The council of management have pleasure in presenting their report and the audited accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2007

The legal and administrative information set out on page 1 forms part of this report. The financial statements comply with current statutory requirements, the Memorandum and Articles of Association and the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities (issued 2005)

INTRODUCTION

The charity was incorporated on the 5 May 1995 as a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital. The company was registered as a charity on 16 September 1996.

OBJECTIVES

The objects for which the chanty is established are

- The advancement of the Christian faith by the proclamation and furtherance of the gospel of God
- The promotion of the worship of God by any means whatsoever, including the preaching and proclamation of the Christian gospel, the teaching of Christian doctrine and principles, and the printing, production and distribution of Christian literature, media products and other resources
- The relief of persons in conditions of financial need, or of those persons who are infirm for reasons of old age or sickness
- The advancement of education on the basis of Christian principles including the provision of educational
 establishments, materials and bursanes for the general education of children or adults on the basis of such
 Christian principle

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The charity has continued to pursue it's objectives in the following ways.

Family Church continues to grow in terms of the number of people attending the church and supporting the charity's work. Congregations in Portsmouth and Gosport are well established with many church members involved in community and outreach projects as well as in regular 'church life'.

The church has a good reputation in the city of Portsmouth and is actively seeking to work in partnership with existing local groups/initiatives

The church leadership structure is continually evolving to effectively manage activities and events as well as pastorally supporting people attending the church. The leadership structure comprises Senior, Core and Departmental leaders who oversee various tiers of church life and departments within the church

The structure of accounts has been reviewed and amended to more effectively reflect departmental spending and enable accurate budgeting

This year Family Church has purchased the lease on a building in Portsmouth which now houses the central offices and many smaller functions such as Bible College, band practices, leaders meetings, bible study programmes, general seminars (such as marriage enrichment, family support, etc.) and training of teams by department leaders. We aim to hire these facilities to local charitable groups as well as commercial businesses in order to bring in additional revenue to the charity.

HEARTS ON FIRE FOR JESUS LIMITED ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COUNCIL OF MANAGEMENT (cont.) YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2007

- Through church meetings and relaxed activities the Christian faith has been advanced. Family Church operates several outreach projects in the local community such as youth/children's clubs and community projects including feeding the homeless in the region, providing food hampers for needy families, a service to supply household items to those in need, providing emergency 'wash packs' to local hospital wards, and seasonal charitable projects such as supplying local hospital wards and family centres with Easter Eggs, Christmas presents et
- The promotion of the worship of God continues through preaching and teaching Christian principles at church meetings and conferences. Resources (books, audio and video media), some of which are produced by the church, are distributed to members of the church as well as Christians from other churches.
- Financial support is donated to charities and missions projects to relieve persons in conditions of financial need
 and to assist in the care of those who are infirm. Support is given both locally, nationally and internationally.
 Teams have travelled to other nations (including Nigeria, India and the Philippines) in order to assist with church
 and missions projects and to take finance and provision to churches involved in helping their communities to
 overcome poverty and disease.
- Family Church provides a structured programme of training to educate people in the Christian faith
 This includes foundational bible courses as well as a part-time college teaching Christians how to apply their
 knowledge of the bible in their own lives

During the year there were 400+ adults plus approximately 80 children (2006 350 adults, 80 children) regularly attending meetings in Portsmouth and 70-80 adults plus approximately 20 children (2006 70 adults, 18 children) regularly attending meetings in Gosport. An additional congregation is due to be started in Portsmouth, which will appeal to people who prefer a more traditional service. Separate youth events/meetings (for 13 to 18 year olds) attract approximately 50 young people ever week. The chanty encourages donors to sign Gift Aid forms. In 2007, 297 individuals qualified as Gift Aid donors (forms signed) compared to 212 in 2006. (Of the 297 Gift Aid donors, 202 were regularly giving to the charity in 2007.)

FINANCIAL REVIEW

During the year the chanty made a surplus of £36,699. This increased fund balances to £124,097 which are held for the furtherance of the chanty's objectives

PRINCIPAL FUNDING SOURCES

Funding for Hearts on Fire for Jesus Limited comes principally from the donations of attendees to the Family Church Individuals make regular financial donations to support the work of the charity Expenditure for this year shows that the key objectives of the charity were supported as follows

- Payment of staff to manage and administer chanty business
- Expenditure for administration and growth of the church congregations
- Investment into equipment to enable church meetings and events to take place
- Expenditure for the hire (and potential purchase) of buildings to enable the church to operate
- Significant donations made to those in Christian education or training
- Expenditure for training resources and programmes of formal Christian education
- Investment into youth projects and community outreach initiatives

INVESTMENT POWERS AND RESTRICTIONS

The charity is authorised to invest the monies of the charity not immediately required for its purposes in or upon such investments or property as may be thought fit, subject to such conditions as may for the time being be imposed or required by law and subject as provided by the Memorandum of Association

RESERVES POLICY

The trustees aim to maintain free reserves equivalent to 3 months operating expenditure, in order to safeguard existing activities and enable the charity to respond to new opportunities

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

In order to continue to achieve our charity objectives we have made plans for the future. We will continue to strengthen Family Church congregations in Portsmouth and Gosport through effective Bible teaching and Christian training courses. We plan to open other congregations in the region in order to provide local communities with a place of worship reflecting the style and values of Family Church. One such congregation is due to open in 2007 in the North End area of Portsmouth This will be a 'traditional' congregation - appealing to those from more formal/traditional church backgrounds, yet maintaining the style and values of Family Church.

We will continue to work in our communities, aiming to develop and expand our Community Action programmes as well as continuing to organise outreach activities and events. We will continue supporting mission projects and individuals involved in missions work throughout the world. We hope to develop training courses to assist with the education of people in our community, from basic academic skills to full-time education of children in a Christian academy.

The charity is currently negotiating the purchase of a long-term lease of a large local building (ex-cinema) where the majority of Family Church meetings and events (that take place in the city of Portsmouth) will be moved. General operations will continue to run from the central offices at 122 London Road. The process of acquiring this lease has some way to go, but planning permission has recently been granted by Portsmouth City Council and the financing of this project is coming together. Negotiations with the selling agent are slow, but remain positive and are moving forward with our Surveyor (Hughes Ellard) now speaking with the selling agent on our behalf

THE COUNCIL OF MANAGEMENT

The Chanty is managed by the council of management Eight paid employees are engaged in carrying out the Chanty's objectives and they are assisted and supported by a number of helpers

The council of management have implemented a risk management strategy which reviews, on an annual basis, the risks the charity may face. Systems and procedures are designed to mitigate the risks identified and to minimise the potential impact on the charity should any of these risks materialise.

RECRUITMENT AND APPOINTMENT OF THE COUNCIL OF MANAGEMENT

The council of management of Hearts on Fire for Jesus Limited takes senously the recruitment and appointment of members of the council Potential trustees are recruited on the basis of their existing interest and involvement in the charity and the skills and experience they add to the Council Trustees are appointed by the council of management through election in accordance with the Articles of Association

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

The directors are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (UK GAAP). Company law requires the directors to prepare for each financial year, financial statements, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the surplus or deficit for that period. In preparing those accounts, the directors are required to -

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts,
- prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in operation

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 1985 They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregulanties

As far as the directors are aware, there is no relevant audit information of which the auditors are unaware. Each director has taken all the steps that he ought to have taken as a director in order to make himself aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the company's auditors are aware of that information

We have audited the financial statements of Hearts On Fire For Jesus Limited for the year ended 31 March 2007 on pages 8 to 15 These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on pages 10 and 11

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2007

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with the Charities' SORP "Accounting and Reporting for Charities" 2005 and the Companies Act 1985

b) Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income.

- Voluntary income is received by way of donations and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable
- Investment income is included when receivable.
- Incoming resources from activities for generating funds are accounted for when earned

c) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. It includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for
 its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect
 nature necessary to support them.
- Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the chanty and include audit fees and the costs linked to the strategic management of the charity
- All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the Statement of Financial Activities on a basis
 designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly

d) Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are included in the accounts at cost, with items over £100 being capitalised

Depreciation is provided on fixed assets to spread the cost over the estimated useful lives of the relevant assets at the following rates

Motor vehicles
Equipment
Computer equipment

e) Leases

Assets held under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are recorded in the balance sheet as fixed assets Depreciation is provided on these assets over their estimated useful lives

Future obligations under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are included in creditors, net of finance charges Payments are apportioned between the finance element, which is charged to the statement of financial activities as interest, and the capital element, which reduces the outstanding obligations

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to income on a straight-line basis over the lease term

f) Fund accounting

Funds held by the chanty are either

Unrestricted general funds Funds which can be used in accordance with the chantable objects at the

discretion of the trustees

Designated funds Funds set aside by the trustees out of unrestricted general funds for specific

future purposes or projects

Restricted funds Funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects

of the chanty Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds

are raised for particular restricted purposes

The chanty is a company limited by guarantee and has no share capital. The liability of each member in the event of winding-up is limited to £1.

No expenses are paid to trustees, excluding the reimbursement of costs paid out personally on behalf of the charity

During the year the charity employed Mrs S Carter, wife of trustee, Mr M Carter She was paid £12,993 (2006 £1,121)
