



Memorandum of Association

OF

THE EXETER DIOGESAN BOARD OF FINANCE.

- 1. The name of the Association (in this Memorandum for brevity called "the Board") is "THE EXETER DIOCESAN BOARD OF FINANCE."
 - 2. The registered office of the Board will be situate in Englande
- 3. The objects for which the Board is established are as follows (that is to say)—To do all or any of the following things for the purpose of attaining the ends of the Board, if and so far as allowed by law, and subject to the observance and performance of whatever may be required by law in order legally to carry out the same:—
 - (A) To promote and assist the work and purposes of the Church of England in the Diocese of Exeter whatever for the time being shall be the area of the Diocese called the Diocese of Exeter or called by any name which shall hereafter be substituted for the present name of the Diocese (which Diocese, by whatever name the same may be called, is hereinafter referred to as "the Diocese of Exeter") and in particular to organise and provide funds in aid of the work of the Church and for the following essential departments of the Church's work, viz.:—
 - I. Training for the Ministry, Clerical and Lay.

- II. Maintenance of the Ministry, Clerical and Lay, including the securing sites for and the erection, repair and upkeep of parsonage houses and clergy houses.
- III. Provision of pensions for the Ministry.
- IV. Provisions for Widows and Orphans of the Clergy and for necessitous Clergy and their wives and children.
- v. Securing desirable sites for and the erection and repair of Churches, Chapels, Church buildings, mission rooms, Church halls, hostels and other buildings, whether temporary or otherwise to be used for or in connection with any of the objects of the Board.
- vi. Religious education in all its branches, including the acquisition of buildings and of sites for and the building, equipment, improvement and repair of Church of England Schools and Colleges.
- VII. Provision of expenses of Diocesan and central organisation.

With such additions to and modifications of the departments aforesaid as from time to time may be expedient for the better carrying forward of the Church's work, and to aid and further (in such manner as may be approved by a resolution of the Diocesan Conference or Synod of the Diocese of Exeter and afterwards sanctioned by the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese) the objects and work of the Church of England in any part of England and Wales outside the said Diocese or beyond the borders of England and Wales, or any Mission or Church or body of Christians in communion therewith beyond such borders.

(B) To raise, expend, invest and accumulate funds and income for the purposes aforesaid, and from time to time to determine or assist in determining the proportions in which such funds ought to be contributed in the several Rural Deaneries of the Diocese and in the several Parishes of each Rural Deanery.

- (c) To enter into agreements with associations in connection with the Church of England carrying out in the Diocese of Exter or elsewhere within the borders of England and Wales any objects similar to any of the objects of this Board and to delegate any of its powers as may rom time to time be provided by the Articles of Association.
- (D) To enter into any arrangements with the several diocesan bodies or societies of the said Diocese known as the Exeter Diocesan Trust, or any other body having power to administer or apply any funds within the Diocese of Exeter or any part thereof (whether as part of a larger area or not) for any of the purposes for which the Board has power to administer or apply funds with reference to any of the funds or property held by them respectively, or any of their powers, duties or trusts, and in particular on the request of any such body as aforesaid to take over, carry on or continue any of its powers, duties or trusts.
- (E) To make grants or donations or annual payments to any association or body having any objects in connection with the Church of England similar to any of those of the Board and whether in the Diocese of Exeter or elsewhere within the borders. of England and Wales.
- (F) To pay officers, clerks and servants of the Board, to make payments for insurance on their behalf, and to make provision for any person or the widow of any person who has been in the employment of the Board.
- (G) To raise and borrow money at interest or otherwise for the purposes of the Board on such terms and on such security (if any) as may be determined, and in particular by an issue of debentures or debenture stock, redeemable or otherwise, and to act as guarantors in respect of the raising of money for the advancement of any of the objects of the Board.
- (H) To promote or oppose or join in promoting or opposing legislative and other measures affecting or

likely to affect any of the objects or work of the Board, or any body of persons, the aid or benefit of which is within the objects of the Board.

- (I) To acquire and sell and dispose of houses and land of any tenure (subject to the provisions of Section 19 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act 1908), either in the name of the Board or in the name or names of a Trustee or Trustees for the Board.
- (J) To acquire by any means whatsoever and hold and administer advowsons, rights of patronage, nomination and presentation of and to churches, chapels and benefices, and as and when occasion shall arise to exercise all rights of whatsoever nature belonging or incident to such advowsons, rights of patronage, nomination and presentation in such manner as the Board may determine, with power to delegate the exercise of any such right or any such determination to any council or committee of whom the majority shall be members of the Board or to any members or member of the Board, whether generally or in any particular case or class of cases; and (but not without the consent in writing of the Bishop of the Diocese) to dispose of in any manner whatsoever all or any of such advowsons or rights of patronage, nomination and presentation.
- (K) To take over or co-operate with or make grants to any organisation other than those hereinbefore mentioned or referred to carrying on any work connected with the Church of England in the said Diocese or any part thereof.
- (L) To act as the executors of any deceased person, and to accept property of any kind and in any form, whether real or personal, to be held by the Board either alone or jointly with another or others upon any trusts, whether already existing or newly created, connected with the Church of England, but subject as to land to the provisions of Section 19 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act 1908.
- (M) To apply, if the Board shall by Special Resolution so decide, for a Royal Charter incorporating an association having objects similar to those of the present

Board, and upon such incorporation to transfer and commit the property, work and objects of the present Board to the body incorporated by such Royal Charter.

- (N) In the event of a partition or alteration of the boundaries of the Diocese of Exeter as at present existing, to appropriate such part as the Board shall think fit of the property held for the general purposes of the Board to similar purposes within the area by such partition or alteration separated from the Diocese of Exeter as at present existing, and to make over such appropriated part to any Diocesan Board of the Diocese in which the area so separated is comprised as Trustee, or to any such trustees as the Board shall think fit, and to declare the trusts of the property so made over: Provided that the trusts to be so declared shall, as far as may be, be of the same character, except as regards the area for which they are to be administered and the body to administer the same, as the trusts and provisions applicable thereto under these presents. And as to any property held on special trusts affecting any area so separated as aforesaid or any part thereof, to deal with the same (so far as the law allows) in a corresponding manner.
- (0) To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects: Provided that the Board shall not support with its funds any object or endeavour to impose on or procure to be observed by its members or others any regulation, restriction or condition which, if an object of the Board, would make it a trade union: Provided also that in case the Board shall take or hold any property subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Education or Charity Commissioners for England and Wales the Board shall not sell, mortgage, charge or lease the same without such authority, approval or consent as may be required by law, and as regards any such property the members or trustees of the Board shall be chargeable for such property as may come into their hands, and shall be answerable and accountable for their own acts, receipts, neglects and

defaults and for the due administration of such property in the same manner and to the same extent as they would as such members or trustees have been if no incorporation had been effected, and the incorporation of the Board shall not diminish or impair any control or authority exercisable by the Chancery Division, the Board of Education or the Charity Commissioners over such members or trustees but they shall as regards any such property be subject jointly and separately to such control and authority as if the Board were not incorporated. In case the Board shall take or hold any property which may be subject to any trusts, the Board shall only deal with the same in such manner as allowed by law having regard to such trusts.

The income and property of the Board whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Board as set forth in this Memorandum of Association, and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise howsoever by way of profit to the members of the Board: Provided that (subject as hereinafter mentioned) nothing herein contained shall prevent the payment in good faith (A) to clerical members of the Board of grants and pensions, such grants and pensions being in accordance with the objects of the Board as set forth in this Memorandum of Association, or (B) to any member of the Board who shall hold any office under or be employed by the Board of reasonable and proper remuneration in return for any services actually rendered by him, but so that (1) unless and until a Committee of Management or Governing Body of the Board shall be set up for the management and control of the affairs of the Board, the members for the time being in receipt of any such grant or pension or holding any office or employment in respect of which they are remunerated shall never exceed one-fifth of the total number of the members of the Board, (B) after any such Committee of Management or Governing Body of the Board shall have been set up, not more than one-fifth of the members thereof shall be entitled to any such grant, pension or remuneration, (C) no clerical member of any committee or committees for the time being charged with the duty of making or recommending such grants or pensions as aforesaid shall be entitled to receive

any such grant or pension, and (D) no member to whom any such grant, pension or remuneration shall be made or paid shall in any circumstances vote or be present at any meeting of the Board, or of any Council of Management or Governing Body of the Board which may be set up, or of any Committee of the Board at which the question of making, paying or recommending any such grant, pension or remuneration as aforesaid shall come up for discussion, consideration or decision; and nothing herein contained shall prevent (1) the payment of interest at a rate not exceeding £6 per cent. per annum on money lent or reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let by any member to the Board, or (2) the repayment of out-of-pocket expenses, including such reasonable travelling expenses incurred in attending meetings of or on behalf of the Board or of any Council or Governing Body which may be set up by the Board, or of any Committee or Committees thereof, or otherwise in connection with the business of the Board as may be determined, or (3) any payment to any railway, gas, electric lighting, water, cable or telephone company of which a member of the Board may be a member, or to any other company in which such member shall not hold more than one hundredth part of the capital, and such member shall not be bound to account for any share of profits he may receive in respect of such payment.

- 5. No addition, alteration or amendment shall be made to or in the regulations contained in the Articles of Association for the time being in force unless the same shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Board of Trade.
- 6. The fourth and fifth paragraphs of this Memorandum contain conditions on which a licence is granted by the Board of Trade to the Board in pursuance of Section 20 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act 1908.
 - 7. The liability of the members is limited.
- 8. Every member of the Board undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Board in the event of the same being wound up during the time that he is a member, or within one year afterwards, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Board contracted before the time at which he ceased to be a member, and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up the same, and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributories amongst themselves, such amount as may be required not exceeding £1.

- 9. If, upon the winding up or dissolution of the Board, there remains, after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Board, but if and so far as effect can be given to the next provision, shall be given or transferred to some other institution or institutions having objects similar or cognate to the objects of the Board, and which shall prohibit the distribution of its or their income and property amongst its or their members to an extent at least as great as is imposed on the Board under or by virtue of Clause 4 hereof, such institution or institutions to be determined by the members of the Board at or before the time of dissolution, or in default thereof by such judge of the High Court of Justice as may have or acquire jurisdiction in the matter, and if and so far as effect cannot be given to such provision, then to some charitable object in connection with the Church of England.
- 10. True accounts shall be kept of the sums of money received and expended by the Board, and the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the property, credits and liabilities of the Board, and subject to any reasonable restrictions as to the time and manner of inspecting the same that may be imposed in accordance with the regulations of the Board for the time being, they shall be open to the inspection of the members. Once at least in every year the accounts of the Board shall be examined and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more properly qualified auditor or auditors.

Articles of Association

OF

THE EXETER DIOCESAN BOARD OF FINANCE.

I.—PRELIMINARY.

- 1. For the purpose of registration the number of the members of the Exeter Diocesan Board of Finance (hereinafter called "the Board") is declared not to exceed 120 at the time of registration.
- 2. These Articles shall be construed with reference to the provisions of the Companies Acts 1908 to 1917 and terms used in these Articles shall be taken to have the same meanings as they have when used in those Acts.
- 3. The Board is established for the purposes expressed in the Memorandum of Association, and in particular to promote the organisation of finance for the purposes of the Church of England in the Diocese of Exeter whatever for the time being shall be the area of the Diocese called the Diocese of Exeter, or called by any name which shall hereafter be substituted for the present name of the Diocese (which Diocese, by whatever name the same may be called, is hereinafter referred to as "the Diocese of Exeter").

II.—MEMBERS.

- 4. The following persons shall be qualified to be members of the Board, viz.:—
 - (A) The Lord Bishop of Exeter for the time being (who shall be President of the Board if and whilst a

member thereof), the Dean of Exeter for the time being, the Archdeacons for the time being of the Archdeaconries of the said Diocese, the Canons Residentiary and the Registrar of the said Diocese, the Honorary Secretaries for the time being of the Exeter Diocesan Conference and the elected representatives for the time being of the Diocese in the National Assembly.

- (B) Forty other persons of whom eight shall be elergy and thirty-two laymen all to be elected by the Diocesan Conference or Synod for the time being of the said Diocese (hereinafter referred to as "the Diocesan Conference") such persons to be elected for a period corresponding with the period for which the Conference electing them is appointed.
- (c) Fifty other persons to be elected by the Ruri-decanal Conferences of the said Diocese, two of such persons (one clergy and one layman) being elected by the Ruri-decanal Conference of each of the Rural Deaneries in the said Diocese except the Rural Deaneries of Christianity and the Three Towns, which Deaneries may each elect four persons (being two clergy and two laymen), such persons to be elected for a period corresponding with the period for which the Conference electing them is appointed.
- (D) Not more than five other persons to be nominated by the Bishop of Exeter for the time being by writing under his hand communicated to the Board.
- (E) The Honorary Treasurer, the Honorary Secretary and the Honorary Assistant Secretaries of the Board, if any, if not otherwise members.
- (F) Any person elected or nominated as hereinafter provided to fill a vacancy in the number of the elected or nominated members.
- (6) Such other and such number of persons to be elected in such manner and for such period as the Diocesan Conference shall from time to time direct.

- 5. Each of the members elected by the Diocesan Conference shall be either a member of such Conference or a person who would be eligible for election to such Conference; and each person elected by a Ruri-decanal Conference shall be either a member of such Conference or a person who would be eligible for election to such Conference.
- 6. Any vacancy in the number of the elected members shall be filled by the election of the Board, except in the case of vacancies occurring by reason of the expiration of the period for which such members were elected, but the person elected to fill the vacancy shall be elected only for the residue of the period for which the person whose place he is to take was elected.
- 7. Persons nominated as members by the Bishop of Exeter for the time being may be so nominated for any period not exceeding three years from the time of nomination, and any vacancy in the number of the persons so nominated may be filled up by the nomination of the said Bishop.
- 8. Every person qualified to be a member of the Board shall become a member upon signing within one calendar month after election or such further time as the Board shall determine either the Register of Members to be kept pursuant to Section 25 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act 1908 or a written consent to become a member.
- 9. The following forty persons having been elected in the year 1922 by the Diocesan Conference, such of them as shall within three calendar months from the date of the incorporation of the Board either sign the Register of Members or a written consent to become members shall be deemed to be the original members elected by the Diocesan Conference:—

- 12. Membership shall cease and determine in manner following, that is to say:—As to members being the Bishop of Exeter, the Dean of Exeter, the Archdeacous, Canons, Registrar, Treasurer, Secretaries and Assistant Secretaries aforesaid, upon death, resignation or ceasing to hold their respective offices, and as to any other member upon his dying or resigning or upon the expiration of the period for which he was elected or nominated; and any member may resign his membership at any time by giving to the Secretary of the Board at least seven days' notice in writing of his intention to resign at the date stated in such notice.
- 13. - 21. At a General Meeting, unless the Board otherwise decide, fifteen members shall be a quorum, and no business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum be present at such meeting.

At every General Meeting all matters which come under the consideration of such meeting (except such matters as must be dealt with by Special or Extraordinary Resolution, or as by the regulations, standing orders or bye-laws for the time being in force, require some other majority) shall be decided by a simple majority of votes of the members personally present and voting.
- 24. The Board shall from time to time elect a Chairman, to act for a period not exceeding twelve calendar months from the date of his election. 26. Every member, except as provided in Article 25, shall have one vote and one vote only, and votes shall in all cases be given personally by show of hands. No vote shall be given by proxy, nor shall any member or members be entitled to demand a poll.

IV.—APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS.

27. But the Board shall always have power to deprive any such council or committee or delegates of

all or any of the powers aforesaid, and the Board may also from time to time appoint and remove any persons as Trustees or in any other capacity not involving executive authority for the purpose of strengthening the Board as a whole, and may direct that any subscribers or other persons promoting the work of the Board may, without being members of the Board, be associated therewith under any designation that may seem fit. In particular the Board may, subject to the provisions of the Memorandum of Association, delegate any of its powers as to the administration of any advowsons and rights of patronage, nomination and presentation and the exercise of any rights in respect thereof and the management of the Board's business in relation thereto and the determination of all questions in regard thereto and as to the acquisition of and disposal (but as to disposal not without the consent in writing of the Bishop of the Diocese) of any such advowsons and rights to any such council or committee as aforesaid.

31. Without prejudice to and in extension of the powers mentioned in the last preceding clause, the Board shall have power, subject to any provisions contained in any instrument creating special trusts, to delegate the whole or any of the powers of management vested in the Board over the property subject to such trusts to Managers hereinafter called "Administrative Trustees" (the majority of whom shall be members of the Board) appointed in such manner as may be provided in that instrument, or if such instrument contains no provision as to the appointment of Administrative Trustees, appointed in such manner and for such period as the Board shall think fit, and where the Board delegates the management of any property to Administrative Trustees, it shall be incumbent on the latter so long as they remain Administrative Trustees to the satisfaction of the Board to pay and discharge any rent or other outgoings, charges or payments in respect of any property the subject of the trust, and to maintain, repair and execute any improvements that may be requisite to any such property, and to insure the same against loss or damage by fire, and to defray the costs and expenses including fees paid to surveyors or agents incurred by them in so doing, and in ascertaining that what is required has been done out of the income coming to their hands of the trust property, and, on their failure so to do, or on the Board being dissatisfied with their action in the matter, it shall be lawful for the Board to revoke such delegation, and such delegation may also be revoked on the request of not less than two-thirds of the Administrative Trustees.

- 32. The Board shall in each year prepare an annual report for submission to the Annual Meeting, and shall present the same to the Diocesan Conference, together with a duly audited statement of accounts, and shall also submit to the Diocesan Conference an estimate of necessary Diocesan expenditure for the ensuing year. It shall be part of the work of the Board to take such steps as may be deemed necessary, with the authority of the Diocesan Conference, to raise such money as may be required to meet the needs set forth in the aforesaid estimate.

Articles of Association

OF

THE EXETER DIOGESAN BOARD OF FINANCE.

I.—PRELIMINARY.

- 1. For the purpose of registration the number of the members of the Exeter Diocesan Board of Finance (hereinafter called "the Board") was declared not to and did not exceed 120 at the time of registration and under the Articles as subsequently amended to conform with the Diocesan Boards of Finance Measure 1925 is declared not to exceed 150 in addition to the Bishop.
- 2. These Articles shall be construed with reference to the provisions of the Companies Acts 1908 to 1917 and terms used in these Articles shall be taken to have the same meanings as they have when used in those Acts.
- 3. The Board is established for the purposes expressed in the Memorandum of Association, and in particular to promote the organisation of finance for the purposes of the Church of England in the Diocese of Exeter whatever for the time being shall be the area of the Diocese called the Diocese of Exeter, or called by any name which shall hereafter be substituted for the present name of the Diocese (which Diocese, by whatever name the same may be called, is hereinafter referred to as "the Diocese of Exeter").

II.—MEMBERS.

 - (A) The Lord Bishop of the Diocese of Exeter for the time being (hereinafter referred to as the Bishop) who shall be ex officio President and a Member of the Board, one Suffragan Bishop of the Diocese of Exeter (to be nominated by the Bishop), the Dean of Exeter for the time being, the Archdeacons for the time being of the Archdeaconries of the Diocese of Exeter, the Registrar of the Diocese of Exeter, one of the Honorary Secretaries for the time being of the Exeter Diocesan Conference (to be nominated by them), the Proctors in Convocation for the Diocese of Exeter, and the elected lay representatives for the time being of the Diocese of Exeter in the National Assembly.
 - (B) The Honorary Treasurer and the Honorary Secretary of the Board.
 - (c) Twenty-four other persons of whom twelve shall be clergy and twelve laymen to be elected by and from the Diocesan Conference for the time being of the Diocesa Conference "), three of each from each of the four Archdeaconries, such persons to be elected for a period corresponding with the period for which the Conference electing them is appointed.
 - (D) Sixty-nine other persons to be elected by the Ruridecanal Conferences of the Diocese of Exeter, three of such persons (one clergy and two laymen) being elected by the Ruri-decanal Conference of each of the Rural Deaneries in the Diocese of Exeter, such persons to be elected for a period corresponding with the period for which the Conference electing them is appointed.
 - (E) Not more than four other persons to be nominated by the Bishop by writing under his hand communicated to the Board.
 - (F) Any person elected or nominated as hereinafter provided to fill a vacancy in the number of the elected or nominated members.

(G) Such other and such number of persons to be elected in such manner and for such period as the Diocesan Conference shall from time to time direct, provided always that the total number of Members of the Board (in addition to the Bishop) does not exceed 150, not less than three-fourths of whom shall be elected by the Diocesan or Ruri-decanal Conferences; and that not less than two-thirds of the elected Members of the Board shall be Members of the Diocesan Conference and that a majority of the Members of the Board shall be laymen.

- 5. - 13. The Secretary may, in cases of urgent necessity, with the sanction of three members of the Board, and shall upon a requisition made in writing and signed by any five or more members of the Board, convene a General Meeting.
- 14. Any requisition made by members of the Board shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called and shall be left at the registered office of the Board.
- 15. Upon the receipt of such requisition the Secretary shall forthwith proceed to convene a General Meeting, and if he does

€ ,

not convene the same within twenty-one days from the date of receipt of such requisition, the members making such requisition may themselves convene a General Meeting.

- 16. Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, specifying the place and time of meeting, and the general nature of the business to be transacted thereat, shall be sent to each member, but the accidental omission to send such notice to or the non-receipt of such notice by any member shall not invalidate the proceedings of any General Meeting.
- 17. At a General Meeting, unless the Board otherwise decide, fifteen members shall be a quorum, and no business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum be present at such meeting.
- 18. If within half an hour from the time appointed for a meeting a quorum be not present the meeting shall be dissolved.
- 19. At every General Meeting all matters which come under the consideration of such meeting (except such matters as must be dealt with by Special or Extraordinary Resolution, or as by the regulations, standing orders or bye-laws for the time being in force, require some other majority) shall be decided by a simple majority of votes of the members personally present and voting.
- 20. The Board shall from time to time elect a Chairman and one or more Vice-Chairmen. The Board shall also from time to time appoint an Honorary or Paid Treasurer and Honorary or Paid Secretary, and may from time to time appoint such Honorary or Paid Assistant Secretaries as it shall think fit.
- 21. At any General Meeting the Bishop, or, in his absence, the Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, shall preside as Chairman of such meeting. If neither the Bishop, nor the Chairman, nor the Vice-Chairman is present at any meeting the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman. The Chairman of the meeting shall, in case the votes at any General Meeting are equally divided, be entitled to a second or casting vote. Such Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left undisposed of at the meeting at which the adjournment took place.

22. Every member, except as provided in Article 21, shall have one vote and one vote only, and votes shall in all cases be given personally by show of hands. No vote shall be given by proxy, nor shall any member or members be entitled to demand a poll.

IV.—APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS.

23. The Board may appoint and at discretion remove or suspend such officers, clerks, agents and servants for permanent, temporary or special services as the Board from time to time think fit and determine their duties and fix their salaries or emoluments and require security in such instances and to such amount as they think fit.

V.—POWERS OF THE BOARD, &c.

- 24. The Board may from time to time make, vary and repeal regulations, standing orders and bye-laws for the regulation and conduct of the business and affairs of the Board, its officers, servants and the members or any section thereof, but so that such regulations, standing orders and bye-laws shall not be inconsistent with the regulations of the Board contained in its Memorandum and Articles of Association, or amount to such an addition to or alteration of the Articles of Association as could only legally be made by Special Resolution and in accordance with Clause 5 of the Memorandum of Association: Provided that in case there shall at any time be any conflict between the Articles of Association and the standing orders and bye-laws, the provisions of the Articles of Association shall prevail.
- 25. The Board may, under the direction of the Diocesan Conference, increase or diminish its numbers from time to time, but so that the membership of the Board conforms with the provisions of the Diocesan Boards of Finance Measure 1925, and provided that the total number of members of the Board does not exceed 150 in addition to the Bishop.
- 26. The Board shall have power to delegate any of its powers to a council or to committees of whom the majority shall be members of the Board, and to give to such council or committees like powers of delegation, including power to make, revoke and alter bye-laws not inconsistent with the Memorandum of Association or amounting to such an addition to or alteration of the Articles

of Association as could only legally be made by a Special Resolution and in accordance with Clause 5 of the Memorandum of Association. But the Board shall always have power to deprive any such council or committee or delegates of all or any of the powers aforesaid, and the Board may also from time to time appoint and remove any persons as Trustees or in any other capacity not involving executive authority for the purpose of strengthening the Board as a whole, and may direct that any subscribers or other persons promoting the work of the Board may, without being members of the Board, be associated therewith under any designation that may seem fit. In particular the Board may, subject to the provisions of the Memorandum of Association, delegate any of its powers as to the administration of any advowsons and rights of patronage, nomination and presentation and the exercise of any rights in respect thereof and the management of the Board's business in relation thereto and the determination of all questions in regard thereto and as to the acquisition of and disposal (but as to disposal not without the consent in writing of the Bishop) of any such advowsons and rights to any such courcil or committee as aforesaid.

27. Without prejudice to and in extension of the powers mentioned in the last preceding clause, the Board shall have power subject to any provisions contained in any instrument creating special trusts, to delegate the whole or any of the powers of management vested in the Board over the property subject to such trusts to Managers hereinafter called "Administrative Trustees" (the majority of whom shall be members of the Board) appointed in such manner as may be provided in that instrument, or if such instrument contains no provision as to the appointment of Administrative Trustees, appointed in such manner and for such period as the Board shall think fit, and where the Board delegates the management of any property to Administrative Trustees, it shall be incumbent on the latter so long as they remain Administrative Trustees to the satisfaction of the Board to pay and discharge any rent or other outgoings, charges or payments in respect of any property the subject of the trust, and to maintain, repair and execute any improvements that may be requisite to any such property, and to insure the same against loss or damage by fire, and to defray the costs and expenses including fees paid to surveyors or agents incurred by them in so doing, and in ascertaining that what is required has been done out of the income coming to their hands of the trust property, and, on their failure so to do, or on the Board being dissatisfied with their action in the matter,

it shall be lawful for the Board to revoke such delegation, and such delegation may also be revoked on the request of not less than two-thirds of the Administrative Trustees.

- 28. The Board shall in each year prepare an annual report for submission to the Annual Meeting, and shall present the same to the Diocesan Conference, together with a duly audited statement of accounts, and shall also submit to the Diocesan Conference an estimate of necessary Diocesan expenditure for the ensuing year. It shall be part of the work of the Board to take such steps as may be deemed necessary, with the authority of the Diocesan Conference, to raise such money as may be required to meet the needs set forth in the aforesaid estimate.
- 29. The Board shall forthwith provide a Common Seal for the Board, and the said seal shall be used in relation to the business or affairs of the Board as any General Meeting of the Board shall decide, and any document bearing the seal of the Board and purporting to be attested by two members of the Board shall in the absence of proof to the contrary be deemed to be duly sealed by the Board.
- 30. Auditors shall be appointed and their duties regulated in accordance with Sections 112 and 113 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force, and for this purpose the said sections shall have effect as if the word "members" were substituted for "Shareholders," and as if "first General Meeting" were substituted for "Statutory Meeting."
- 31. All moneys received by the Board shall be regularly paid into a banking account or banking accounts to be kept in the name of the Board. All cheques on the said banking accounts shall be signed and countersigned as may from time to time be directed by the Board.
- 32. The accounts and books of account of the Board shall be kept at its registered office, and, subject to any reasonable restrictions as to the time and manner of inspecting the same that may be imposed by the Board in General Meeting, the same shall be open to inspection by the members of the Board at all times during the usual business hours.

- 33. The Board shall cause minutes to be made of the proceedings at any meeting of the Board, and shall at all times cause a register to be kept of the members with their respective last known places of abode, in accordance with Section 25 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act 1908.
- 34. A notice may be served by the Board on any member, either personally or by sending it through the post in a prepaid envelope or wrapper addressed to such member at his registered place of abode. All notices required by the Companies Acts 1908 to 1917 to be given by advertisement shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in the Diocese of Exeter, and shall be deemed sufficient if so advertised, and where a notice is sent by post service of the notice shall be deemed to be effected by properly addressing, prepaying and posting a letter containing the notice, and (unless the contrary is proved) to have been effected at the time at which the letter would be delivered in the ordinary course of post.

Articles of Association

OF

The Exeter Diocesan Board of Finance Limited

(Adopted by Special Resolution passed on the 13th day of February 1971)

INTERPRETATION

1. In these Articles:—

Q)

0

- "the Act" means the Companies Act of 1948.
- "the seal" means the common seal of the Board.
- "secretary" means any person appointed to perform the duties of the secretary of the Board.
- "the United Kingdom" means Great Britain and Northern Ireland.
- "the Diocese" means whatever for the time being shall be the area of the Diocese called the Diocese of Exeter.
- "the Board" means the Exeter Diocesan Board of Finance Limited.
- "the Diocesan Synod" shall mean the Diocesan Synod for the time being of the Diocese.
- Expressions referring to writing shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be construed as including reference to printing, lithography, photography, and other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form.
- Unless the context otherwise requires, words or expressions used in these Articles shall bear the same meanings as in the Act.
- 2. For the purpose of registration the number of members is declared not to exceed 150. The Board may from time to time register an increase in the number of its members whenever the Diocesan Synod may consider it necessary to do so.

MEMBERS OF THE BOARD

- 3. Subject to Article 2 the following persons shall be qualified to be members of the Board:—
 - (A) The Lord Bishop of the Diocese for the time being (hereinafter referred to as "the Bishop") who shall be ex-officio president and a member of the Board and the Archdeacons for the time being of the Archdeaconries of the Diocese of Exeter.

- (B) Twelve members of the house of Clergy of the Diocesan Synod three members being elected by the representatives of each Archdeaconry which shall constitute separate electoral areas for this purpose.
- (c) Twenty-three lay members being one from each Deanery Synod in the Diocese elected from amongst the members elected by that Synod to the Diocesan Synod.
- (D) Not more than four other persons to be nominated by the Bishop in writing under his hand communicated to the Board.
- (E) Not more than three other persons co-opted by the Board provided always that not less than three-fourths of the total members of the Board shall be elected by the Diocesan or Deanery Synods and not less than two-thirds of such elected or appointed persons shall be members of the Diocesan Synod and a majority of the members of the Board shall be laymen.
- (F) Any member of the Board shall be eligible to be reelected or re-co-opted. No person shall be elected,
 co-opted, or nominated as a member of the Board who is
 not a communicant member of the Church of England,
 but so that any person elected, co-opted or nominated to
 membership in accordance with these Articles shall be
 deemed to have been duly elected, co-opted or nominated
 unless and until a certificate under the hand of the Bishop
 for the time being of the Diocese shall have been left at
 the registered office of the Board addressed to the
 Secretary thereof to the effect that to the best of the
 belief of the said Bishop such person is not a communicant
 member of the Church of England and such certificate
 shall as from the date of its being so left operate to effect
 the removal from membership of the person to whom it
 applies.
- 4. Any casual vacancy in the number of the elected or co-opted members of the Board may be filled by the Board in General Meeting but the person nominated to fill the vacancy shall continue a member only for the residue of the period for which the person whose place he is to take was elected or co-opted.
- 5. Every person qualified to be a member of the Board shall become a member upon giving a written consent to become a member.
- 6. The Diocesan Synod shall have power by resolution to direct and from time to time to alter the mode in which members of the Board to be elected by the Diocesan Synod shall be elected and a certificate of the result of such election, signed or purporting to be signed by the person who is or appears to be the Secretary for the time being of the Diocesan Synod and delivered to the Secretary of the Board, shall be sufficient evidence of such result and of the validity of the election.
- 7. Membership of the Board shall cease and determine in manner following, that is to say: As to ex-officio members, upon death, resignation or ceasing to hold their respective offices, and as to any other member upon his death, or resignation or removal

pursuant to Article 3 or upon the expiration of the period for which he was appointed, and any member may resign his membership at any time by giving to the Secretary of the Board at least seven days' notice in writing of his intention to resign at the date stated in such notice.

8. Every member of the Board other than an ex-officio member, shall be eligible for re-election or re-co-option, as the case may be and shall, except in the case of death or resignation, continue to be a member until his successor is elected or co-opted.

GENERAL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD

- 9. The Board shall in each year hold a general meeting as its annual general meeting in addition to any other meetings in that year, and shall specify the neeting as such in the notices calling it: and not more than fifteen months shall clapse between the date of one annual general meeting of the Board and that of the next.
- 10. All general meetings other than the annual general meetings shall be called extraordinary general meetings.
- 11. The Board may, whenever it thinks fit, convene an extraordinary general meeting and extraordinary general meetings shall also be convened on such requisition, or in default, may be convened by such requisitionists, as provided by Section 132 of the Act.

NOTICE OF GENERAL MEETINGS

12. An annual general meeting and a meeting called for the passing of a special resolution shall be called by twenty-one days' notice in writing at the least, and a meeting of the Board other than an annual general meeting or a meeting for the passing of a special resolution shall be called by fourteen days' notice in writing at the least. The notice shall be exclusive of the day on which it is served or deemed to be served, and of the day for which it is given, and shall specify the place, the day and the hour of the meeting, and in case of special business, the general nature of that business, and shall be given, in manner hereinafter mentioned, or in such manner, if any, as may be prescribed by the Board in general meeting, to such persons (including the Auditors) as are, under the Articles of the Board or the Act, entitled to receive such notices from the Board.

Provided that a meeting of the Board shall, notwithstanding that it is called by shorter notice than that specified in this Article be deemed to have been duly called if it is so agreed—

- (A) in the case of a meeting called as the annual general meeting by all members entitled to attend and vote thereat; and
- (B) in the case of any other meeting, by a majority in number of the members having a right to attend and vote at the meeting, being a majority together representing not less than ninety-five per cent of the total voting rights at that meeting of all the members.
- 13. The accidental omission to give notice of a meeting to, or the non-receipt of notice of a meeting, by any person entitled to receive notice shall not invalidate the proceedings at that meeting.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

- 14. All business shall be deemed special that is transacted at an extraordinary general meeting, and also all that is transacted at an annual general meeting, with the exception of the consideration of the accounts and balance sheet and the reports of the Executive Committee and Auditors, and the appointment of, and the fixing of the remuneration of, the Auditors.
- 15. No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless a quorum of members of the Board is present at the time when the meeting proceeds to business; save as herein otherwise provided, seven members present in person shall be a quorum.
- 16. If within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of members of the Board shall be dissolved; in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week, at the same time and place or to such other day and at such other time and place as the Chairman may determine, and if at the adjourned meeting a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the members present shall be a quorum.
- 17. At the first general meeting of the Board following the adoption of these Articles, and subsequently at the next general meeting after each triennial election of the Diocesan Synod a member of the Board shall be elected Chairman, and each Chairman so elected shall hold office until the next general meeting at which an election takes place. During his term of office the Chairman shall preside as Chairman at every general meeting of the Board, subject to the provisions of Article 18 hereof. In the event of the death or permanent mental or physical incapacitation of the Chairman, or if the Chairman shall notify the Board in writing of his wish to resign from such post, the Board may at its next general meeting elect a temporary Chairman who shall hold office until the end of the term of office of the deceased or outgoing Chairman. A retiring Chairman may offer himself for re-election.
- 18. If there is no such Chairman, or if he shall not be present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for the holding of the meeting or is unwilling to act the members present shall elect one of their number to be Chairman of the meeting.
- 19. The Chairman, may with the consent of any meeting at which a quorum is present (and shall if so directed by the meeting) adjourn the meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place. When a meeting is adjourned for thirty days or more, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given as in the case of an original meeting shall be given as in the case of an original meeting. Save as aforesaid, it shall not be necessary to give any notice of an adjournment or of the business to be transacted at an adjourned meeting.
- 20. At any general meeting a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands) demanded—
 - (A) by the Chairman: or
 - (B) by at least three members of the Board present in person.

Unless a poll be so demanded a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has on a show of hands been carried or carried unanimously or by a particular majority, or lost or not carried by a particular majority and an entry to that effect in the book containing the minutes of proceedings of the Board shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution. The demand for a poll may be withdrawn.

- 21. Except as provided in Article 23 if a poll is duly demanded it shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman directs, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded.
- 22. In the case of an equality of votes, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, the Chairman of the meeting at which the show of hands takes place or at which the poll is demanded, shall be entitled to a second or casting vote.
- 23. A poll demanded on the election of a Chairman, or on a question of adjournment, shall be taken forthwith. A poll demanded on any other question shall be taken at such time as the Chairman of the meeting directs, and any business other than that upon which a poll has been demanded may be proceeded with pending the taking of the poll.
- 24. Subject to the provisions of the Act (including the provisions relating to special and extraordinary resolutions) a resolution in writing signed by all the members of the Board, for the time being entitled to receive notice of and to attend and vote thereon in general meeting shall be as valid and effective as if the same had been passed at a general meeting of the Board duly convened and held.

VOTES OF MEMBERS OF THE BOARD

25. Except as provided in Article 22 every member of the Board entitled to vote shall have one vote and one vote only, and votes shall in all cases be given personally and not by proxy.

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 26. The business of the Board shall be managed by an Executive Committee. Unless and until otherwise determined by the Board in general meeting the Executive Committee shall consist of all the members of the Board and all the members thereof shall be Directors for all the purposes of the Act.
- 27. The Chairman of the Board shall be Chairman of the Executive Committee.
- 28. If the Board shall reduce the number of the members of the Executive Committee below the number of the members of the Board it shall at its next meeting and subsequently at its first meeting after each triennial election of the Diocesan Synod elect the members of the Executive Committee provided that every member thereof shall be a member of the Board and that the ex-officio members of the Board shall remain in office as members of the Executive Committee.

29. A retiring member shall be eligible for re-election.

- 30. The Board shall have power, at any time and from time to time, to appoint any member of the Board to be a member of the Executive Committee to fill a casual vacancy. Any member so appointed shall hold office only until the next triennial elections of the Diocesan Synod and shall then be eligible for re-election.
- 31. The Board may by ordinary resolution of which special notice has been given in accordance with Section 142 of the Act, remove any member of the Executive Committee before the expiration of his period of office notwithstanding anything in these Articles or in any agreement between the Board and such member.

DISQUALIFICATION OF MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 32. A member of the Executive Committee shall vacate his office if he:—
 - (A) becomes bankrupt or makes any arrangement or composition with his creditors generally; or
 - (B) becomes prohibited from being a Director by reason of any order made under Section 188 of the Act; or
 - (c) becomes of unsound mind; or
 - (D) resigns his office by notice in writing to the Board; or
 - (E) ceases for any cause to be a member of the Board; or
 - (F) is directly or indirectly interested in any contract with the Board and fails to declare the nature of his interest in manner required by Section 199 of the Act.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 33. The business of the Board shall be managed by the Executive Committee acting, save as provided in Article 34 under the directions of the Board in general meeting. It may pay all expenses incurred by the Board, and may exercise all such powers of the Board (including the power to appoint and at its discretion remove or suspend all officers, clerks, agents and servants of the Board) as are not, by the Act or by these Articles, required to be exercised by the Board in general meeting, subject nevertheless to the provisions of the Act and these Articles and to such regulations or directions being not inconsistent with the aforesaid provisions, as may be prescribed or given by the Board in general meeting: but no regulation or direction made or given by the Board in general meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Executive Committee which would have been valid if that regulation had not been made.
- 34. The Executive Committee shall also be the Governing Body within the meaning of and for the purposes of Clause 4 of the Memorandum of Association. It shall be soiely responsible for making and recommending all such grants, payments or remunerations as are referred to in the said Clause in consultation with, and with the advice of, the Board in general meeting or of such subcommittee as may from time to time be established for the purpose of advising on such matters pursuant to Article 42.
- 35. All cheques, promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange and other negotiable instruments and all receipts for moneys paid to the Board shall be signed, drawn, accepted, endorsed, or otherwise executed as the case may be, in such manner as the Executive Committee shall from time to time by resolution determine.

- 36. The Executive Committee shall cause minutes to be made in books provided for the purpose—
 - (A) of all appointments of officers made by the Executive Committee;
 - (B) of the names of the members of the Executive Committee present at each meeting of the said Committee and of any sub-committee of the said Committee;
 - (c) of all resolutions and proceedings at all meetings of the Board and of the Executive Committee and of subcommittees of the said Committee.
- 37. Every member of the Executive Committee present at any meeting of the said Committee or sub-committee of the said Committee shall sign his name in a book to be kept for that purpose.

BORROWING POWERS

38. The Executive Committee may exercise all the powers of the Board, to borrow money, and to mortgage or charge its undertaking and property, or any part thereof, and to issue debentures, debenture stock and other securities, whether outright or as security for any debt, liability or obligation of the Board or of any third party.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 39. The members of the Executive Committee may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings, as they think fit. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In the case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote. A member may, and the Secretary on the requisition of a member shall, at any time summon a meeting of the Executive Committee. It shall not be necessary to give notice of a meeting of the Committee to any member thereof for the time being absent from the United Kingdom.
- 40. The quorum necessary for the transaction of the business of the Executive Committee may be fixed by the Committee, and unless so fixed shall be seven.
- 41. Unless the Board otherwise determines the Chairman of the Board shall be Chairman of the Executive Committee, If at any meeting the Chairman is not present within five minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, the members of the said Committee present may choose one of their number to be Chairman of the meeting.
- 42. The Executive Committee may delegate any of its powers to sub-committees (or appoint sub-committees to report and advise on any matters referred to them) consisting of such of its members as it thinks fit: any sub-committee so formed shall in the exercise of any powers so delegated conform to any regulations that may be imposed on it by the Executive Committee. Nothing in these Articles shall be construed so as to preclude the Board from appointing from amongst the members of the Board such other sub-committees for such purposes as it may so determine.

- 43. A sub-committee may elect a Chairman of its meetings; if no such Chairman is elected, or if at any meeting the Chairman is not present within five minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, the members of the sub-committee present may choose one of their number to be Chairman of the meeting.
- 44. A sub-committee may meet and adjourn as it thinks proper. Questions arising at any meeting shall be determined by a majority of votes of the members of the sub-committee present, and in the case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
- 45. Al' acts done by any meeting of the Executive Committee or of a sub-committee of the Executive Committee, or by any person acting as a member of the Executive Committee shall notwith-standing that it be afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of any such member or person acting as aforesaid, or that they or any of them were disqualified, be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed and was qualified to be such a member.
- 46. A resolution in writing, signed by all the members of the Executive Committee for the time being entitled to receive notice of a meeting of the said Committee shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the said Committee duly convened and held.

AGE LIMIT

47. No member of the Board shall vacate or be required to vacate his office on or by reason of his attaining or having attained the age of 70 or any other age, and any such member retiring or liable to retire under the provisions of these Articles and any person proposed to be appointed shall be capable of being reappointed or appointed as the case may be, as a member thereof, notwithstanding that at the time of such re-appointment or appointment he has attained the age of 70 or any other age, and no special notice need be given of any resolution for the re-appointment or appointment or approving the appointment as a member of a person who shall have attained the age of 70 or any other age.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD

48. The Board may from time to time appoint committees, make, vary and repeal regulations, standing orders and bye-laws for the regulation and conduct of the business and affairs of the Board, its officers, servants and the members of any section thereof, but so that such regulations, standing orders and bye-laws shall not be inconsistent with the provisions or regulations contained in the Memorandum and Articles of Association, or amount to such an addition to or alteration of the Articles of Association, as could only legally be made by special resolution. Provided that in case there shall at any time be any conflict between the Articles of Association and the standing orders and bye-laws the provisions of the Articles of Association shall prevail.

SECRETARY

49. The Secretary shall be appointed by the Executive Committee for such term at such remuneration, and upon such conditions as the Board shall in general meeting determine, and any Secretary so appointed may be similarly removed.

50. A provision of the Act or these Articles requiring or authorising a thing to be done by or to a member of the Executive Committee and the Secretary shall not be satisfied by its being done by or to the same person acting both as a member of the Executive Committee and as, or in the place of, the Secretary.

THE SEAL

51. The Executive Committee shall provide for the safe custody of the seal, which shall only be used by the Authority of the said Committee and every instrument to which the seal shall be affixed shall be signed by two members of the Executive Committee and shall be countersigned by the Secretary. A record of every occasion upon which the seal is used shall be kept by the Secretary.

ACCOUNTS

- 52. The Executive Committee shall cause proper books of account to be kept with respect to:—
 - (A) all sums of money received and expended by the Board and the matters in respect of which the receipts and expenditure take place;
 - (B) all sales and purchases of goods by the Board; and
 - (C) the assets and liabilities of the Board.

Proper books shall not be deemed to be kept if there are not kept such books of account as are necessary to give a true and fair view of the state of the Board's affairs and to explain its transactions.

- 53. The books of account shall be kept at the registered office of the Board, or subject to Section 147 (3) of the Act, at such other place or places as the Executive Committee think fit, and shall always be open to the inspection of the members of the Executive Committee.
- 54. Subject to any reasonable conditions or regulations as to the time and manner of inspecting the same that may from time to time be imposed by the Board in general meeting the accounts and books of the Board shall be open to the inspection of members of the Board at all reasonable times during business hours.
- 55. The Executive Committee shall from time to time in accordance with Sections 148, 150 and 157 of the Act, cause to be prepared and to be laid before the Board in general meeting such profit and loss accounts, balance sheets, and reports as are referred to in those Sections, and copies of the same shall be presented to the Diocesan Synod.
- 56. A copy of every balance sheet (including every document required by law to be annexed thereto) which is to be laid before the Board in general meeting, together with a copy of the Auditors report, shall not less than twenty-one clear days before the date of the meeting be sent to every member of, and every holder of debentures of, the Board. Provided that this Article shall not require a copy of those documents to be sent to any person of whose address the Board is not aware or to more than one of the joint holders of any debentures.

AUDIT

57. Auditors shall be appointed and their duties regulated in accordance with Sections 159 to 162 of the Act.

NOTICES

- 58. A notice may be given by the Board to any member thereof either personally or by sending it by post addressed to him at his registered address, or (if he has no registered address within the United Kingdom) at the address, if any, within the United Kingdom supplied by him to the Board for the giving of notices to him. Where a notice is sent by post, service of the notice shall be deemed to be effected by properly addressing, prepaying and posting a letter containing the notice, and to have been effected at the expiration of 24 hours after the letter containing the same is posted.
- 59. Notice of every general meeting shall be given in any manner hereinbefore authorised to the Auditors and to every member of the Board except those members who (having no registered address within the United Kingdom) have not supplied to the Board an address within the United Kingdom for the giving of notices to them.
- 60. No other person shall be entitled to receive notices of general meetings.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 61. No alteration or variation shall be made in these Articles of Association without the consent of the Diocesan Synod given by resolution.
- 62. A resolution of the Diocesan Synod shall be treated by the Board as sufficiently proved if a copy or what purports to be a copy thereof is delivered to the Secretary of the Board signed or purporting to be signed by the person who is or appears to be Secretary of the Diocesan Synod for the time being.

WINDING-UP

63. The provisions of Clause 7 of the Memorandum of Association relating to the winding-up and dissolution of the Board shall have effect as if the same were repeated in these Articles.

Provided that:—
 - (i) nothing herein contained shall prevent the payment in good faith of reasonable and proper remuneration to any officer or servant of the Board or to any member of the Board in return for any services actually rendered to the Board; nor prevent the payment interest at a rate not exceeding 8 per cent per annum on money lent or reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let by any member to the Board;
 - (ii) no member of the Governing Body of the Board shall be appointed to any salaried office of the Board or any office of the Board paid by fees, and that no remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth shall be given by the Board to any member of such Governing Body except re-payment of out-of-pocket expenses and interest at the rate aforesaid on money lent or reasonable and proper rent or premises demised or let to the Board and except as provided by paragraph (iv) hereof;
 - (iii) if any member of the Board has any pecuniary interest, direct indirect in any proposal laid before the Board or its Governing Body or other matter relative thereto and is present at a meeting of the Board or its Governing Body at which the proposal or other matter relative thereto is the subject of consideration, he shall at meeting, as soon as practicable after the commencement ther disclose the fact, and shall not take part in the consideration discussion of, or vote on any question with respect to the properties or other matter relative thereto;
 - (iv) nothing herein contained shall prevent the Clerical members of the Board from being present, from taking part in any discussion from voting on the payment or provision made in good fait grants, pensions and benefits by way of maintenance or other way (a. 28 A 1973)

in accordance with these provisions, to or for the benefit of any class of clergy of the Church of England which includes or may include members of the Board or its Governing Body;

- (v) the provisions hereinbefore contained shall not apply to any payment to any company of which a member of the Governing Body may be a member, and in which such member shall not hold more than one hundredth part of the capital, and such member shall not be bound to account for any share of profits he may receive in respect of any such payment.
- (3) By the deletion of Clauses 5 and 6 and by the re-numbering of Clauses 7, 8, 9 and 10 so that they shall read Clauses 5, 6, 7 and 8."

"That the Articles of Association of The Exeter Diocesan Board of Finance Limited be and are hereby rescinded and that the new Articles of Association numbered 1 to 63 contained in the printed document submitted to this Meeting and for purpose of identification signed by the Chairman of the said Board be and are hereby substituted therefor and that for the purposes of identification a copy of such new Articles shall be attached to the Minute Book and certified in writing by the Chairman of the said Board as being a true copy thereof."

Memorandum of Association

OF

The Exeter Diocesan Board of Finance Limited

(as altered by Special Resolution passed on the 13th day of February 1971)

- 1. The name of the Association (in this Memorandum for brevity called "the Board") is "THE EXETER DIOCESAN BOARD OF FINANCE." IMITED"
 - 2. The registered office of the Board will be situate in England.
- 3. The objects for which the Board is established are as follows (that is to say)—To do all or any of the following things for the purpose of attaining the ends of the Board, if and so far as allowed by law, and subject to the observance and performance of whatever may be required by law in order legally to carry out the same:—
 - (A) To promote and assist the work and purposes of the Church of England in the Diocese of Exeter whatever for the time being shall be the area of the Diocese called the Diocese of Exeter or called by any name which shall hereafter be substituted for the present name of the Diocese (which Diocese, by whatever name the same may be called, is hereinafter referred to as "the Diocese of Exeter") and in particular to organise and provide funds in aid of the work of the Church and for the following essential departments of the Church's work, viz.:—
 - I. Training for the Ministry, Clerical and Lay.
 - II. Maintenance of the Ministry, Clerical and Lay, including the securing sites for and the erection, repair and upkeep of parsonage houses and clergy houses.
 - III. Provisions of pensions for the Ministry.
 - IV. Provisions for Widows and Orphans of the Clergy and for necessitous Clergy and their wives and children.
 - v. Securing desirable sites for and the erection and repair of Churches, Chapels, Church buildings, mission rooms, Church halls, hostels and other buildings, whether temporary or otherwise to be used for or in connection with any of the objects of the Board.

- vi. Religious education in all its branches, including the acquisition of buildings and of sites for and the building, equipment, improvement and repair of Church of England Schools and Colleges.
- vii. Provision of expenses of Diocesan and central organisation.

With such additions to and modifications of the departments aforesaid as from time to time may be expedient for the better carrying forward of the Church's work, and to aid and further (in such manner as may be approved by a resolution of the Diocesan Conference or Synod of the Diocese of Exeter and afterwards sanctioned by the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese) the objects and work of the Church of England in any part of England and Wales outside the said Diocese or beyond the borders of England and Wales, or any Mission or Church or body of Christians in communion therewith beyond such borders.

- (B) To raise, expend, invest and accumulate funds and income for the purposes aforesaid, and from time to time to determine or assist in determining the proportions in which such funds ought to be contributed in the several Rural Deaneries of the Diocese and in the several Parishes of each Rural Deanery.
- (c) To enter into agreements with associations in connection with the Church of England carrying out in the Diocese of Exeter or elsewhere within the borders of England and Wales any objects similar to any of the objects of this Board and to delegate any of its powers as may from time to time be provided by the Articles of Association.
- (D) To enter into any arrangements with the several diocesan bodies or societies of the said Diocese known as the Exeter Diocesan Trust, or any other body having power to administer or apply any funds within the Diocese of Exeter or any part thereof (whether as part of a larger area or not) for any of the purposes for which the Board has power to administer or apply funds with reference to any of the funds or property held by them respectively, or any of their powers, duties or trusts, and in particular on the request of any such body as aforesaid to take over, carry on or continue any of its powers, duties or trusts.
- (E) To make grants or donations or annual payments to any association or body having any objects in connection with the Church of England similar to any of those of the Board and whether in the Diocese of Exeter or elsewhere within the borders of England and Wales.
- (F) To pay officers, clerks and servants of the Board, to make payments for insurance on their behalf, and to make provision for any person or the widow of any person who has been in the employment of the Board.
- (G) To raise and borrow money at interest or otherwise for the purposes of the Board on such terms and on such security (if any) as may be determined, and in particular by an issue of debentures or debenture stock, redeemable or otherwise, and to act as guarantors in respect of the raising of money for the advancement of any of the objects of the Board.

- (H) To promote or oppose or join in promoting or opposing legislative and other measures affecting or likely to affect any of the objects or work of the Board, or any body of persons, the aid or benefit of which is within the objects of the Board.
- (1) To acquire and sell and dispose of houses and land of any tenure (subject to the provisions of Section 29 of the Charities Act 1960), either in the name of the Board or in the name or names of a Trustee or Trustees for the Board.
- (J) To acquire by any means whatsoever and hold and administer advowsons, rights of patronage, nomination and presentation of and to Churches, chapels and benefices, and as and when occasion shall arise, to exercise all rights of whatsoever nature belonging or incident to such advowsons, rights of patronage, nomination and presentation in such manner as the Board may determine, with power to delegate the exercise of any such right or any such determination to any council or committee of whom the majority shall be members of the Board or to any members or member of the Board, whether generally or in any particular case or class of cases; and (but not without the consent in writing of the Bishop of the Diocese) to dispose of in any manner whatsoever all or any of such advowsons or rights of patronage, nomination and presentation.
- (K) To take over or co-operate with or make grants to any organisation other than those hereinbefore mentioned or referred to carrying on any work connected with the Church of England in the said Diocese or any part thereof.
- (L) To act as the executors of any deceased person, and to accept property of any kind and in any form, whether real or personal, to be held by the Board either alone or jointly with another or others upon any trusts, whether already existing or newly created, connected with the Church of England, but subject as to land to the provisions of Section 19 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908.
- (M) To apply, if the Board shall by Special resolution so decide, for a Royal Charter incorporating an association having objects similar to those of the present Board, and upon such incorporation to transfer and commit the property, work and objects of the present Board to the body incorporated by such Royal Charter.

(N) In the event of a partition or alteration of the boundaries of the Diocese of Exeter as at present existing, to appropriate such part as the Board shall think fit of the property held for the general purposes of the Board to similar purposes within the area by such partition or alteration separated from the Diocese of Exeter as at present existing, and to make over such appropriated part to any Diocesan Board of the Diocese in which the area so separated is comprised as Trustee, or to any such trustees as the Board shall think fit, and to declare the trusts of the property so made over: Provided that the trusts to be so declared shall, as far as may be, be of the same character, except as regards the area for which they are to be administered and the body to administer the same, as the trusts and provisions applicable thereto under these presents. And as to any property held on special trusts affecting any

area so separated as aforesaid or any part thereof, to deal with the same (so far as the law allows) in a corresponding manner.

- (o) To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects: Provided that the Board shall not support with its funds any object or endeavour to impose on or procure to be observed by its members or others any regulation, restriction or condition which, if an object of the Board, would make it a trade union: Provided also that in case the Board shall take or hold any property subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Education or Charity Commissioners for England and Wales the Board shall not sell, mortgage, charge or lease the same without such authority, approval or consent as may be required by law, and as regards any such property the members or trustees of the Board shall be chargeable for such property as may come into their hands, and shall be answerable and accountable for their own acts, receipts, neglects and defaults and for the due administration of such property in the same manner and to the same extent as they would as such members or trustees have been if no incorporation had been effected, and the incorporation of the Board shall not diminish or impair any control or authority exercisable by the Chancery Division, the Board of Education or the Charity Commissioners over such members or trustees but they shall as regards any such property be subject jointly and separately to such control and authority as if the Board were not incorporated. In case the Board shall take or hold any property which may be subject to any trusts, the Board shall only deal with the same in such a manner as allowed by law having regard to such trusts.
- 4. The income and property of the Board whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Board as set forth in this Memorandum of Association and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise howsoever by way of profit to the members of the Board or to any of them. Provided that:—

- (v) the provisions hereinbefore contained shall not apply to any payment to any company of which a member of the Governing Body may be a member, and in which such member shall not hold more than one hundredth part of the capital, and such member shall not be bound to account for any share of profits he may receive in respect of any such payment.
 - 5. The liability of the members is limited.
- 6. Every member of the Board undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Board in the event of the same being wound up during the time that he is a member, or within one year afterwards, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Board contracted before the time at which he ceased to be a member, and of the costs charges and expenses of winding up the same, and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributories amongst themselves, such amount as may be required not exceeding £1.
- 7. If, upon the winding up or dissolution of the Board, there remains, after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Board, but if and so far as effect can be given to the next provision, shall be given or transferred to some other institution or institutions having objects similar or cognate to the objects of the Board, and which shall prohibit the distribution of its or their income and property amongst its or their members to an extent at least as great as is imposed on the Board under or by virtue of Clause 4 hereof, such institution or institutions to be determined by the members of the Board at or before the time of dissolution, or in default thereof by such judge of the High Court of Justice as may have or acquire jurisdiction in the matter, and if and so far as effect cannot be given to such provision, then to some charitable object in connection with the Church of England.
- 8. True accounts shall be kept of the sums of money received and expended by the Board, and the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the property, credits and liabilities of the Board, and subject to any reasonable restrictions as to the time and manner of inspecting the same that may be imposed in accordance with the regulations of the Board for the time being, they shall be open to the inspection of the members. Once at least in every year the accounts of the Board shall be examined and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more properly qualified auditor or auditors.



(Adopted by Special Resolution passed on the 13th day of February 1971 and altered by Special Resolution passed on the 26th January, 1974).

INTERPRETATION

- 1. In these Articles:—
 - "the Act" means the Companies Act of 1948...
 - "the seal" means the common seal of the Board.
 - "secretary" means any person appointed to perform the duties of the secretary of the Board.
 - "the United Kingdom" means Great Britain and Northern Ireland.
 - "the Diocese" means whatever for the time being shall be the area of the Diocese called the Diocese of Exeter.
 - "the Board" means the Exeter Diocesan Board of Finance Limited.
 - "the Diocesan Synod" shall mean the Diocesan Synod for the time being of the Diocese.
 - Expressions referring to writing shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be construed as including reference to printing, lithography, photography, and other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form.
 - Unless the context otherwise requires, words or expressions used in these Articles shall bear the same meanings as in the Act.
- 2. For the purpose of registration the number of members is declared not to exceed 150. The Board may from time to time register an increase in the number of its members whenever the Diocesan Synod may consider it necessary to do so.

MEMBERS OF THE BOARD

- 3. Subject to Article 2 the following persons shall be qualified to be members of the Board:—
 - (A) The Lord Bishop of the Diocese for the time being (hereinafter referred to as "the Bishop") who shall be ex-officio president and a member of the Board and the Archdeacons for the time being of the Archdeaconries of the Diocese of Exeter.





(B) Twelve members of the house of Clergy of the Dioceian Synod three members being elected by the representatives of each Archdeaconry which shall constitute separate electoral areas for this purpose.

(C) Twenty-three lay members being one from each Deanery Synod in the diocese elected from amongst the elected and co-opted members of that Synod.

- (D) Not more than four other persons to be nominated by the Bishop in writing under his hand communicated to the Board.
- (E) Not more than three other persons co-opted by the Board provided always that not less than three-fourths of the total members of the Board shall be elected by the Diocesan or Deanery Synods and not less than two-thirds of such elected or appointed persons shall be members of the Diocesan Synod and a majority of the members of the Board shall be laymen.
- (F) Any member of the Board shall be eligible to be reelected or re-co-opted. No person shall be elected, co-opted, or nominated as a member of the Board who is not a communicant member of the Church of England, but so that any person elected, co-opted or nominated to membership in accordance with these Articles shall be deemed to have been duly elected, co-opted or nominated unless and until a certificate under the hand of the Bishop for the time being of the Diocese shall have been left at the registered office of the Board addressed to the Secretary thereof to the effect that to the best of the belief of the said Bishop such person is not a communicant member of the Church of England and such certificate shall as from the date of its being so left operate to effect the removal from membership of the person to whom it applies.
- 4. Any casual vacancy in the number of the elected or co-opted members of the Board may be filled by the Board in General Meeting but the person nominated to fill the vacancy shall continue a member only for the residue of the period for which the person whose place he is to take was elected or co-opted.
- 5. Every person qualified to be a member of the Board shall become a member upon giving a written consent to become a member.

- 6. The Diocesan Synod shall have power by resolution to direct and from time to time to alter the mode in which members of the Board to be elected by the Diocesan Synod shall be elected and a certificate of the result of such election, signed or purporting to be signed by the person who is or appears to be the Secretary for the time being of the Diocesan Synod and delivered to the Secretary of the Board, shall be sufficient evidence of such result and of the validity of the election.
- 7. Membership of the Board shall cease and determine in manner following, that is to say: As to ex-officio members upon death, resignation or ceasing to hold their respective offices, and as to any other member upon his death, or resignation or removal

pursuant to Article 3 or upon the expiration of the period for which he was appointed, and any member may resign his membership at any time by giving to the Secretary of the Board at least seven days' notice in writing of his intention to resign at the date stated in such notice.

8. Every member of the Bornd other than an ex-officio member, shall be eligible for re-election or re-co-option, as the case may be and shall, except in the case of death or resignation, continue to be a member until his successor is elected or co-opted.

GENERAL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD

- 9. The Board shall in each year hold a general meeting as its annual general meeting in addition to any other meetings in that year, and shall specify the meeting as such in the notices calling it: and not more than fifteen months shall elapse between the date of one annual general meeting of the Board and that of the next.
- 10. All general meetings other than the annual general meetings shall be called extraordinary general meetings.
- 11. The Board may, whenever it thinks fit, convene an extraordinary general meeting and extraordinary general meetings shall also be convened on such requisition, or in default, may be convened by such requisitionists, as provided by Section 132 of the Act.

NOTICE OF GENERAL MEETINGS

12. An annual general meeting and a meeting called for the passing of a special resolution shall be called by twenty-one days' notice in writing at the least, and a meeting of the Board other than an annual general meeting or a meeting for the passing of a special resolution shall be called by fourteen days' notice in writing at the least. The notice shall be exclusive of the day on which it is served or deemed to be served, and of the day for which it is given, and shall specify the place, the day and the hour of the meeting, and in case of special business, the general nature of that business, and shall be given, in manner hereinafter mentioned, or in such manner, if any, as may be prescribed by the Board in general meeting, to such persons (including the Auditors) as are, under the Articles of the Board or the Act, entitled to receive such notices from the Board.

Provided that a meeting of the Board shall, notwithstanding that it is called by shorter notice than that specified in this Article be deemed to have been duly called if it is so agreed—

- (A) in the case of a meeting called as the annual general meeting by all members entitled to attend and vote thereat; and
- (B) in the case of any other meeting, by a majority in number of the members having a right to attend and vote at the meeting, being a majority together representing not less than ninety-five per cent of the total voting rights at that meeting of all the members.
- 13. The accidental omission to give notice of a meeting to, or the non-receipt of notice of a meeting, by any person entitled to receive notice shall not invalidate the proceedings at that meeting.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

- 14. All business shall be deemed special that is transacted at an extraordinary general meeting, and also all that is transacted at an annual general meeting, with the exception of the consideration of the accounts and balance sheet and fire reports of the Executive Committee and Auditors, and the appointment of, and the fixing of the remuneration of, the Auditors.
- 15. No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless a quorum of members of the Board is present at the time when the meeting proceeds to business; save as herein otherwise provided, seven members present in person shall be a quorum.
- 16. If within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of members of the Board shall be dissolved; in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week, at the same time and place or to such other day and at such other time and place as the Chairman may determine, and if at the adjourned meeting a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the members present shall be a quorum.
- 17. At the first general meeting of the Board following the adoption of these Articles, and subsequently at the next general meeting after each triennial election of the Diocesan Synod a member of the Board shall be elected Chairman, and each Chairman so elected shall hold office until the next general meeting at which an election takes place. During his term of office the Chairman shall preside as Chairman at every general meeting of the Board, subject to the provisions of Article 18 hereof. In the event of the death or permanent mental or physical incapacitation of the Chairman, or if the Chairman shall notify the Board in writing of his wish to resign from such post, the Board may at its next general meeting elect a temporary Chairman who shall hold office until the end of the term of office of the deceased or outgoing Chairman. A retiring Chairman may offer himself for re-election.
- 18. If there is no such Chairman, or if he shall not be present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for the holding of the meeting or is unwilling to act the members present shall elect one of their number to be Chairman of the meeting.
- 19. The Chairman, may with the consent of any meeting at which a quorum is present (and shall if so directed by the meeting) adjourn the meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place. When a meeting is adjourned for thirty days or more, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given as in the case of an original meeting shall be given as in the case of an original meeting. Save as aforesaid, it shall not be necessary to give any notice of an adjournment or of the business to be transacted at an adjourned meeting.
- 20. At any general meeting a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands) demanded—
 - (A) by the Chairman: or

(B) by at least three members of the Board present in person.

Unless a poll be so demanded a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has on a show of hands been carried or carried unanimously or by a particular majority, or lost or not carried by a particular majority and an entry to that effect in the book containing the minutes of proceedings of the Board shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution. The demand for a poll may be withdrawn.

- 21. Except as provided in Article 23 if a poll is duly demanded it shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman directs, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded.
- 22. In the case of an equality of votes, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, the Chairman of the meeting at which the show of hands takes place or at which the poll is demanded, shall be entitled to a second or casting vote.
- 23. A poll demanded on the election of a Chairman, or on a question of adjournment, shall be taken forthwith. A poll demanded on any other question shall be taken at such time as the Chairman of the meeting directs, and any business other than that upon which a poll has been demanded may be proceeded with pending the taking of the poll.
- 24. Subject to the provisions of the Act (including the provisions relating to special and extraordinary resolutions) a resolution in writing signed by all the members of the Board, for the time being entitled to receive notice of and to attend and vote thereon in general meeting shall be as valid and effective as if the same had been passed at a general meeting of the Board duly convened and held.

· VOTES OF MEMBERS OF THE BOARD

25. Except as provided in Article 22 every member of the Board entitled to vote shall have one vote and one vote only, and votes shall in all cases be given personally and not by proxy.

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 26. The business of the Board shall be managed by an Executive Committee. Unless and until otherwise determined by the Board in general meeting the Executive Committee shall consist of all the members of the Board and all the members thereof shall be Directors for all the purposes of the Act.
- 27. The Chairman of the Board shall be Chairman of the Executive Committee.
- 28. If the Board shall reduce the number of the members of the Executive Committee below the number of the members of the Board it shall at its next meeting and subsequently at its first meeting after each triennial election of the Diocesan Synod elect the members of the Executive Committee provided that every member thereof shall be a member of the Board and that the ex-officio members of the Board shall remain in office as members of the Executive Committee.
 - 29. A retiring member shall be eligible for re-election.

- 30. The Board shall have power, at any time and from time to time, to appoint any member of the Board to be a member of the Executive Committee to fill a casual vacancy. Any member so appointed shall hold office only until the next triennial elections of the Diocesan Synod and shall then be eligible for re-election.
- 31. The Board may by ordinary resolution of which special notice has been given in accordance with Section 142 of the Act, remove any member of the Executive Committee before the expiration of his period of office notwithstanding anything in these Articles or in any agreement between the Board and such member.

DISQUALIFICATION OF MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 32. A member of the Executive Committee shall vacate his office if he:—
 - (A) becomes bankrupt or makes any arrangement or composition with his creditors generally; or
 - (B) becomes prohibited from being a Director by reason of any order made under Section 188 of the Act; or
 - (c) becomes of unsound mind; or
 - (D) resigns his office by notice in writing to the Board; or
 - (E) ceases for any cause to be a member of the Board; or
 - (F) is directly or indirectly interested in any contract with the Board and fails to declare the nature of his interest in manner required by Section 199 of the Act.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 33. The business of the Board shall be managed by the Executive Committee acting, save as provided in Article 34 under the directions of the Board in general meeting. It may pay all expenses incurred by the Board, and may exercise all such powers of the Board (including the power to appoint and at its discretion remove or suspend all officers, clerks, agents and servants of the Board) as are not, by the Act or by these Articles, required to be exercised by the Board in general meeting, subject nevertheless to the provisions of the Act and these Articles and to such regulations or directions being not inconsistent with the aforesaid provisions, as may be prescribed or given by the Board in general meeting: but no regulation or direction made or given by the Board in general meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Executive Committee which would have been valid if that regulation had not been made.
- 34. The Executive Committee shall also be the Governing Body within the meaning of and for the purposes of Clause 4 of the Memorandum of Association. It shall be soiely responsible for making and recommending all such grants, payments or remunerations as are referred to in the said Clause in consultation with, and with the advice of, the Board in general meeting or of such subcommittee as may from time to time be established for the purpose of advising on such matters pursuant to Article 42.
- 35. All cheques, promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange and other negotiable instruments and all receipts for moneys paid to the Board shall be signed, drawn, accepted, endorsed, or otherwise executed as the case may be, in such manner as the Executive Committee shall from time to time by resolution determine.

- 36. The Executive Committee shall cause minutes to be made in books provided for the purpose—
 - (A) of all appointments of officers made by the Executive Committee;

- (B) of the names of the members of the Executive Committee present at each meeting of the said Committee and of any sub-committee of the said Committee;
- (c) of all resolutions and proceedings at all meetings of the Board and of the Executive Committee and of subcommittees of the said Committee.
- 37. Every member of the Executive Committee present at any meeting of the said Committee or sub-committee of the said Committee shall sign his name in a book to be kept for that purpose.

BORROWING POWERS

38. The Executive Committee may exercise all the powers of the Board, to borrow money, and to mortgage or charge its undertaking and property, or any part thereof, and to issue debentures, debenture stock and other securities, whether outright or as security for any debt, liability or obligation of the Board or of any third party.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 39. The members of the Executive Committee may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings, as they think fit. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In the case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote. A member may, and the Secretary on the requisition of a member shall, at any time summon a meeting of the Executive Committee. It shall not be necessary to give notice of a meeting of the Committee to any member thereof for the time being absent from the United Kingdom.
- 40. The quorum necessary for the transaction of the business of the Executive Committee may be fixed by the Committee, and unless so fixed shall be seven.

- 41. Unless the Board otherwise determines the Chairman of the Board shall be Chairman of the Executive Committee. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present within five minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, the members of the said Committee present may choose one of their number to be Chairman of the meeting.
 - 42. The Executive Committee may delegate any of its powers to sub-committees (or appoint sub-committees to report and advise on any matters referred to them) consisting of such of its members as it thinks fit: any sub-committee so formed shall in the exercise of any powers so delegated conform to any regulations that may be imposed on it by the Executive Committee. Nothing in these Articles shall be construed so as to preclude the Board from appointing from amongst the members of the Board such other sub-committees for such purposes as it may so determine.

- 43. A sub-committee may elect a Chairman of its meetings; if no such Chairman is elected, or if at any meeting the Chairman is not present within five minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, the members of the sub-committee present may choose one of their number to be Chairman of the meeting.
- 44. A sub-committee may meet and adjourn as it thinks proper. Questions arising at any meeting shall be determined by a majority of votes of the members of the sub-committee present, and in the case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
- 45. All acts done by any meeting of the Executive Committee or of a sub-committee of the Executive Committee, or by any person acting as a member of the Executive Committee shall notwith-standing that it be afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of any such member or person acting as aforesaid, or that they or any of them were disqualified, be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed and was qualified to be such a member.
- 46. A resolution in writing, signed by all the members of the Executive Committee for the time being entitled to receive notice of a meeting of the said Committee shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the said Committee duly convened and held.

AGE LIMIT

47. No member of the Board shall vacate or be required to vacate his office on or by reason of his attaining or having attained the age of 70 or any other age, and any such member retiring or liable to retire under the provisions of these Articles and any person proposed to be appointed shall be capable of being reappointed or appointed as the case may be, as a member thereof, notwithstanding that at the time of such re-appointment or appointment he has attained the age of 70 or any other age, and no special notice need be given of any resolution for the re-appointment or appointment or approving the appointment as a member of a person who shall have attained the age of 70 or any other age.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD

48. The Board may from time to time appoint committees, make, vary and repeal regulations, standing orders and bye-laws for the regulation and conduct of the business and affairs of the Board, its officers, servants and the members of any section thereof, but so that such regulations, standing orders and bye-laws shall not be inconsistent with the provisions or regulations contained in the Memorandum and Articles of Association, or amount to such an addition to or alteration of the Articles of Association, as could only legally be made by special resolution. Provided that in case there shall at any time be any conflict between the Articles of Association and the standing orders and bye-laws the provisions of the Articles of Association shall prevail.

SECRETARY

49. The Secretary shall be appointed by the Executive Committee for such term at such remuneration, and upon such conditions as the Board shall in general meeting determine, and any Secretary so appointed may be similarly removed.

50. A provision of the Act or these Articles requiring or authorising a thing to be done by or to a member of the Executive Committee and the Secretary shall not be satisfied by its being done by or to the same person acting both as a member of the Executive Committee and as, or in the place of, the Secretary.

THE SEAL

51. The Executive Committee shall provide for the safe custody of the seal, which shall only be used by the Authority of the said Committee and every instrument to which the seal shall be affixed shall be signed by two members of the Executive Committee and shall be countersigned by the Secretary. A record of every occasion upon which the seal is used shall be kept by the Secretary.

ACCOUNTS

- 52. The Executive Committee shall cause proper books of account to be kept with respect to:—
 - (A) all sums of money received and expended by the Board and the matters in respect of which the receipts and expenditure take place;
 - (B) all sales and purchases of goods by the Board; and
 - (c) the assets and liabilities of the Board.

Proper books shall not be deemed to be kept if there are not kept such books of account as are necessary to give a true and fair view of the state of the Board's affairs and to explain its transactions.

- 53. The books of account shall be kept at the registered office of the Board, or subject to Section 147 (3) of the Act, at such other place or places as the Executive Committee think fit, and shall always be open to the inspection of the members of the Executive Committee.
- 54. Subject to any reasonable conditions or regulations as to the time and manner of inspecting the same that may from time to time be imposed by the Board in general meeting the accounts and books of the Board shall be open to the inspection of members of the Board at all reasonable times during business hours.
- 55. The Executive Committee shall from time to time in accordance with Sections 148, 150 and 157 of the Act, cause to be prepared and to be laid before the Board in general meeting such profit and loss accounts, balance sheets, and reports as are referred to in those Sections, and copies of the same shall be presented to the Diocesan Synod.
- 56. A copy of every balance sheet (including every document required by law to be annexed thereto) which is to be laid before the Board in general meeting, together with a copy of the Auditors report, shall not less than twenty-one clear days before the date of the meeting be sent to every member of, and every holder of debentures of, the Board. Provided that this Article shall not require a copy of those documents to be sent to any person of whose address the Board is not aware or to more than one of the joint holders of any debentures.

AUDIT

57. Auditors shall be appointed and their duties regulated in accordance with Sections 159 to 162 of the Act.

NOTICES

- 58) A notice may be given by the Board to any member thereof either personally or by sending it by post addressed to him at his registered address, or (if he has no registered address within the United Kingdom) at the address, if any, within the United Kingdom supplied by him to the Board for the giving of notices to him. Where a notice is sent by post, service of the notice shall be deemed to be effected by properly addressing, prepaying and posting a letter containing the notice, and to have been effected at the expiration of 24 hours after the letter containing the same is posted.
- 59. Notice of every general meeting shall be given in any manner hereinbefore authorised to the Auditors and to every member of the Board except those members who (having no registered address within the United Kingdom) have not supplied to the Board an address within the United Kingdom for the giving of notices to them.
- 60. No other person shall be entitled to receive notices of general meetings.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 61. No alteration or variation shall be made in these Articles of Association without the consent of the Diocesan Synod given by resolution.
- 62. A resolution of the Diocesan Synod shall be treated by the Board as sufficiently proved if a copy or what purports to be a copy thereof is delivered to the Secretary of the Board signed or purporting to be signed by the person who is or appears to be Secretary of the Diocesan Synod for the time being.

WINDING-UP

63. The provisions of Clause 7 of the Memorandum of Association relating to the winding-up and dissolution of the Board shall have effect as if the same were repeated in these Articles.

- 1. The name of the Association (in this Memorandum for brevity called "the Board") is "THE EXETER DIOCESAN BOARD OF FINANCE LIMITED."
 - 2. The registered office of the Board will be situate in England.
- 3. The objects for which the Board is established are as follows (that is to say)—To do all or any of the following things for the purpose of attaining the ends of the Board, if and so far as allowed by law, and subject to the observance and performance of whatever may be required by law in order legally to carry out the same:—
 - (A) To promote and assist the work and purposes of the Church of England in the Diocese of Exeter whatever for the time being shall be the area of the Diocese called the Diocese of Exeter or called by any name which shall hereafter be substituted for the present name of the Diocese (which Diocese, by whatever name the same may be called, is hereinafter referred to as "the Diocese of Exeter") and in particular to organise and provide funds in aid of the work of the Church and for the following essential departments of the Church's work, viz.:—
 - I. Training for the Ministry, Clerical and Lay.
 - II. Maintenance of the Ministry, Clerical and Lay, including the securing sites for and the erection, repair and upkeep of parsonage houses and clergy houses.
 - III. Provisions of pensions for the Ministry.
 - IV. Provisions for Widows and Orphans of the Clergy and for necessitous Clergy and their wives and children.
 - v. Securing desirable sites for and the erection and repair of Churches, Chapels, Church buildings, mission rooms, Church halls, hostels and other buildings, whether temporary or otherwise to be used for or in connection with any of the objects of the Board.

- vi. Religious education in all its branches, including the acquisition of buildings and of sites for and the building, equipment, improvement and repair of Church of England Schools and Colleges.
- VII. Provision of expenses of Diocesan and central organisation.

With such additions to and modifications of the departments aforesaid as from time to time may be expedient for the better carrying forward of the Church's work, and to aid and further (in such manner as may be approved by a resolution of the Diocesan Conference or Synod of the Diocese of Exeter and afterwards sanctioned by the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese) the objects and work of the Church of England in any part of England and Wales outside the said Diocese or beyond the borders of England and Wales, or any Mission or Church or body of Christians in communion therewith beyond such borders.

- (B) To raise, expend, invest and accumulate funds and income for the purposes aforesaid, and from time to time to determine or assist in determining the proportions in which such funds ought to be contributed in the several Rural Deaneries of the Diocese and in the several Parishes of each Rural Deanery.
- (c) To enter into agreements with associations in connection with the Church of England carrying out in the Diocese of Exeter or elsewhere within the borders of England and Wales any objects similar to any of the objects of this Board and to delegate any of its powers as may from time to time be provided by the Articles of Association.
- (D) To enter into any arrangements with the several diocesan bodies or societies of the said Diocese known as the Exeter Diocesan Trust, or any other body having power to administer or apply any funds within the Diocese of Exeter or any part thereof (whether as part of a larger area or not) for any of the purposes for which the Board has power to administer or apply funds with reference to any of the funds or property held by them respectively, or any of their powers, duties or trusts, and in particular on the request of any such body as aforesaid to take over, carry on or continue any of its powers, duties or trusts.
- (E) To make grants or donations or annual payments to any association or body having any objects in connection with the Church of England similar to any of those of the Board and whether in the Diocese of Exeter or elsewhere within the borders of England and Wales.
- (F) To pay officers, clerks and servants of the Board, to make payments for insurance on their behalf, and to make provision for any person or the widow of any person who has been in the employment of the Board.
- (G) To raise and borrow money at interest or otherwise for the purposes of the Board on such terms and on such security (if any) as may be determined, and in particular by an issue of debentures or debenture stock, redeemable or otherwise, and to act as guarantors in respect of the raising of money for the advancement of any of the objects of the Board.

- (ii) To promote or oppose or join in promoting or opposing legislative and other measures affecting or buely to affect any of the objects or work of the Board, or any body of persons, the aid or benefit of which is within the objects of the Board.
- (1) To acquire and sell and dispose of houses and land of any tenure (subject to the provisions of Section 2) of the Charities Act 1960), either in the name of the Board or in the name or names of a Trustee or Trustees for the Board.
- (J) To acquire by any means whatsoever and hold and administer advowsons, rights of patronage, nomination and presentation of and to Churches, chapels and benefices, and as and when occasion shall arise, to exercise all rights of whatsoever nature belonging or incident to such advewsons, rights of patronage, nomination and presentation in such manner as the Board may determine, with power to delegate the exercise of any such right or any such determination to any council or committee of whom the majority shall be members of the Board or to any members or member of the Board, whether generally or in any particular case or class of cases; and (but not without the consent in writing of the Bishop of the Diocese) to dispose of in any manner whatseever all or any of such advowsons or rights of patronage, nomination and presentation.
- (K) To take over or co-operate with or make grants to any organisation other than those hereinbefore mentioned or referred to carrying on any work connected with the Church of England in the said Diocese or any part thereof.
- (L) To act as the executors of any deceased person, and to accept property of any kind and in any form, whether call or personal, to be held by the Board either alone or jointly with another or others upon any trusts, whether already existing or newly created, connected with the Church of England, but subject as to land to the provisions of Section 19 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908.
- (M) To apply, if the Board shall by Special resolution so decide, for a Royal Charter incorporating an association having objects similar to those of the present Board, and upon such incorporation to transfer and commit the preperty, work and objects of the present Board to the body incorporated by such Royal Charter.
- (N) In the event of a partition or alteration of the boundaries of the Diocese of Exeter as at present existing to appropriate such part as the Board shall think fit of the property held for the general purposes of the Board to similar purposes within the area by such partition or alteration separated from the Diocese of Exeter as at present existing, and to make over such appropriated part to any Diocesan Board of the Diocese in which the area so separated is comprised as Trustee, or to any such trustees as the Board shall think fit, and to declare the trusts of the property so made over: Provided that the trusts to be so declared shall, as far as may be be of the same character, except as regards the area for which they are to be administered and the body to administer the same, as the trusts and provisions applicable thereto under these presents. And as to any property held on special trusts affecting any area so separated as aforesaid or any part thereof, to deal with the same (so far as the law allows) in a, to corresponding manner

- of Canterbury and York or beyond their borders the Organican of Canterbury and York or beyond their borders the objects and work of such other churches ecumenical enterprises or ministries as the General Synod for this purpose may expressly approve and commend in like manner as the objects and work of the Church of England within the provinces of Canterbury and York may under the provisions hereof be promotedaided or furthered
- (P) To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects: Provided that the Board shall not support with its funds any object or endeavour to impose on or procure to be observed by its members or others any regulation, restriction or condition which, if an object of the Board, would make it a trade union: Provided also that in case the Board shall take or hold any property subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Education or Charity Commissioners for England and Wales the Board shall not sell, mortgage, charge or lease the same without such authority, approval or consent as may be required by law, and as regards any such property the members or trustees of the Board shall be chargeable for such property as may come into their hands, and shall be answerable and accountable for their own acts, receipts, neglects and defaults and for the due administration of such property in the same manner and to the same extent as they would as such members or trustees have been if no incorporation had been effected, and the incorporation of the Board shall not diminish or impair any control or authority exercisable by the Chancery Division, the Board of Education or the Charity Commissioners over such members or trustees but they shall as regards ... any such property be subject jointly and separately to such control and authority as if the Board were not incorporated. In case the Board shall take or hold any property which may be subject to any trusts, the Board shall only deal with the same in such a manner as allowed by law having regard to such trusts.
- 4. The income and property of the Board whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Board as set forth in this Memorandum of Association and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise howsoever by way of profit to the members of the Board or to any of them. Provided that:—

(i) nothing herein contained shall prevent the payment in good faith of reasonable and proper remuneration to any officer or servant of the Board or to any member of the Board in return for any services actually rendered to the Board; nor prevent the payment of interest at a rate not exceeding 8 per cent per annum on money lent or reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let by any member to the Board;

- (ii) no member of the Governing Body of the Board shall be appointed to any salaried office of the Board or any office of the Board paid by fees, and that no remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth shall be given by the Board to any member of such Governing Body except repayment of out-of-pocket expenses and interest at the rate aforesaid on money lent or reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let to the Board and except as provided by paragraph (iv) hereof;
- (iii) if any member of the Board has any pecuniary interest, direct or indirect in any proposal laid before the Board or its Governing Body or other matter relative thereto and is present

at a meeting of the Board or its Governing Body at which the proposal or other matter relative thereto is the subject of consideration, he shall at the meeting, as soon as practicable after the commencement thereof, disclose the fact, and shall not take part in the consideration or discussion of, or vote on any question with respect to the proposal or other matter relative thereto;

- (iv) nothing herein contained shall prevent the Clerical members of the Board from being present, from taking part in any discussion or from voting on the payment or provision made in good faith of grants, pensions and benefits by way of maintenance or otherwise in accordance with these provisions, to or for the benefit of any class of clergy of the Church of England which includes or may include members of the Board or its Governing Body;
- (v) the provisions hereinbefore contained shall not apply to any payment to any company of which a member of the Governing Body may be a member, and in which such member shall not hold more than one hundredth part of the capital, and such member shall not be bound to account for any share of profits he may receive in respect of any such payment.
 - 5. The liability of the members is limited.
- 6. Every member of the Board undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Board in the event of the same being wound up during the time that he is a member, or within one year afterwards, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Board contracted before the time at which he ceased to be a member, and of the costs charges and expenses of winding up the same, and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributories amongst themselves, such amount as may be required not exceeding £1.
- 7. If, upon the winding up or dissolution of the Board, there remains, after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Board, but if and so far as effect can be given to the next provision, shall be given or transferred to some other institution or institutions having objects similar or cognate to the objects of the Board, and which shall prohibit the distribution of its or their income and property amongst its or their members to an extent at least as great as is imposed on the Board under or by virtue of Clause 4 hereof, such institution or institutions to be determined by the members of the Board at or before the time of dissolution, or in default thereof by such judge of the High Court of Justice as may have or acquire jurisdiction in the matter, and if and so far as effect cannot be given to such provision, then to some charitable object in connection with the Church of England.
- 8. True accounts shall be kept of the sums of money received and expended by the Board, and the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the property, credits and liabilities of the Board, and subject to any reasonable restrictions as to the time and manner of inspecting the same that may be imposed in accordance with the regulations of the Board for the time being, they shall be open to the inspection of the members. Once at least in every year the accounts of the Board shall be examined and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more properly qualified auditor or auditors.


