# NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material or critical in relation to the company's abbreviated accounts.

# (a) ACCOUNTING STANDARDS

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective March 2000).

## (b) TURNOVER

Turnover consists of invoiced sales net of returns, trade discounts and value added tax.

# (c) DEPRECIATION

Depreciation has been provided to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets over their estimated useful lives at the following annual rates:

Plant and machinery	25%	straight	line
Motor vehicles	25%	straight	line
Fixtures and fittings	20%	straight	line

# (d) STOCKS

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Consignment stocks held on behalf of consignors are not included in the value of stocks.

#### (e) TAXATION

Corporation tax payable is provided on taxable profits at the current rate. Advanced corporation tax payable on dividends paid or provided for is deducted from corporation tax liabilities. Advanced corporation tax was abolished from 6 April 1999.

#### (f) DEFERRED TAXATION

Provision is made for deferred taxation using the liability method to take account of timing differences between the incidence of income and expenditure for taxation and accounting purposes.

#### (g) PENSION COSTS

The amounts included in the profit and loss account in respect of the company's defined contribution pension scheme are the contributions payable to the scheme during the accounting year.

# (h) GOVERNMENT GRANTS

Government grants receivable in respect of assistance towards the cost of fixed assets are credited to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the estimated useful lives of the underlying assets.
