The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2016. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in 2005 in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

STRUCTURE GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

The organistation is a charitable company limited by guarantee and was set up for the provison of community participation in healthy recreation for the residents of Gravesned and surrounding areas. It is governed by a memorandum and articles of association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Structure & Organisation

The Trustees form the Committee of Management who meet regularly throughout the year.

Trustees' responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in England & Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that year. In preparing these financial statements the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP 2015 (FRSSE);
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts Reports) Regulations 2008 and the trust deed. Objectives

The objects of the charity the promotion of community participation in healthy recreation for the residents of Gravesend and surrounding areas by the provision of facilities for the playing of cricket, bowling and tennis.

The trustees have referred to the guidance in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing their aims and objectives and in planning future activities. In particular, the trustees regularly consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives that have been set.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Review of Developments, Activities and Achievements

During the year charitable status was obtained by the club.

The club has a 999 year lease on the land on which, a yearly rent of £1 is paid. The charity is made up of two sections Cricket and Bowls. Each section pays £4,000 a year to cover the running costs of the charity.

The cricket section have five teams that play on a Saturday and two on a Sunday. Gravesend first team has managed to stay in division two this year. The grounds are also used on a Sunday by North Kent Football League, which is overseen by the cricket section.

The bowls section have been actively seeking to increase their numbers due to a drop in the last few years. They currently hold county level games at their grounds.

Review of the period

The results for the year and the Charity's financial position at the end of the financial year are shown in the attached financial statements

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Fixed assets

Individual fixed assets costing £250 or more are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation
