As described on page 4 the company's directors are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those accounts and to report our opinion to you.

#### Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board, except that the scope of our work was limited as explained below.

An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the accounts. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the accounts, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the accounts are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. However, the evidence available to us was limited because we were appointed auditors on 2 October 1995 and in consequence we were unable to carry out auditing procedures necessary to obtain adequate assurance regarding the balances as at 31 August 1994. Any adjustment to these balances would have a consequential effect on the loss for the year.

In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the accounts.

### Qualified opinion arising from limitation in audit scope and omission of disclosures

No comparatives have been presented for the operating lease rentals expense in note 2 and the staff costs and average number of employees in note 3.

Except for any adjustments that might have been found to be necessary had we been able to obtain sufficient evidence concerning the balances at 31 August 1994, in our opinion the accounts give a true and fair view of the loss of the company for the year ended 31 August 1995 and except for the omission of comparatives noted above, have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. In our opinion the accounts give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company as at 31 August 1995.

#### ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Accounting convention

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

#### **Turnover**

Turnover comprises the invoiced value of goods and services supplied, less allowances to customers, excluding value added tax. All turnover is derived in the UK from the company's single activity of dry cleaning.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on the cost of tangible assets on a reducing balance basis at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over the estimated life of each asset. The principal percentages are as follows:

10% reducing balance Plant and machinery 25% reducing balance Motor vehicles 10% reducing balance Fixtures and fittings 10% reducing balance Office equipment 15% reducing balance Leasehold improvements

#### Intangible fixed assets

#### Computer software system

The value of the company's computerised sales system was capitalised by the directors on 31 August 1994 at its cost of development. Amortisation at the rate of 20% per year on a straight line basis is being provided to write off the cost over its estimated life.

#### Hire purchase

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts are capitalised as tangible fixed assets and are depreciated over their estimated lives.

#### Operating leases

Gross rentals arising on assets under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis.

#### Stocks

Stocks comprise raw materials and consumables and are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
