Division was slightly disappointing after such a long run at the top but the disappointment was softened by the knowledge that during the season a new record was achieved in that we went for 22 matches without defeat. The longest in the history of the Club.

Honours came fast and furious for the younger players. Tony Adams won his 1st full International Cap as indeed did Niall Quinn. Gus Caesar, Martin Hayes and David Rocastle were all honoured at Under 21 level which is a great tribute to our scouting system masterminded by our Chief Scout Steve Burtenshaw and our Youth Development Officer Terry Murphy. The whole of the playing staff responded to the challenge, and the experience gained, especially for the younger lads, will I know prove invaluable in the future.

The upturn in our performances on the field is reflected in a substantial increase in average attendances which rose from 23,824 to 29,022. The long run in the FA Cup, and our consistently high position in the League and of course ultimate success in the Littlewoods Cup ensured a sustained interest, and it was encouraging not only for Club finances but for the players to have the opportunity to play before such large audiences.

Since the end of the season we have acquired the services of Nigel Winterburn from Wimbledon and Alan Smith from Leicester City to whom we offer a sincere welcome. Sadly Viv Anderson left at the end of his contract and joined Manchester United. Players have a freedom of choice upon expiry of contracts, and despite making a very substantial offer to the player, he opted for a new challenge. The fee is to be determined by the Appeals Tribunal and is likely to be far less than our own valuation and certainly will not in our opinion reflect his true worth.

George Graham's top priority is to strengthen the Squad even further, and hopefully his efforts will shortly be evident, for if we are to seriously challenge for honours, then it is essential that we have a strong Squad. Stewart Houston joined the Club in July from Plymouth Argyle. Stewart was formally a player with Manchester United and Sheffield United before embarking on a coaching career with Colchester and Plymouth Argyle and takes over Second Team responsibilities from Terry Burton who has now left our staff. Pat Rice will continue to manage our youth side. The back room staff play a vital role in the continued success of the Club and I am sure that Stewart Houston will add to their vast experience.

The Board were delighted when George Graham signed a new long term contract in July. His first year has been very successful and this new commitment establishes a firm base from which we intend to build an even more successful future.

The close season is always a busy period and a great amount of Stadium renovation work has already been completed. In the coming weeks the restaurants serving the East and West Stand are to be completely refurbished and re-equipped to a very high standard, and this we hope will meet the undoubted demands. Maintaining a Stadium as large as Highbury is a massive task, and we continue to invest large sums. During the close season the North Stand roof has been repainted as indeed have many other parts of the ground and this and other work will continue throughout the coming months.

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT (Cont.)

In the Spring we announced the renewal of our sponsorship agreement with JVC (UK) Ltd. The relationship between the two Companies is something of which we are very proud and this is now the longest continuous sponsorship in British football — 9 years in total.

Team success produced a considerable increase in Gate Receipt income. Costs and overheads were adequately contained, and despite a deficit on the transfer fee account of £118,000, I am happy to report an operating profit after taxation of £934,485. This encouraging profit to a large degree redresses the substantial losses made in recent seasons. Already season ticket sales for the current season are in advance of those for 1986/7 and given reasonable success I am optimistic of the future.

Last year I remarked upon the improving behavioural pattern of our supporters and I am pleased that this continues. Our record compares favourably with most others in the country but with the help of the Police to whom we owe a debt of gratitude, we shall continue to strive for even further improvements.

It is the wish of the Government and the Football League that Clubs introduce a membership scheme embracing 50% of the Stadium capacity — after an adjustment for the visitors — which in our case results in a figure of approximately 20,000 people. Due to the physical layout of the Stadium we are unable to comply fully, but it is our intention that we work towards an acceptable figure, clearly taking account at all times, the experience and recommendations of the Police. The successful introduction of our 'Family Enclosure' and of course the 'Junior Gunners' assists very much in reaching these target figures.

In paying tribute to the loyalty of our supporters without whom this business would not exist. I would also like to place on record the sincere thanks of the Board to every member of our staff, both on and off the field for their efforts throughout the season.
