Directors' Report for the year ended 31 January 1997

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 January 1997.

Principal activities

The company is involved in the sale of Christmas cards and gifts, and is the sales outlet for the Motor Neurone Disease Association.

Review of business and future developments

The results for the year are set out in the profit and loss account on page 4. The profit for the year of £5 will be transferred to reserves.

Donations of £7,242 were received on behalf of the Motor Neurone Disease Association and are not contained in these accounts. These donations, together with a deed of covenant payment of £8,500, were paid to the Association during the year.

During the year the company continued to engage Barnardo Publications Limited as its agent for the sale of Christmas cards and other merchandise.

Both the level of business and the year end financial position were satisfactory, and the directors expect the current level of activity to be maintained for the foreseeable future.

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend.

Close company provisions

The company is a close company as defined by the provisions of the Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988. There has been no change in this respect since the end of the financial year.

Directors' responsibilities

The directors are required by UK company law to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company as at the end of the financial year and of the profit or loss and total recognised gains and losses of the company for that period.

The directors confirm that suitable accounting policies have been used and applied consistently, and reasonable and prudent judgements and estimates have been made in the preparation of the financial statements for the year ended 31 January 1997. The directors also confirm that applicable accounting standards have been followed and the financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 January 1997

1 Principal accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom. A summary of the more important accounting policies, which have been applied consistently, is set out below:

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention.

Turnover

Turnover, which excludes value added tax and trade discounts, represents the invoiced value of goods supplied.

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. In general, cost is determined on a first in first out basis and includes transport and handling costs. Net realisable value is the price at which stocks can be sold in the normal course of business after allowing for the costs of realisation. Provision is made where necessary for obsolete, slow moving and defective stocks.

Cash flow statement

The company qualifies as a small company under the terms of Section 247 of the Companies Act 1985. As a consequence it is exempt from the requirement to publish a cash flow statement.

2 Turnover

The majority of turnover is generated in the United Kingdom; turnover from overseas accounts for less than 1% of the total.
