#### OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT

## FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### **DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES**

#### 1. Statement of Accounting Policies

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005.

#### 2. Tangible Fixed Assets

Expenditure on tangible fixed assets is capitalised at cost.

Depreciation of tangible fixed assets is calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life using the reducing balance method as follows:
