#### Directors' and Trustees' Report for the year ended 5 April 2001

The trustees present their report for the year ended 5 April 2001.

#### Constitution, objects and principal activities

The Charity is constituted as a Company limited by guarantee, and is governed by memorandum and articles of association. The trustees meet every two months. Day-to-day management of the charity is delegated to the Manager and the Programme Co-ordinator.

The principal activities of the charity are to advise and assist persons with alcohol or drug related or connected personal problems in overcoming those problems; to assist the families and dependants of such persons and to advance the education of the general public with the misuse of drugs, alcohol and other substances.

#### Development, activities and achievements

This year has been one of consolidation, which has left Cyswllt poised for expansion. Counselling staff numbers were very limited for the first six months of the year and an enormous amount of work was done by the existing counsellors to maintain Cyswllt's high standard of service. The Trustees were extremely supportive to the whole team over this period. Towards the end of the year the National Asembly for Wales awarded Cyswllt funding to employ a Project Worker, who will act as co-facilitator for the Drug and Alcohol Awareness Programme and be responsible for developing our schools educational service. Cyswllt is now fully staffed and all of the organisation's programmes have been refined and developed over the year. In addition Planning Permission has been gained for Cyswllt to relocate to larger premises in the centre of Aberystwyth. The charity received the services of 3 volunteers during the year.

#### Policies and Financial Management

- a) The charity has no policy on reserves.
- The trustees are empowered by the Articles of Association to invest the funds of the Charity as they see fit.
   Any funds not required for immediate expenditure are placed in a bank deposit account until needed.
- c) The Tudor Trust fund is in deficit by £1,493 at 31 March 2001. This deficit has been cleared by the receipt of a further grant from the trust in the following year.
- d) The trustees confirm that they have identified major risks to which the charity is exposed and have established systems to mitigate these risks.

#### Trustees' Responsibilities

# Notes to the Accounts for the year ended 5 April 2001

#### 1. Accounting Policies

#### 1.1 Basis of preparation of the Accounts.

The Accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the charity's operations which are described in the Directors' and Trustees' Report and all of which are continuing.

The Accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice for Charity Accounts (2000) and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities.

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement.

### 1.2 Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity are stated at cost less depreciation. Assets costing less than £500 are not capitalised.

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following basis:

Office Equipment

25% straight line basis

#### 1.3 Voluntary income and donations

Voluntary income and donations are accounted for as received by the charity.

#### 1.4 Grants received

Grants received towards capital expenditure have been credited to a restricted fund against which the depreciation of the equipment will be charged.

Grants towards revenue expenditure are credited to a restricted fund and released as the expenditure is incurred.

#### 1.5 Operating leases

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are reflected in the Statment of Financial Activities as incurred.

#### 1.6 Management and administration expenses

Administration expenditure includes all expenditure not directly related to the charitable activities.

#### 1.7 Value Added Tax

Value added tax is not recoverable by the charity, and as such is included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.
