Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 5 April 2007

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 5 April 2007. The trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law and who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1.

Structure, governance and management

The Charity is constituted as a Company limited by guarantee, and is governed by memorandum and articles of association

The trustees, who are also the directors, meet every two months

Trustees are appointed at each annual general meeting, being proposed by trustees or members. One third of the trustees retire by rotation at each AGM

Trustee vacancies and additional appointments may be made by the trustees, such trustees holding office only until the next following AGM

Day-to-day management of the charity is delegated to the Director and Business Manager, who attend and present to the trustees at the bi-monthly meetings

The charity is advised by a steering committee, whose members are not trustees and whose role is advisory only

A Finance Committee meets every six months and reports to the trustees at the following full meeting. The Chair, Deputy Treasurer and Business Manager sit on the committee

Activities

The principal activities of the charity are to

- 1 Advise and assist persons with alcohol or drug related problems, or who are suffering from eating disorders or connected personal problems associated in overcoming those problems
- 2 Assist the families and dependants of such persons
- 3 Advance the education of the general public with regard to the misuse of drugs, alcohol and other substances

Achievements and performance

This year began on a high note as Cyswllt was awarded the high accolade of UK Drug Team of the year by the Home Office Representatives of the Charity attended an ostentatious award ceremony in London and the organisation was awarded the top prize of £10,000

In October 2006 Cyswllt opened a second office in Cardigan in partnership with Ceredigion Care Society, an organisation primarily working with housing and homelessness. The lease on the new offices is funded until October 2011 by the National Assembly for Wales. The comparative poverty in the south of the county is illustrated by the Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation and the Spatial Plan and the need for services here has long been recognised by both Cyswllt and the Care Society.

Over the year Cyswllt received 384 referrals, which represents a 29% increase on last year and is an all time high. Since Cyswllt's Southern Office was opened halfway through the year, 20% of referrals were to the Cardigan office. Whilst self referrals continue to be the primary source of clients, and speak volumes for Cyswllt's good name in the community, referrals from the criminal justice system now make up a quarter of all clients and referrals from Social Services were at an all time high this year.

Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 5 April 2007

Cyswilt has continued to provide the Drug Interventions Programme (DIP) for Ceredigion. The project is aimed at drug users who have entered the criminal justice system and provides both outreach to courts and custody suites throughout Ceredigion, and group and one-to-one sessions with a focus on criminal activity as a consequence of substance misuse with the aim of breaking this cycle. The project went live in March 2006. Whilst DIP is partially responsible for increased referrals, it has impacted upon the overall client profile in a number of ways reflecting the average DIP client. Thus, the numbers of under-25 year olds has increased slightly and the number of women has reduced by 10%. The number of people presenting primarily with alcohol problems has slightly reduced down 5% to 43%. The proportion of family members has almost halved and those presenting primarily with class-A drug use is at 12%.

Once again roughly one third of Cyswllt's funding was from the European Social Fund. This funded 54.4% of the 'Recovery and Work' project which provides clients with pre-treatment, treatment and aftercare, and a clear pathway into vocational training (in partnership with Ceredigion Training). The project also aims to widen access by helping people with travel and dependent care costs and increasing the publicity budget. 'Recovery & Work' has been extremely successful in widening access to Treatment and this year take-up of training has also increased to levels closer to those anticipated.

Cyswllt continues to provide services funded by Supporting People These provide practical advice and general counselling tailored to our clients' needs. The primary focus of the project is to help people to maintain their tenancies but also covers other practical issues such as budgeting, benefits and use of time.

Cyswllt's counsellors provide a range of programmes, designed to help people with substance misuse problems to understand them, become better able to deal with the consequences of their problem and to overcome them All programmes are supplemented by one-to-one counselling where appropriate or requested

The programmes available are

Drug & Alcohol Awareness Programme (DAAP) - A group session that meets once a week and runs for six weeks. It is designed for people who are experiencing difficulties in their lives as a result of their misuse of drugs, alcohol or food.

Aftercare - A group programme that runs for one afternoon per week and lasts for a maximum of one year after successful completion of the day treatment programme. The programme provides essential peer support to them during the vulnerable stage of early recovery

Family Programme - A weekly group for close friends and family of people misusing substances. Allows family members to meet, attend lectures, share experiences and learn more about the problems facing their loved ones and how best to support them whilst taking care of themselves.

Detoxification - Cyswllt's day treatment programme is abstinence based and as such clients need to be free from drugs and alcohol to join and continue on the programme. For some clients this can only be achieved through a process of detoxification, either at a residential centre or through local community based support. Historically there has been a lack of residential detoxification facilities in Ceredigion, but for another year, the Ceredigion Community Safety Partnership has made funds available to allow us to send clients to suitable residential centres outside the county to be detoxified.

A considerable amount of training and educational work has been carried out over the year. The Schools Programme has been delivered to all year eight pupils in Penglais School. In addition Cyswllt has delivered training to staff within local voluntary and statutory agencies.

The website www recovery org uk continues to be acknowledged as one of the most informative sites for anyone seeking advice and help on alcohol or drug related problems and those suffering from eating disorders

Personnel

Cyswllt was saddened to lose its Director, Maureen Fyffe, who left towards the end of the financial year both to get married and set up a private counselling service. Maureen had been with the service for 6-years and was instrumental in developing Cyswllt's treatment services and raising the organisation's profile in Ceredigion.

Thanks

We would like to thank those who donated their time and expertise to Cyswllt over the year, including Chris Williams (web design and management), Eurwen Booth (translation) and Martin Davies (legal matters)

Policies and Financial Management

- The charity seeks to set aside out of its unrestricted funds sufficient to cover immediate staff costs (notice & redundancy), 3-months rent and the average amount of central running costs for a one-month period, should it face an unexpected shortfall in funding. The amount is currently £36,324
- 2 The trustees are empowered by the Articles of Association to invest the funds of the Charity as they see fit Any funds not required for immediate expenditure are placed in a bank deposit account until required
- 3 The trustees confirm that they have identified major risks to which the charity is exposed and have established systems to mitigate these risks

Over the coming year, the management will be conducting a review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed. It is intended to develop a risk register which can be updated annually and to establish systems and procedures to mitigate the risks that the charity faces

Internal financial risks are minimised by the implementation of control and authorisation procedures

Procedures are in place to ensure compliance with health and safety for staff, clients and visitors to the centre

The implementation of the Drugs and Alcohol National Occupational Standards (DANOS) over the next two years will ensure a consistent quality of delivery for all operational aspects of the charity

All procedures are periodically reviewed to ensure that they continue to meet the needs of the charity

Notes to financial statements for the year ended 5 April 2007

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

1.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005), the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 1985

1.2. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income.

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the statement of financial activities in the year in which they are receivable

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable

1.3 Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity and include project management

1.4. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows
