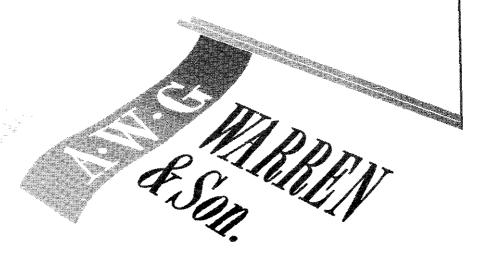

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated and registered as a charity on 25 September 1972.

The company was established under a Memorandium of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. Under those Articles, the members of the Management Committee are elected at the AGM to serve a period of 3 years, subject to ratification at each AGM.

South Wales Association For The Prevention of Addiction Ltd Trustees Report for the Year ended 31 March 2002

The trustees, who are also directors of the company, present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2002. All of the directors of the company are trustees of the charity.

Activities:

The company is a charity and exists to:

prevent the onset of substance misuse raise awareness of substance misuse and related issues reduce and minimise substance misuse related harm and risk

In order to achive its aims, the charity delivers a range of activity.

Results:

The net incoming resources for the year amounted to £133,669 but £13,146 of this has to be used on restricted projects and £57,393 has been assigned to designated funds. The balance of £63,130 was the amount attributable to general reserves, which now stand at £207,790.

Casework and Enquiries:

The charity received over 1000 new referrals, of these 77% were seen, with an attendance rate of 60%. Out of these 69% were male and 31% were female.

The main sources of referrals came from Probation, self, GP's, Youth Offending Teams, NHS Services, Social Services and family and friends. Of these 33% were aged between 18-25 years, 25% were aged between 26-35 years and 14% were aged under 18 years.

The main substance misuse in over 40% of referrals was from alcohol, followed by heroin (27%), and cannabis (10%).

Individuals are seen on a one to one basis and assessed before a package of care is put in place, and most subsequent sessions comprise therepeutic support input followed by education and advice.

In addition, the charity responded to and dealt with over 6000 enquiries on a face to face basis, by telephone and by letter.

Needle Exchange:

Over 500 individuals are registered with this scheme. Over 200 individuals used this scheme on over 400 occasions, taking out nearly 22,000 needles, and returning nearly 16,000. Out of the 102 new users of the scheme, 10% were female, 90% were male. Most were in the 18-25 year age range, with 70% being steroid users, and 25% being heroin users.

Training, Education and Awareness-Raising:

The charity delivered 24 training sessions, with 456 participants from a range of organisations including Health, Social Services, Youth Offending Teams, Probation, Police, voluntary and community groups such as Barnardos, Homestart and Victim Support. Thirtynine participants were accredited at SEWOCN Levels 2 and 3.

In addition, over 60 educational sessions were delivered to nearly 6000 young people through carousel events such as Crucial Crew, PSE inputs in schools, and inputs in out of school settings such as youth clubs, including participation in a 7 week accredited programme: "Drugs and Alcohal Uncovered". Twentyone young people were accredited at SEWOCN Level 1 for this programme.

Nearly 50 awareness-raising sessions were delivered to over 1000 individuals from a diverse range of groups including Neighbourhood Watch, women returners to work, and job centre employees.

Future Strategy:

The charity plans to continue with its existing activity. It is also planning to maximise opportunities presented through Central Government and National Assembly strategic initiatives to diversify its range of activity within its existing catchment area, as well as roll out and extend core casework and training activity to neighbouring areas in Gwent. The charity will also be seeking to extend its criminal justice and community safety work. It will also continue to develop an integrated model of service delivery with the statutory sector in Merthyr Tydfil through the establishment of a one stop facility, once the capital work programme for the refurbishment of the building is completed.

Reserve Policy

The management committee have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ('the free reserves') held by the charity should be between 3 and 6 months of the resources expended, which equates to £150,000 to £300,000 in general funds. At this level, the management committee feel that they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in funding. It would obviously be necessary to consider how the funding would be replaced or activities changed. At present the free reserves, which amount to £207,790, do not reach this target level and the management committee are considering ways in which additional unrestricted funds will be raised.

Investment Policy

The management committee has considered the most appropriate policy for investing funds is to keep surplus funds at a deposit account.

Risk Review

The Board of Directors has conducted its own review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed which has led to the development of a strategic plan which allows for the diversification of funding streams and service activities. Internal risks are minimised by processes and procedures determining appropriate authorisation of transactions and contracts, and quality issues in respect of service delivery, all of which are reviewed periodically.

1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective March 2000), the Companies Act 1985 and follow the recommendations in *Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice* issued in October 2000.

Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable.

Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

Resources expended are allocated to the particular activity where the cost relates directly to that activity. However, the cost of overall direction and administration on each activity, comprising the salary and overhead costs of the central function, is apportioned on the following basis which are an estimate, based on staff time, of the amount attributable to each activity:

Advice and information	25%
Counselling and support	41%
Training	21%
Needle exchange	4%
Management and administration of charity	9%

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life, which is 4 years for computer equipment and ten years for office equipment and fixtures and fittings.

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund, together with a fair allocation of management and support costs.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the management committee for particular purposes.
