Charity objectives:

The company's principle activity during the year was to promote, maintain, improve and

advance education by the production of educational plays.

#### Activities and review

During the course of the financial year Proteus' staff and board conducted a thorough review of the company's artistic policy and activity. The post of Administrator was changed to General Manager, reflecting the management responsibilities that the work now entails. A complete re-branding process was initiated and the company was re-launched in October 1999 with a new corporate image and artistic policy. Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council conducted a review of the company's activity in response to the Southern Arts review of the previous year. The outcome was a commitment from both the borough and the county to replace the company's core funding shortfall. In addition, a considerable amount of time was dedicated to securing both core and project funding from the public and corporate sector.

#### TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

#### 31ST MARCH 2000

Proteus continued to develop a programme of participatory theatre activity for urban and rural audiences, producing a wide variety of projects, which included The Comedy Zone, The Writing Zone, a youth theatre production of Our Day Out and numerous residencies and workshops throughout the county. The company toured a winter production of The Lost Voyage of Sinbad to sell-out audiences for seven weeks and continued its policy of supporting new work through the touring production of Charlie, based on the early life of Chaplin. The company was also commissioned by Hampshire Constabulary to tour Chaser, a drugs-related peer pressure project, to every secondary school in the borough of Basingstoke and Deane. It is intended that this project will be developed as a three year rolling programme.

By the end of the financial year, Proteus had moved into a strong and confident position, affording the opportunity for the company to develop quite considerably its performance and participatory programme, whilst consolidating its role as a key provider of small-scale touring community theatre within the region.

#### Trustees' responsibilities

Under the Charities Act 1993, the trustees are required to prepare a statement of accounts for each financial year which gives a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the end of the year and of its incoming resources and application of resources in the year. In preparing the statement, the trustees are required to:

select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;

state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the statement of accounts;

prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue its operations.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity at that time and to enable the trustees to ensure that any statement of account prepared by them complies with the regulations under section 42(1) of the Charities Act 1993. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2000

#### 1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been used consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the charity's financial statements.

#### **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and follow recommendations in Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting by Charities.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation has been provided at the following rates in order to write down the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value, of all tangible fixed assets, with the exception of freehold land, by equal annual instalments on a reducing balance method over their expected useful lives:

Plant and machinery

15% Straight line

Motor vehicles

33% Reducing balance

#### Voluntary income and fundraising expenditure

Voluntary income represents amounts received and recorded at offices and projects during the year. Except in the case of charity shops and fundraising events such as fetes and galas, no costs of fundraising have been netted against voluntary income.

Fundraising expenditure represents the direct costs of fundraising and includes the salaries and other direct costs of fundraising staff. Publicity costs directly related to fundraising are included in the fundraising costs.

#### Fees, contributions and grants

These comprise amounts receivable during the year.

#### Investment income

Investment income is recognised in the accounts when it is received.

#### Value added tax

As the majority of Proteus Theatre Company Limited (A Company Limited by Guarantee)'s activities are classified as exempt or non-business activities for the purposes of value added tax, Proteus Theatre Company Limited (A Company Limited by Guarantee) is unable to reclaim all the value added tax which it suffers on its purchases. Expenditure in these financial statements is therefore shown inclusive of value added tax.

#### **Taxation**

No provision has been made for corporation tax or deferred tax as the charity is a registered charity and is therefore exempt.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2000

#### Hire purchase and leased assets

Assets held under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are capitalised in the balance sheet at their fair value and depreciated over their expected useful lives. The interest element of leasing payments represents a constant proportion of the capital balance outstanding and is charged to the profit and loss account over the period of the lease.

All other leases are regarded as operating leases and the payments made under them are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.
