We have examined the abbreviated financial statements on pages 2 to 5 together with the financial statements of ADR Accident Repair Centres Limited prepared under section 226 of the Companies Act 1985 for the year ended 31 December 1995.

#### Respective responsibilities of director and auditors

The director is responsible for preparing the abbreviated financial statements in accordance with Schedule 8 to the Companies Act 1985. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion as to the company's entitlement to the exemptions claimed in the director's statement on page 2 and whether the abbreviated financial statements have been properly prepared in accordance with that Schedule.

#### Basis of opinion

We have carried out the procedures we considered necessary to confirm, by reference to the audited financial statements, that the company is entitled to the exemptions and that the abbreviated financial statements have been properly prepared from those financial statements. The scope of our work for the purpose of this report does not include examining or dealing with events after the date of our report on the full financial statements.

#### Opinion

In our opinion the company is entitled under sections 246 and 247 of the Companies Act 1985 to the exemptions conferred by Section A of Part III of Schedule 8 to that Act, in respect of the year ended 31 December 1995, and the abbreviated financial statements on pages 2 to 5 have been properly prepared in accordance with that Schedule.

#### Other information

On 4 April 1996 we reported, as auditors of ADR Accident Repair Centres Limited, to the members on the financial statements prepared under section 226 of the Companies Act 1985 for the year ended 31 December 1995, and our audit report was as follows:

#### Basis of opinion

In the preparation of the company's annual financial statements, the director has taken advantage of special exemptions applicable to small companies under Part I of Schedule 8 to the Companies Act 1985 on the grounds that, in his opinion, the company is entitled to those exemptions.

The abbreviated financial statements on pages 2 to 5 were approved by the director on 4 Appril 1996.

#### 31 December 1995

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting rules.

The company and its subsidiary comprises a medium sized group. The company has therefore taken advantage of Section 248 of the Companies Act 1985 not to prepare group accounts.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement conferred by Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 on the grounds that it is entitled to the exemptions available in Section 246 to 247 of the Companies Act 1985 for small companies.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated to write off their cost or valuation less any residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:

Freehold land
Freehold buildings
Plant and machinery
Motor vehicles
Fixtures and fittings

#### Leases and hire purchase contracts

Tangible fixed assets acquired under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are capitalised at the estimated fair value at the date of inception of each lease or contract. The total finance charges are allocated over the period of the lease in such a way as to give a reasonably constant charge on the outstanding liability.

#### Operating leases

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged to the profit and loss account as incurred.

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving stocks. Cost includes all direct costs and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

#### Deferred taxation

Provision is made for taxation deferred as a result of material timing differences between the incidence of income and expenditure for taxation and accounts purposes, using the liability method, only to the extent that, in the opinion of the director, there is a reasonable probability that a liability or asset will crystallise in the near future.

#### Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme and the pension charge represents the amount payable by the company to the fund in respect of the year.

#### 3 Creditors

Of the creditors £616,443 (1994 - £491,907) is secured and includes £251,373 (1994 - £284,453) repayable by instalments and falling due after five years.
