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DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2002

The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 October 2002.

Principal activities and review of the business

The principal activity of the company continued to be that of developing and operating psychiatric and elderly health care facilities. The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Cygnet 2000 Limited. In November 2002 Cygnet 2000 Limited was acquired in its entirety by Cygnet 2002 Limited for a mixture of cash and share for share exchange.

Results and dividends

The results for the year are set out on page 4.

During the year the company declared and paid interim ordinary dividends of £4,000,000 (2001 - £4,000,000) to its parent company.

Directors

The following directors have held office since 1 November 2001:

Directors' interests

The directors' interests in Cygnet 2000 Limited, the ultimate parent company, are noted in the accounts of that company.

Employee involvement

The company's policy is to encourage active envolvement of employees in the management of its facilities and in matters affecting employees' interests. Each facility has a staff relations committee. The elected chairperson of the staff relations committee attends the quarterly board meetings at their facility and serves as a conduit for interaction between the board and employees. The staff relations committee also takes an active role in quality assurance and the accreditation process which all the company's facilities embrace.

Cygnet 2000 Limited, the ultimate parent company, has established an Inland Revenue Approved All Employee Share Ownership Plan ("AESOP") under which group employees can buy shares in the company out of pre-tax income and receive an equal number of free "matching" shares. In conjunction with the AESOP, the executive directors have undertaken to produce and circulate to AESOP subscribers semi-annual reports on the performance of the company.

A seperate Inland Revenue approved share option scheme has been established for managers.

Disabled persons

The company's policy is to consider the recruitment of disabled persons for those vacancies that they are able to fill. As with all employees, the group optimises opportunities for personal development. All of the company's health care facilities incorporate appropriate physical arrangements for disabled persons.

Creditor payment policy

It is company policy to pay approved liabilities to creditors promptly and within agreed terms.

Auditors

In accordance with section 385 of the Companies Act 1985, a resolution proposing that Noel & Co Chartered Accountants be reappointed as auditors of the company will be put to the Annual General Meeting.

Directors' responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2002

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention modified to include the revaluation of freehold and long leasehold land and buildings. The company has adopted FRS 19 "Deferred Taxation" in these financial statements and there has been no requirement to restate comparative figures.

1.2 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts.

1.3 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Land and leasehold and freehold buildings are valued annually at the balance sheet date to their existing use value. Other tangible assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

1.4 Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

1.5 Pensions

The pension costs charged in the financial statements represent the contributions payable by the company during the year in accordance with SSAP 24.

1.6 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided at appropriate rates without discounting on all timing differences using the liability method only to the extent that, in the opinion of the directors, there is a reasonable probability that a liability or asset will crystallise in the foreseeable future.

1.7 Pre opening costs

Operating costs relating to the opening of new health care facilities are expensed as incurred.

1.8 Joint venture

Joint ventures are accounted for in accordance with the equity method of accounting. A summary of the terms and the profit and loss accounts and balance sheets of material joint ventures are set out in the notes to these accounts.

2 Turnover

The total turnover of the company for the year has been derived from its principal activity wholly undertaken in the United Kingdom.
