Conniburrow Community Centre & Sports Pavilion:

Conniburrow Community Association being a non-profit organisation

has achieved our targets. Works on the Playing field is now complete and the facilities are in use. We held a successful Community Fete Fun Day in June 2015 which was very well attended. Our Football was formally launched CONNIBURROW UNITED FC (The Hares). We held a Family day Trip to Wicksteed Park and our Senior Citizens were treated to a trip the MK Theatre for an Agatha Christie production. We also held our Senior Citizens Christmas Luncheon for 60 persons. Holiday Youth Football Coaching Programme in the May and August 2015.

Showing good community spirit, Conniburrow Community Association took delivery of park equipment from Holland on behalf of MK Council/Big Local, which was delivered to our address. We are glad we could be of assistance even though we had no prior knowledge that our phone number and address were given for delivery of the item. A great addition to our community.
