Directors' Report

For the year ended 31 January 2006

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 January 2006.

Principal activities

The company engages in sales to raise funds for the Motor Neurone Disease Association.

Review of business and future developments

The results for the year are set out in the profit and loss account on page 6. The result for the year of £5,000 will be transferred to reserves.

Donations of £14,963 were received on behalf of the Motor Neurone Disease Association and are not contained in these accounts. These donations will be paid to the Association during the year ending 31 January 2007.

During the year activities organised on behalf of the Motor Neurone Disease Association raised £32,862 after expenses. The income and expenditure for the activities are included in these accounts. £11,771 of the net income was paid to the Association during the year, and £21,091 will be paid during the year ending 31 January 2007.

Both the level of business and the year end financial position were satisfactory, and the directors expect the current level of activity to be maintained for the foreseeable future.

Dividends

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend.

A Graham and A Johnston were directors for the whole of the year and up to the date of this report. A Horwell was appointed on the 17 October 2005 and was a director up to the date of this report.

Directors' interests in shares of the company

According to the Register required to be kept by Section 325 of the Companies Act 1985, none of the directors held any beneficial interest in the shares of the company at 31 January 2006 or 1 February 2005.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 31 January 2006

1 Principal accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom. A summary of the more important accounting policies, which have been applied consistently, is set out below:

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention.

Turnover

Turnover, which excludes value added tax and trade discounts, represents the invoiced value of goods supplied.

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. In general, cost is determined on a first in first out basis and includes transport and handling costs. Net realisable value is the price at which stocks can be sold in the normal course of business after allowing for the costs of realisation. Provision is made where necessary for obsolete, slow moving and defective stocks.

2 Turnover

The majority of turnover is generated in the United Kingdom; turnover from overseas accounts for less than 1% of the total.
