Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 30th June 2014

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable standards and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting by Charities (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 2006. The Financial Statements have been prepared on the basis of the charity continuing as a going concern.

Incoming Resources

Incoming resources are reported gross and are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Grants Receivable

Grants are recognised when receivable.

Restricted Funds

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure as imposed by the donor.

Unrestricted Funds

Unrestricted funds are donations and other income received or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available for use as general funds at the discretion of the trustees.

Depreciation of Tangible Assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Equipment -25% on reducing balance Computer Equipment -25% on reducing balance

Stocks

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The Association For The Scientific Study of Anomalous Phenomena, as a registered charity, is exempt from Corporation Tax so far as it relates to its charitable objects. It is not, however, exempt from VAT, and irrecoverable VAT is included in the cost of those items to which it relates.
