Financial Report of the Council To be presented to the Fortieth Annual General Meeting

The Council has pleasure in presenting the Accounts of the Institute for the period 1 April 1999 to 31 March 2000.

Income and Expenditure Account

An operating deficit of expenditure over income of £24,580 was recorded and has been transferred to the Reserves (£24,063 surplus in 1998/99). This represented 0.4% of turnover (0.5% surplus in 1998/99) and highlighted once again the exceptionally narrow margins within which the Institute operates. After a weak performance in the first quarter, it represents a solid recovery over the remainder of the year, assisted by a programme of economies on core costs.

Income during the period amounted to £5,578,208 and included £5,498,480 for grants programme and project funding. A total of 110 organisations contributed to specific grants. Details of this funding are given in the schedule following the accounts. The research undertaken during the year, and its funding, is considered in more detail in the Annual Report.

Staff numbers during the year were 73 (61 in 1999/00). Staff costs were the major item of expenditure at £2,157,702, representing 39% of turnover (37% in 1998/99). This, however, does not include the research associates, assistants and overseas collaborators contracted to ODI and receiving £1,331,861 (24%) during this period (£1,125,753, 23% in 1998/99). Depreciation, including that on computing equipment and costs related to the premises, amounted to £74,314 for the period.

Accommodation and associated charges for the period were £276,134. Supplementary and other disbursements to ODI Fellows in overseas placements under the Fellowship Scheme amounted to £650,596. Local salaries are provided by the employing governments.

The Institute completed a programme aimed at reviewing all computer systems and data reliant equipment to minimise the potential effect of computers or equipment not functioning as a consequence of the millennium date change. There were no consequences of the change. All costs incurred have been recognised in the year and are not material.

Balance Sheet

Fixed assets, including investments at market value, amounted to £1,134,368. Grants received in advance continue to be a large creditor. Most of the remaining amounts will be drawn down in the first half of the current financial year.

The reserves total of £1,217,879 showed an increase of £10,473 from 1999. This increase was due to an improved cash balance at the end of the year off-set by the transfer that had to be made from the reserves of £200,000. The Council remains confident of the Institute's ability to attract funded support for its activities.

Interest earned by the invested part of the reserves is accumulated within the Investment Funds and will not normally be drawn upon for income. The Council aims to maintain the real value of the Institute's investments and will continue to review their management on a regular basis. The market value of all investments was £1,024,733 (£1,189,603 in 1999) (Note 5).

Auditors

A resolution proposing the reappointment of KPMG as auditors to the Company will be put to the Annual General Meeting.

Statutory Information

- 1 Principal Activities of the Institute – to provide a centre for research in development issues and problems; to conduct studies of its own; to be a forum for the exchange of views and information among those who are directly concerned with overseas development; and to keep the gravity of the problems before the public and responsible authorities.
- 2 The Institute is a company limited by guarantee (Registration No 661818 England. Registered office address: Portland House, Stag Place, London SW1E 5DP) and is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association. Members' liability is limited to £1 per head. It is also a non-profit-making registered charity (No 228248).
- 3 Council Members serve in an honorary capacity and receive no emoluments. They are appointed by the Council and do not have contracts of service. Council members have no financial interest in the Institute. They constitute the directors of the Company under the Companies Act 1985.

- 5 *Council's responsibilities in respect of the preparation of financial statements*
The members of Council, as trustees, are required by company law to prepare financial statements which give a true and fair view of the state of the company at the end of the financial year and of the surplus for the period to that date. The financial statements must be prepared in compliance with the required formats and disclosures of the Companies Act 1985 and with applicable accounting standards. In addition, the trustees are required:
 - to select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
 - to make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;

- to take account of expenses and income relating to the period being reported on, whether or not they have been paid or received in that period;
- to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The trustees confirm that the financial statements comply with the above requirements. The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985 and the requirements of the charity's governing documents. They have general responsibility for taking such steps as are reasonably open to them to safeguard the assets of the company and to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.

No trustee had a material interest during the year in any significant contract with the company.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS**

- 1 The Overseas Development Institute (ODI) is a company limited by guarantee. The memorandum of association restricts the liability of members on winding up to £1. In the case of winding up none of the reserves are distributable to the members but shall be given or transferred to some other charitable institution having similar objectives to ODI.
- 2 **Accounting policies**
 - (a) The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting for Charities' and applicable accounting standards. A cash flow statement has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Financial Reporting Standard No 1. (Revised).
 - (b) Income and expenditure are dealt with on an accruals basis, save that income from investments is accounted for when received. Where accumulation units are held, income is received in the form of additional units. The value of such income is not included as income in the accounts, but is reflected in the market value of investments given in Note 5.
 - (c) Certain expenditure is charged directly to specific grants as shown in the attached schedule.
 - (d) Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the rates of exchange applicable at the dates of transactions. Assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange at the balance sheet date and any resultant gain or loss is taken to the income and expenditure account, under the heading 'General Office Expenses'.
 - (e) Fixed assets are depreciated at the following rates:
 Fixtures and fittings – on a straight line basis at 20% per annum;
 Equipment – on a straight line basis at 33.3% per annum;
 Library – all additions are written off in the year of acquisition;
 Improvements to premises – written off as incurred.
 - (f) Stock of publications is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
 - (g) Following the Statement of Recommended Practice for charity accounting, investments are valued at market value. The resulting unrealised gain on these investments is being credited to reserves.

11 Pension Arrangements

The institution participates in the Universities Superannuation Scheme, a defined benefit scheme which is externally funded and contracted out of the State Earnings-Related Pension Scheme. The pension scheme provides benefits based on final pensionable salary for employees of all UK universities and some other employers. The assets of the Scheme are held in a separate trustee-administered fund.

The latest actuarial valuation of the Scheme was on 31 March 1999. The assumptions which have the most significant effect on the results of the valuation are those relating to the rate of return on investments (ie the valuation rate of interest) and the rates of increase in salary and pensions. In relation to the past service liabilities the financial assumptions were derived from market yields prevailing at the valuation date. It was assumed that the valuation rate of interest would be 4.5% per annum, that salary increases would be 3.6% per annum and that pensions would increase by 2.6% per annum. In relation to the future service liabilities it was assumed that the valuation rate of interest would be 5.5% per annum, including an additional investment return assumption of 1% per annum, salary increases would be 3.5% per annum and pensions would increase by 2.5% per annum. The valuation cost is assessed using the projected unit method.

At the valuation date, the market value of the assets of the scheme was £18,870 million (including an estimated £55 million in respect of outstanding bulk transfers payments due) and the value of the past service liabilities was £17,427 million. The assets were therefore sufficient to cover 108% of the benefits which had accrued to members after allowance for expected future increases in earnings.

The total pension costs for the institution was £178,213 (1998/99, £152,105). The contribution rate payable by the institution was 14% of pensionable salaries. The auditor and actuary to the Universities Superannuation Scheme have confirmed that it is appropriate to take the pension costs in the institution's accounts to be equal to the actual contributions paid during the year. In particular, the contribution rate recommended following the 1999 valuation has regard to the surplus disclosed, the benefit improvements introduced subsequent to the valuation and the need

to spread surplus in a prudent manner over the future working lifetime of current scheme members.

The Company also participates in the Superannuation Arrangements of the University of London, a pension scheme which provides benefits based on final salary for non-academic employees of the University of London and a number of other Academic Institutions. The assets of the Scheme are held in a separate trustee-administered fund. The pension cost charged to the profit and loss account is calculated by the actuary so as to spread out the cost of pensions over the employees' working lives with the institution. The pension costs are based on the most recent actuarial valuation which was completed with an effective date of 31 March 1999. The most significant assumptions for their effect on the pension costs are those relating to the rate of return on investments of the Scheme and the rate of increase in salaries and pensions. The rate of earnings increase used was 4.1% per annum and pensions were assumed to increase by 2.6% per annum in payment. The Scheme is funded using the same assumptions and actuarial method as described above for the expensing of the Scheme. The actuarial valuation at 31 March 1999 showed that the market value of the scheme's assets was £846.6 million and the actuarial value of those assets represented 120% of the liability for benefits under the valuation method, for service to the valuation date and based on salaries projected to retirement or earlier exit.

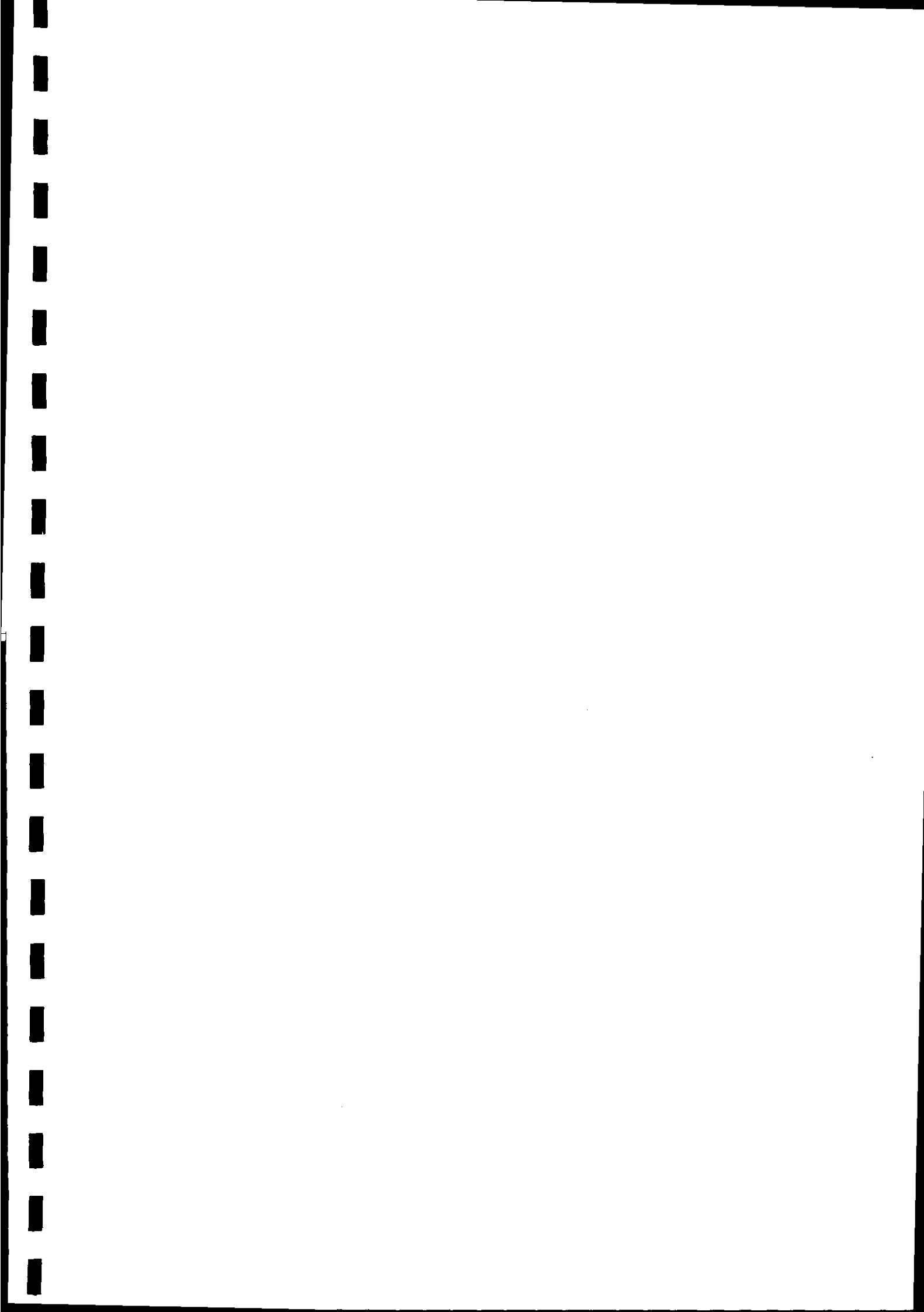
