Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 January 1993

1 Principal accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom. A summary of the more important accounting policies, which have been applied consistently, is set out below.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis of accounting.

Basis of consolidation

The group financial statements include the accounts of the holding company and all subsidiary undertakings made up to the end of the financial year. Where businesses are acquired or disposed of, the financial statements include their results from or to the effective date of acquisition or disposal. Goodwill arising on the acquisition of subsidiary undertakings is capitalised and amortised on a straight line basis over the Directors' estimate of its useful economic life of fifteen years.

Turnover

Turnover represents the value of goods invoiced to customers during the year (including service and rental income) after deducting returns, allowances and sales taxes.

Leased assets

Where tangible fixed assets are financed by leasing agreements that give rights approximately equivalent to ownership (finance leases) the assets are treated as if they had been purchased outright. The corresponding lease commitments are treated as obligations to the lessor. Depreciation of the relevant assets is charged to the profit and loss account at the rates shown in the depreciation note below or over the period of the lease if shorter.

Lease payments are treated as consisting of capital and interest elements with the interest charged against profit.

Rentals under operating leases are charged against profit on a straight line basis,

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets in equal instalments over their estimated lives as follows:-

Plant and equipment	10 years

Stocks

Stocks, being plain paper copiers, colour copiers, facsimile equipment, their supplies and spare parts, are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. In the opinion of the directors the net replacement cost of stocks would not be materially different to the carrying value.

Deferred taxation

The company provides deferred taxation to take account of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for financial statements purposes and their treatment for taxation purposes to the extent that it is probable that those timing differences will crystallise in the foreseeable future as a result of the reversal of those timing differences.

Pensions

Contributions are charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the cost of pensions over employees' working lives with the group.

Foreign currencies

Profits and losses arising on foreign currency transactions are written off to the profit and loss account as they arise. Foreign currency assets and liabilities are translated to sterling at year-end rates of exchange and any gains or losses arising are taken to the profit and loss account.

2 Profit and loss account presentation

The company has taken advantage of the provisions of Section 230 of the Companies Act 1985 not to present its own profit and loss account. The profit dealt with in the accounts of the company is shown in note 21.

During 1986/87, the Company issued £1.4m of non-convertible Debentures in part consideration for the acquisition of its interest in Konica Business Machines (North) Ltd. These Debentures are payable annually in eight equal instalments with effect from 1 February 1987 During the year the company has, in settlement of a warranty claim arising in connection with the aquisition of the subsidiary been released from its liabilities under debentures with a nominal value of £420,000.

The Debentures bear interest at rates averaging 0.5% above LIBOR.

19 Pension and similar obligations

The company operates a pension scheme, the Konica Business Machines (UK) Limited Pension and Life Assurance Scheme, for eligible employees of the company and its subsidiary undertakings, providing benefits based on final pensionable pay. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the participating companies and are invested in a managed fund. Contributions to the scheme are charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the cost of the pensions over employees' working lives with the group. The contributions are determined by an independent qualified actuary on the basis of triennial valuations using the aggregate funding method. The most recent actuarial valuation was performed at 6 April 1991. The assumptions which have the most significant effect on the results of the valuation are those relating to the rate of return on investments and the rates of increase in salaries and pensions. It was assumed that the investment returns would be \$.5% per annum, that salary increases would average 7% per annum, and that present and future pensions would increase at the rate of 5% per annum.

The group pension charge for the year was £641,158 (1992 - £590,458).

The actuarial valuation at 6 April 1991 showed that the market value of the scheme's assets was £4,331,000 and that the actuatini value of those assets represented 129% of the benefits that had accrued to members. The contributions of the companies and employees are at 12% and 5% respectively of pensionable earnings.

Konica Business Machines (North) Ltd and Konica Peter Llewellyn Ltd still operate their own separate pension schemes, for the original members of those schemes, details of which can be found in their respective financial statements.

The ultimate holding company is Konica Corporation, incorporated in Japan.
