PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH 24 OF SCHEDULE 8 TO THE COMPANIES ACT 1985

We have examined the abbreviated accounts on pages 3 to 7 together with the financial statements of Merseyside Pipeline Supplies Limited prepared under section 226 of the Companies Act 1985 for the year ended 31 December 1996. The scope of our work for the purpose of this report was limited to confirming that the company is entitled to the exemptions claimed in the directors' statement on page 4 and that the abbreviated accounts have been properly prepared from those financial statements.

In our opinion, the company is entitled under sections 246 and 247 of the Companies Act 1985 to the exemptions conferred by Section A of Part III of Schedule 8 to that Act, in respect of the year ended 31 December 1996, and the abbreviated accounts on pages 3 to 7 have been properly prepared in accordance with that Schedule.

On 27 March 1997 we reported, as auditors of Merseyside Pipeline Supplies Limited, to the shareholders on the financial statements prepared under section 226 of the Companies Act 1985 for the year ended 31 December 1996, and our audit report was as follows:

BASIS OF OPINION

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgments made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material or critical in relation to the company's abbreviated accounts.

(a) ACCOUNTING STANDARDS

The abbreviated accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

(b) DEPRECIATION

Depreciation has been provided to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets over their estimated useful lives at the following annual rates:

Plant and machinery 25% straight line Motor vehicles 25% straight line Fixtures and fittings 20% straight line

(c) STOCKS

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(d) DEFERRED TAXATION

Deferred taxation is provided using the liability method in respect of the taxation effect of all timing differences.

(e) LEASING

Assets purchased under finance leases are capitalised as fixed assets. The net obligations payable under finance leases are included in creditors. Finance charges payable in respect of finance leases are included in the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the term of the agreement.

(f) PENSION COSTS

The amounts included in the profit and loss account in respect of the company's defined contribution pension scheme are the contributions payable to the scheme during the accounting year.

(g) GOVERNMENT GRANTS

Government grants receivable in respect of assistance towards the cost of fixed assets are credited to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the estimated useful lives of the underlying assets.
