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Directors' report

The director presents the annual report and the audited accounts for the 15 month period ended 31 December 2012

Principal activities and business review

The principal activities of the company are the manufacture and distribution of furnaces and ovens for laboratory pilot plant and industrial applications

Results and dividends

Carbolite has once again delivered another strong performance with revenue of £17 6m for the 15 month period ended 31 December 2012 (year to 30 September 2011 £12 6m) Continuing the growth shown in 2011, the period ending December 2012 reflected a strong period of growth for the company including the increased employment to 148 employees which was enhanced by further improvement in global market conditions. The directors are pleased to report an operating profit of £3 7m in the 15 month period (year to 30 September 2011 £2 0m)

During the period 100% of the share capital of the company's parent, Carbolite Holdings Limited, was acquired by Verder Holdings UK Limited and became part of the Verder International B V Group. The accounting period was extended to 31 December 2012 in order to bring the reporting date in line with the rest of the group.

Future prospects

The market outlook for 2013 shows continued signs of further improvement with increased levels of enquiries now evident. The Company has made a positive start to the new financial year and is well positioned to benefit from any further market growth.

The accounts have been prepared on an ongoing concern basis. Further information on this basis on preparation is given in note 1 of the accounts.

Notes

(forming part of the financial statements)

1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost accounting rules

Consolidated accounts

The Company is exempt by virtue of Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare group financial statements. These financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

Cash flow statement

The company has not prepared a cash flow statement as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of a group headed by Verder International BV, which are publicly available, and which include a cash flow statement. Consequently, the company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard number. I (Revised 1996) "Cash flow statements"

Going concern

The company's forecasts and projections, taking account of reasonable changes in trading performance, show that the company should be able to operate within the level of its current facility. The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

Investments

Investments, including those in subsidiary companies, are held at cost less any provision for impairment

Accounting policies (continued)

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the contracted rate or the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account

Stocks

Stocks are valued on a first in, first out basis and are stated at the lower of cost and estimated net realisable value Cost includes materials, direct labour and an attributable portion of manufacturing overheads. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price, less further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal. Provision is made for obsolete, slow-moving or defective items where appropriate

Fixed assets

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost less the estimated residual value of tangible fixed assets by equal instalments over their estimated useful economic lives as follows

Freehold buildings - 10-25 years
Plant and machinery - 3-10 years
Vehicles - 4 years

No depreciation is provided on freehold land

Turnover

Turnover consists of amounts net of value added tax invoiced to customers in respect of recognised sales. Sales of goods are recognised when goods are despatched and title has passed.

Operating leases

Operating lease rentals are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

Pension costs

During the year the company solely made contributions to the Prudential stakeholder pension plan

The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the Company in an independently administered fund. The amount charged to the profit and loss account represents the contributions payable to the scheme in respect of the accounting period.

Research and development

Research and development expenditure is written off as incurred to the profit and loss account
